To Be Buried in Crypt of Bethlehem Chapel the funeral is held at Washington. Services will be held in the Methodist Church. -President Coolidge Orders 30 Day **Period of Mourning For All Departments** of Government-Memorial Services in First Methodist Church Here Wednesday and at 2 O'clock.

Without pomp or display the body of Woodrow Wilson will be laid to rest Wednesday afternoon. Services will begin at the home at 3 o'clock (2 o'clock, Sweetwater time), then the body will be taken to the Bethlehem Chapel of Washington-Cathedral for short services. It will be interred in the crypt of the cathedral.

Memorial services will be held in Sweetwater Wednesday aftrnoon from 2' to 3 o'clock.
