Chiefs rout Sanford Fritch 44-7 in bi-district meet the Golden Cranes Friday in area round

The Friona Chieftains got off to a fast start and never looked back as they had little trouble in a 44-7 blowout win over the Sanford Fritch Eagles. The bi-district contest took place in unusually balmy weather at Kimbrough Stadium in Canyon last Saturday afternoon.

The Eagles won the toss and deferred to give the Chiefs the opening kickoff. They promptly mounted a 65-yard drive, capped by a 13-yard TD run by Zack Fair. Jonathan Licerio's extra point kick was good and the Chiefs led 7-0 less than two minutes into the game.

On the Eagles ensuing possession, Stetson Reed

tipped an Eagle pass attempt into the arms of Mr. Fair who returned it 24 yards for another quick touchdown. Friona then led 14-0 with 7:11 remaining in the 1st quarter.

The Eagles, who had only 16 varsity players suited up for the game, managed a touchdown in the 2nd quarter to narrow the lead to 14-7. But the Chiefs responded after the kickoff with another 67-yard drive in 7 plays. Quarterback Joey Dickson tossed a pass to Fair in the left flat and he rambled for a 44-yard touchdown to give Friona a 21-7 lead.

The Chieftain defense, led by Noe Saenz, Jordan Kelley, Sergio Mendez, and Clayton

Smiley, pinned the Eagles inside their own ten-yard line before sacking the Eagle quarterback for a safety and a 23-0 lead with 7:06 left in the half.

The Chiefs took over after the S-F free kick. With 2:47 left in the half, Dickson connected with Caleb Monroe just inside the goal line marker. Monroe made a sensational catch and kept one foot inbounds to complete the 17-yard touchdown play. Licerio, who had another 6 for 6 perfect extra point day, made the score 30-0 Chiefs at halftime.

The Chiefs scored two more times in the 3rd quarter to increase their lead to 44-7 before Coach Herbert substituted

second and third team players the balance of the game.

Fullback Noe Saenz scored at 9:47 of the 3rd quarter on a 13-yard run. Later, with 3:07 remaining in the 3rd, Licerio caught a 10-yard touchdown pass from Brenner Barnett to end the scoring for the Chiefs. Barnett took over when Joey Dickson was injured in the 3rd quarter and left the game.

Zack Fair led rushers with 92 yards on 14 carries. Fair also had three pass receptions for 74 yards. He scored on a run, a pass interception, and a pass reception.

Saenz had 83 yards on 9 carries, Licerio carried three times for 21 yards, Chris

Garcia was 7 carries for 47 yards, and Steven Mendoza added 33 yards on three carries. Josh Duenes got in on the running with two carries for six yards and Alan Tafoya also carried three times for 22 yards. Friona rushed for 282 total yards and passed for another 112.

The Chieftains bring home the bi-district trophy for the second year in a row and will meet the Crane Golden Cranes at 7:30 p.m. Friday November 20 in Denver City in the area round of the playoffs. The winner of the Friona-Crane game will meet the winner of the Cisco-San Saba match in the regional quarterfinals.

during this year's contest. We actually paid out thirteen \$25 weekly prizes because of a tie in Week 5.

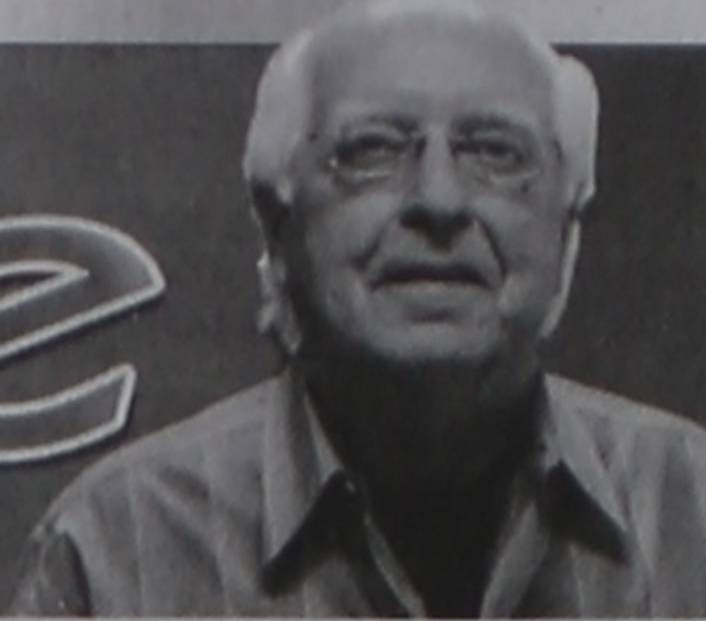

This data is important in making future management decisions for the Parmer County deer herd. The data is collected state-wide and is very helpful for determining the overall health of the herd.

Montandon asks that all deer brought to the voluntary check station be field dressed prior to arrival.

Corned beef fans listen up

Here in chicken fried steak country, corned beef and cabbage are not often used at tailgate parties. It is the rare child that likes cabbage, at least it was with my kids. Not sure at what age people start liking cabbage. Corned beef is another non-kid item.

However, a big plate of corned beef and cabbage with some potatoes and carrots thrown in sounds like a tasty dish for a cold winter day. Besides it sounds healthy. This recipe, from Better Homes & Garden magazine, doesn't call for horseradish but a chunk of corned beef topped with some spicy horseradish sounds really good right now. Might have a dish of horseradish on the side for the adventurous sort.

The magazine says it takes 25 minutes from start to finish and costs about \$3.61 per serving. Great Thanksgiving quickie. Try it. Somebody in your house might like it.

Corned beef, cabbage, carrots & new potatoes

Serves 4

- 1 lb small new potatoes
- 1 lb small carrots
- 1 small head cabbage
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 lb cooked deli corned beef, sliced
- 2 tbsp spicy brown mustard
- 2 tbsp honey

1. Scrub & halve potatoes. Trim, peel, and half carrots lengthwise. In a 2-1/2 to 3 quart microwave safe dish combine potatoes, carrots, and 2 tbsp water. Cook, covered, on high 8 minutes, stirring once. Cut cabbage in wedges; add to carrots and potatoes in dish. Cook covered on high 4 minutes until cabbage is crisp-tender.

2. Heat broiler. Place potatoes, carrots, and cabbage in 15x10x1-inch baking pan. Drizzle oil; sprinkle salt & pepper. Broil, 3 to 4 inches from heat, for 5 minutes.

3. Meanwhile, slice beef. Cook in a hot 12-inch skillet over medium high heat, 1 minute on each side. Add 2 tbsp water; reduce to low. Cover and heat through. To serve, drizzle beef, cabbage, carrots, and potatoes with pan juices. Combine mustard and honey (and horseradish) to pass around.
