

COLLEGE STATION, Jan. 23 .- In he opinion of livestock producers, the Ton Litter Contest" conducted by he A. & M. College Extension servce in co-operation with the Texas Swine Breeders' Association the past ear has returned profitable hog proaction to Texas. All those 'armers ho entered the contest and followed directions of their county agents an excellent profit from the enerprise, notwithstanding the fact that opportunity for making a profit nder customary metohds was less han in most years. Fred was high er than in many years and port heaper. The points of success were, the selection of purebred animals for breeding, feeding of barance rations and proper management and care. The prize winning litter weighed 3898 pounds, the second prize 3542, and the thud 3025.

It was proved that hogs could be produced at 6 cents a pound and less, and be ready to top the market at five or six months of age. The packers were very friendly to the ton litter hogs because they were finished properly. These hogs, though weighing in some instances at we 300 pounds were not unde frable in the test, it was shown by actual sales made, when brought to that weight in 180 days. They are still young pigs and their flesh possesses none of the coarseness which comes with an age of two or three years.
