Friona ISD earns recognized status

Superintendent Kenny Austin reports that Friona ISD received its state accountability rating this week. For the first time since 2005 FUSD was rated as a Recognized District.

Austin said the district is evaluated on TAKS passing rates for five demographic groups: all students, African American, Hispanic, White, and economically disadvantaged. Tests are in reading/English language arts, writing, social studies, mathematics, and science.

The standard passing rates for each group must be 75%. Attendance rates and dropout rates are also included in the evaluation.

Friona High School received a Recognized rating for the first time since the new accountability system was put in place in 2004. "Friona High School made improvement in every area evaluated by the TEA," Austin said. "The two areas of greatest improvement were in math and science".

Friona Junior High received an Academically Acceptable rating. Friona Elementary and Friona Primary received a Recognized rating for the first time since 2005. The two areas of most improvement were also math and science.

Austin said the Federal Accountability System ratings were also released this week. Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) is based on TAKS passing rates and participation in math and reading/language arts. All campuses met the AYP rating. AYP evaluates passing rates of seven subgroups: all students, African American, Hispanic, White, economically disadvantaged, special education, and limited English proficient.

Superintendent Austin said, "Congratulations to all employees of FUSD".

An action item will be considered for Ordinance 2009.08.10A approving a negotiated resolution between Atmos Energy and the Atmos West Texas Cities steering committee regarding the company's second annual rate review mechanism filing in all cities exercising original jurisdiction.

This year marks the 50th anniversary of Friona's official aldermanic form of government. In a September 1, 1959 election, voters approved and adopted the change to the current city alderman form of city government and elected Deon Awtrey, Bill Nichols, and Danny Mac Bainum as the first three official city aldermen.

Reeve family receives family heritage award

Agriculture Commissioner Todd Staples and the Texas Department of Agriculture recently recog-

The annual event recognizes families who have kept their farms and ranches in continuous agricultural production for more than 100 years.

"Today, these families are the breath of life for their ancestors' dreams," Commissioner Staples said. "The land they have nurtured, loved and cared for will forever be a part of the past, present and future of this great state."

Governor Rick Perry, a former agriculture commissioner himself, joined Commissioner Staples at this year's event to honor and thank the families for their amazing persistence and dedication to the land.

"There is nothing quite like the family farm or ranch, especially in Texas," Governor Perry said. "These places connect us to the land, to our heritage, and to God's creation in a way that can be hard to explain, and we are grateful to count so many sons and daughters

of the land in our state's 24 million people. I congratulate all of today's honorees for representing the most enduring values of our state and commend you for your longevity. Congratulations on your heritage and thank you for all you do to

feed our state, our nation and our world."

Cowboy poet and entertainer Red Steagall performed at the ceremony. Ron Oliveira, KEYE TV news anchor, served as master of ceremonies.

Reeve Ranch has been in continuous agricultural production by the same family since 1908.

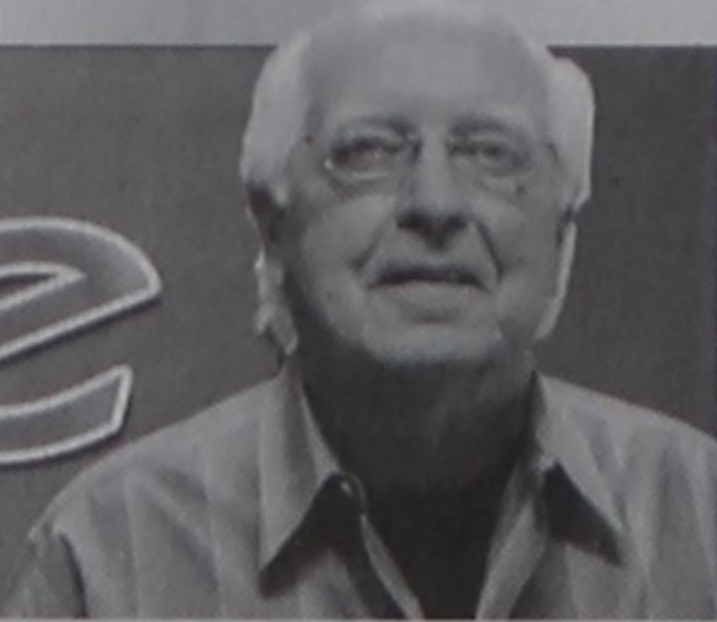

a/k/a spaghetti carbonara

You like spaghetti? How about spaghetti with bacon and eggs mixed in? If you have ever ordered spaghetti carbonara at a restaurant then you have already had spaghetti with bacon and egg in it. You'll need to know this: al dente means cooked but still firm to the bite.

This recipe was submitted to Texas Co-Op Power magazine by Kelli Fest, a member of the Central Texas Electric Cooperative. You can find past recipes that have appeared in the magazine in the recipes archive at www.texascooppower.com.

Bacon & eggs spaghetti

- 1 lb spaghetti
- 2 tbsp olive oil, divided
- 8 slices bacon, diced & chopped
- 1 onion chopped
- 1 clove garlic minced
- 1/4 cup dry white wine (optional)
- 4 eggs beaten
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- Pinch salt
- Black pepper to taste

Cook spaghetti according to package directions until al dente. Drain.

Toss spaghetti with 1 tbsp olive oil & set aside.

In large skillet, cook bacon until crisp. Remove & drain on paper towels. Don't clean skillet. Discard all but 2 tbsp of bacon grease. Add remaining olive oil. Add onion and cook until tender; add garlic and cook one minute more.

Deglaze pan with wine (if desired) by adding wine to onion and garlic mixture and cooking for one additional minute. Pan may also be deglazed with water.

Return bacon and spaghetti to pan. Toss to coat. (If it seems dry or sticky, add a little more olive oil). Add beaten eggs and cook until set, tossing constantly. Add Parmesan cheese, salt and pepper. Toss to combine.

Serve with chopped parsley and extra Parmesan cheese sprinkled on top.

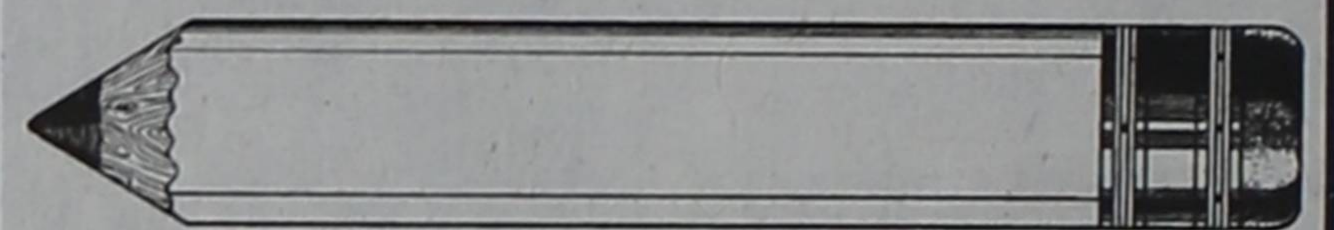

Alderman candidates were Bill Nichols, Deon Awtrey, Danny Mac Bainum, Glenn Stevick, and Ralph Shelton. (We'll reveal the winners in a couple of weeks).

James Dale Glass

Funeral services for James Dale Glass, 74, of McLean were held at 10:00 a.m. August 3, 2009 in the First Baptist Church in Clarendon with Reverend Dave Stout, Pastor of the First Baptist Church of Howardwick, officiating. Interment was at 1:00 p.m. in Hillcrest Cemetery in McLean. Mr. Glass died July 30, 2009, in Amarillo, after an extended illness. Dale, known as Laddie, Daddy or Popo, was a loving husband, father and grandfather who will be deeply missed.

Dale Glass was born at home on November 8, 1934, in McLean, and always made McLean his home. After graduating from McLean High School in 1953 and attending classes at West Texas State College (now West Texas A&M) Dale returned to work with his father to run the family business, the J.R. Glass wholesale gas, diesel and oil business, later taking over operation of the Phillips 66 station on Old Route 66 in McLean. Last summer he was inducted into the Route 66 Hall of Fame.

In August 1957 a young Texas Tech graduate from Friona came to McLean to teach home economics. She was Mary Lou Miller and became Dale's bride on August 17, 1958. The couple celebrated their 50th anniversary last summer. As a member of the U.S. Army Reserves, Dale was ordered into service during the Cuban Missile crisis, at which time the family briefly lived in Fort Polk, Louisiana.

In the mid-1980s, following the I-40 bypass of McLean, formerly vibrant businesses in town were forced to close, including Dale's Phillips 66. This led to several temporary positions. Ultimately Dale became a prison guard, a career he pursued for 15 years, primarily at the Jordan Unit in Pampa.

Being the people person he was, his hobbies included playing bridge, dominoes and Yahtzee with anyone who would play. He enjoyed being an active church member at the First Baptist Church of Howardwick. He always enjoyed the McLean School Reunion and catching up with old friends.

Dale was preceded in death by his parents, J.R. and Viola Glass; his brother, Jack Glass; and his brother-in-law, Ronay Howard.

Survivors include his wife, Mary Lou of McLean; five daughters, Maridale Morgan and husband Steve of Plano, Sherry Kramer and husband Marvin of Skellytown, Jamie Glass of Fort Worth; Terri Luna of Clarendon; and Angela Burrus and husband Roddy of Dumas; one son, John David Glass of Dallas; three sisters, Shirley Hohstadt of Denver, Sue Barnhill of Nashville, Tennessee, and Judy Howard of Ruidoso, New Mexico; two brothers, John R. Glass of Phoenix, and Bob Glass of McLean; ten grandchildren; numerous nieces and nephews; and other family members.

Genesis 12:1-9 depicts a series of incidents in which Abram manifests his faith in God.

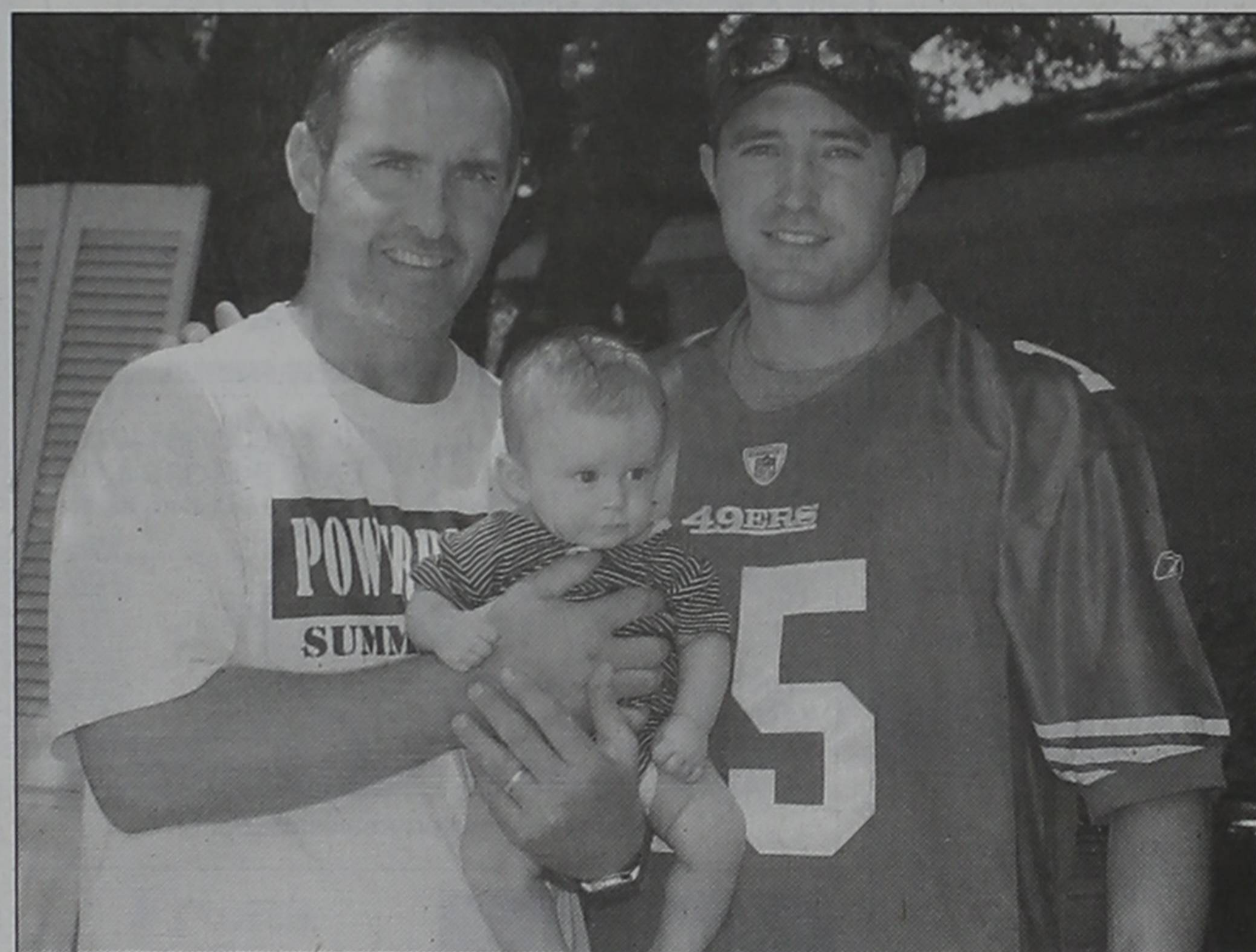
