





Do you simply want good things, or do you want God's best for your life?

For example, simply wanting a secure, stable life is a good goal to shoot for, but it is not God's best. God's best is to love Him deeply and serve Him diligently as you live as a disciple who makes disciples.

Jehoahaz found this out as he reigned as king over ancient Israel in 2 Kings 13. Jehoahaz was having a rough time as his foreign policy was failing as the Syrians were attacking regularly and he was not able

to stand against them. This breakdown was the result of his wickedness and the people's idolatry.

Thankfully though, Jehoahaz cried out to the Lord, and the Lord sent a savior to deliver the people from the hand of the Syrians. God delivered His people because He is faithful and loves His people. After the Lord's deliverance from a fierce enemy you would hope to see that nation turn to Him, but they simply ignored Him as before and continue living in sin.

What stands out in this pas-

sage is God's gracious deliverance and the reality that Jehoahaz wanted a good thing that was not the best thing. He got what he wanted, but what he wanted wasn't good enough. He wanted deliverance more than God, peace and security instead of the Lord.

Anytime you want good things, instead of wanting God, you have fallen into the trap of not wanting what is best. God Himself, is the best we could ever want, and He invites us to come unto Him through Jesus Christ.

The facility's compliance file, if any exists, is available for public review in the Amarillo regional office of the TCEQ.

The executive director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application. In addition to the renewal, this permitting action includes the incorporation of the following authorizations or changes to authorized facilities related to this permit: alterations. The reasons for any changes or incorporations, to the extent they are included in the renewed permit, may include the enhancement of operational control at the plant or enforceability of the permit. For more information about this permit application or the permitting process, please call the Public Education Program toll free at 1-800-687-4040.

The TCEQ may act on this application without seeking further public comment or providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met.

PUBLIC COMMENT You may submit public comments, or a request for a contested case hearing to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below. The TCEQ will consider all public comments in developing a final decision on the application. The deadline to submit public comments is 15 days after newspaper notice is published. After the deadline for public comments, the executive director will prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. Issues such as property values, noise, traffic safety, and zoning are outside of the TCEQ's jurisdiction to address in the permit process.

After the technical review is complete the executive director will consider the comments and prepare a response to all relevant and material, or significant public comments. If only comments are received, the response to comments, along with the executive director's decision on the application, will then be mailed to everyone who submitted public comments or who is on the mailing list for this application, unless the application is directly referred to a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING You may request a contested case hearing. The applicant or the executive director may also request that the application be directly referred to a contested case hearing after technical review of the application. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court. Unless a written request for a contested case hearing is filed within 15 days from this notice, the executive director may act on the application. If no hearing request is received within this 15 day period, no further opportunity for hearing will be provided. If the request is made by a group or association, the one or more members who have standing to request a hearing and the interests the group or association seeks to protect must also be identified. You may also submit your proposed adjustments to the application/permit which would satisfy your concerns.
