About Ski Goggles In recent years，science has learned more
about the dangers of ultraviolet radiation about the dangers of ultraviolet radiation，
damaging not only to the skin but to the eyes damaging not only to the skin but to the eyes
as well．Indeed，exposure to the sun＇s danger－ ous rays has been linked to earlier appearance of cataracts． Ski goggles used in the harsh light of ski slopes need to offer the same UV protection as sunglasses，with other safeguards as well． Some brands of goggles come with interchangeable lenses to cope
with varying light conditions；others are equipped with photochromatic lenses that adjust automatically．
Amber－colored lenses that filter out blue light are extra－important on the slopes，especially in hazy，foggy or overcast weather when cattered blue light obscures vision． Look for wraparound frames that keep out gusts of wind and errant ays of the sun．Good goggles will help the skier look good on th
