**BOYS vs. CHICKENS**

At the recent Country Life Conference held in St. Louis, a moving-picture film was shown of a farm boy and his prize flock of chickens. The film demonstrated that the birds were fine because the boy had a scientific knowledge of chicken culture, and that he had applied his knowledge to the care of his flock. But the boy was a mouth breather and showed further effects of malnutrition. The tragic thing about the picture was that the chickens were having a better chance than the boy.

The idea of encouraging children to raise thoroughbred poultry and live stock is wholesome. It should be promoted to a greater degree than it is at present. On the other hand, it must be borne in mind that the greatest asset is neither live stock nor poultry, but boys and girls. They themselves are entitled to as scientific care as they are taught to give the animals that they raise. In order to develop into a strong man or woman every child must have a well-balanced diet which is eaten at regular periods; long hours of sleep in a well-ventilated room; activity as expressed in wholesome work, study and play in instruction concerning the care of the body; and periods of physical examinations by a reliable physician.

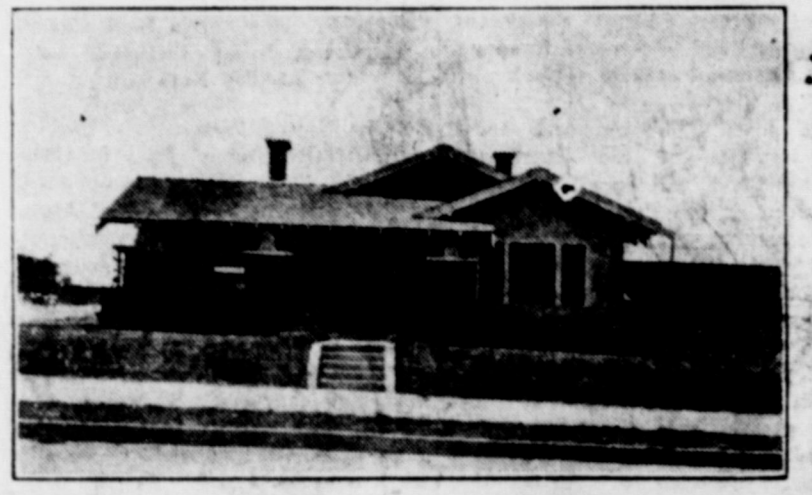

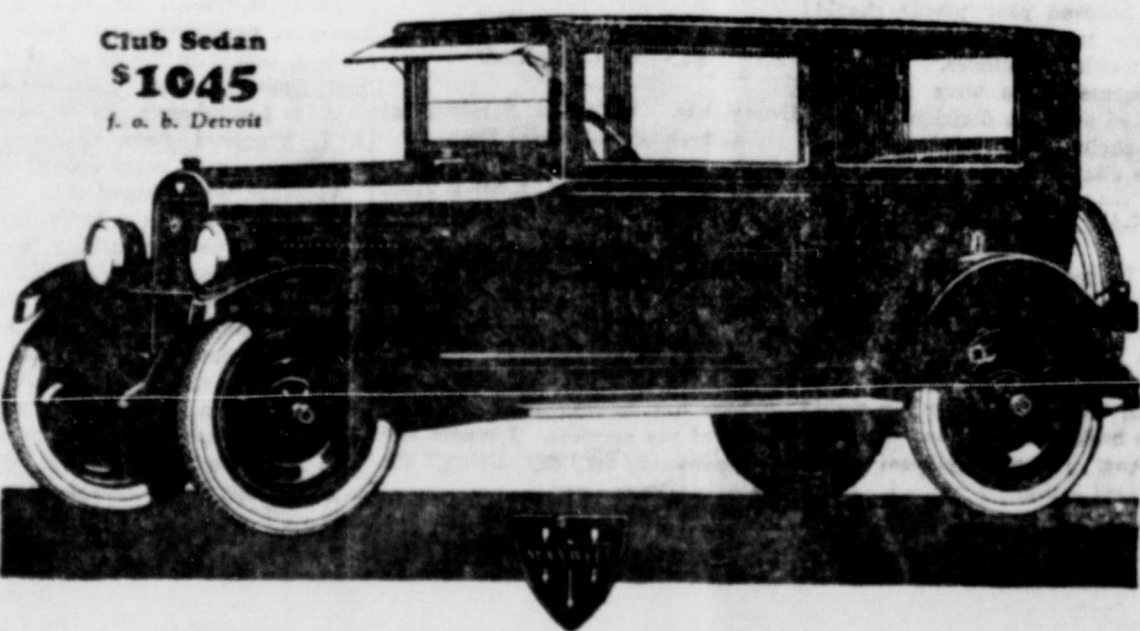

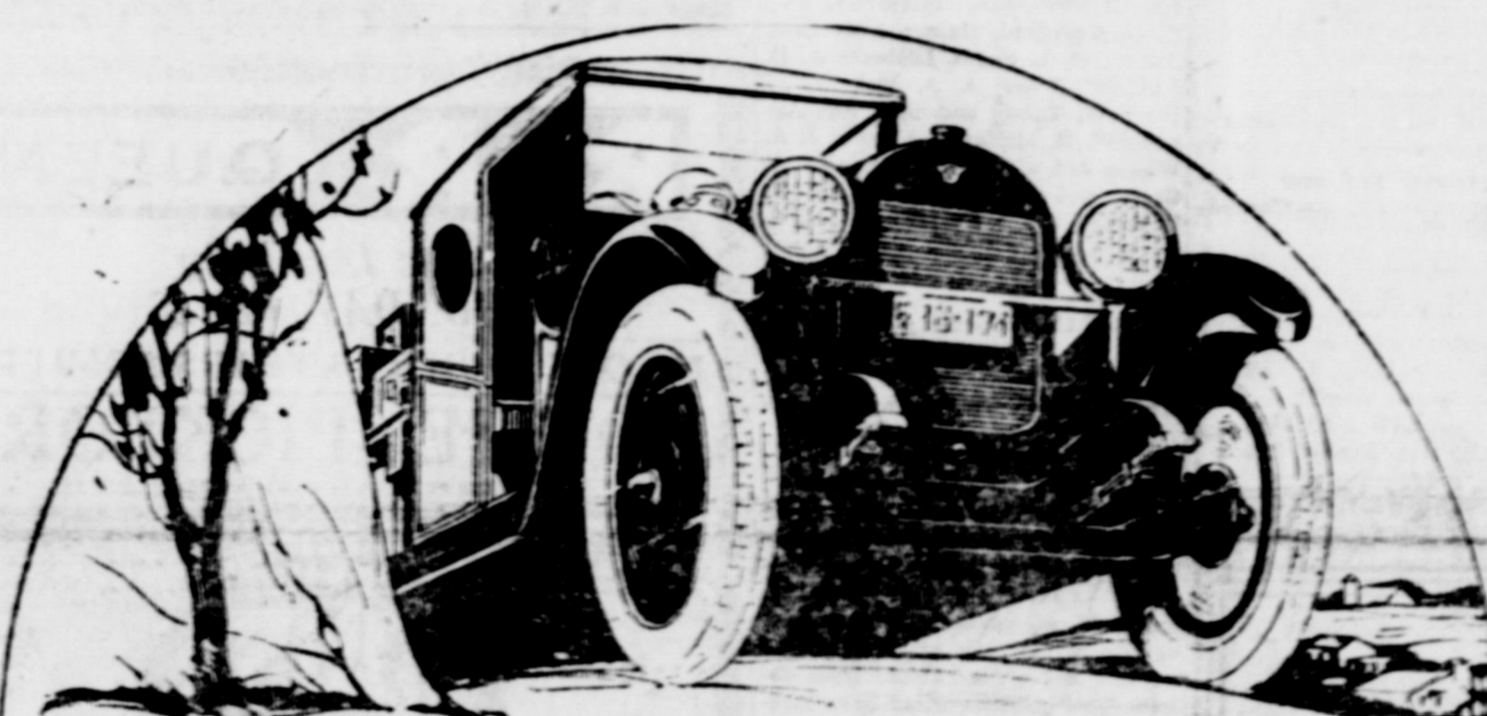

## Hunter Lost a Hunter Who Was Not Lost.

Some excitement was caused among the friends of Mr. Reinhart of the Alpine Light and Ice Company Monday when it became known that he had been lost from his companions while hunting in the mountains south of Alpine Sunday. His companions, Otis Seales and others gave the alarm Monday morning and quite a crowd turned out to hunt the lost hunter, who, it appears, was not lost, but had fired all his ammunition to attract the attention of the other boys as they quitted the place of rendezvous, failing which he hunted by the Sublett camp and turned in for the night.—Alpine Avalanche.

## Youth Loses Thumb and Finger in Blast.

Walter Miller, 12-year-old lad, whose parents live on the Carroll Gray place, nine miles South of Brady, lost part of his left thumb and forefinger Wednesday afternoon at the Davis school by the explosion of a dynamite cap or some similar explosive. The boy was unable to state exactly how the accident occurred. He was standing close to the stove, reading a book, when the explosion took place. Other students at first thought someone had dropped an explosive from the ceiling, or else that some explosive had been placed in the stove, and made a hasty exit from the building.
