1 sheet (half a 17.3 oz box) puff pastry, thawed 3 lg eggs
$3 / 4$ cup evaporated milk
$1 / 2$ cup $(4 \mathrm{oz})$ sour cream
$11 / 2$ cups grated Swiss cheese (about 5 ozs)
Adjust oven racks to lowest and upper-middle positions and heat oven to 400 . Toss asparagus and green onions with olive oil and a
