Ask Permission to Issue Bonds in Lieu of Note Formerly Held by R. R. Director-General.

C., Sept. 11.—The Texas and Pacific Railway Company today applied to the Interstate Commerce Commission for permission to issue in lieu of a note previously held by the Director General of Railroads \$4,400,000 of six per cent gold notes, and to pledge as collateral therefor \$5,500,000 of general refunding mortgage 6 per cent gold bonds.
