SENATOR CURTIS Expectant Mother

Republican Whip Named By Witness In Oil Probe as 'Principal" Referred to in Florida Messages

Ira F. Bennett, Editor Washington Post, Reveals Many Things-"Apples" Referred To A. B. Fall

WASHINGTON, D. C., March 7.-Senator Curtis, Republican whip of the Senate was today identified as "the principal" mentioned in messages sent E. B. McLean, Washington publisher at Palm Beach ,by Ira F. Bennett, editor of McLean's newspaper, the Washington Post.

At the same time Bennett testififying before the Senate oil investigation committee, revealed that he had a conference with Attorney General Harry M. Daugherty on February 14 about the oil investigation.

Identification of "the principal" has been the cause of speculation for several days. Senator Hefflin, Alabama, said in the Senate Tuesday that he believed "the principal" was President Coolidge.

The first message in which Bennett mentioned "the principal" dated January 29, read:




