High school sets assembly schedule

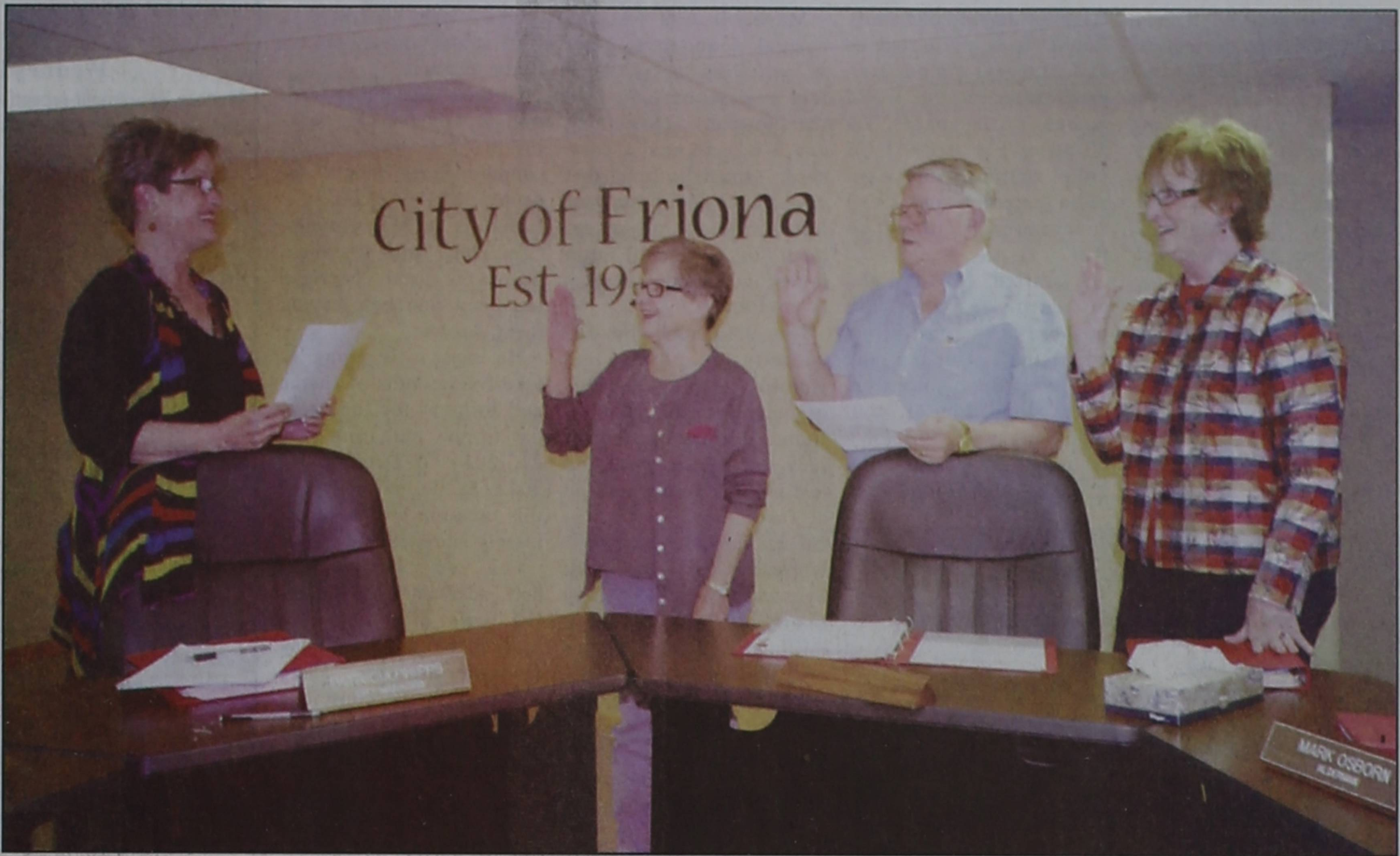
Several awards assemblies are scheduled at the high school to round out the school year.

Council holds first meeting with new mayor

The Friona city council held its regular meeting Monday May 17, 2010, in the city council chambers at 619 Main St. Outgoing mayor John Taylor opened the meeting and the council ap-

proved a canvassing of the votes from the May 8 city election.

City Manager Patricia Phipps then administered the oath of office to re-elected councilwoman Martha Barker, incoming

mayor J. B. Douglas, and newly elected councilwoman Cheryl Weatherly.

Phipps then presented a plaque of appreciation to Mayor Taylor for his 14-years of service to the city. Taylor served as a council member from 1996 to 2002 and mayor from 2002 to 2010.

As a first order of business, the council elected councilman Jim Atwell to serve as mayor pro-tem for the 2010-2011 council session.

Continuing the agenda, it was noted that Vickie

Samarron had withdrawn a request for a no-interest loan from the Friona Economic Development Corporation (FEDC).

The council approved a motion for the fire department to trade-in a 1993 chassis on a new chassis for one of the fire trucks. Fire Chief Jim Taylor told the council he had located a newer 2002 chassis. The fire department will pay for the chassis from department funds and local firemen will do the work to transfer equipment to the new chassis.

The council authorized city manager Phipps to seek bids to sell a 1984 Ford van formerly used by Prairie Acres and a 2003 Crown Victoria police car. The bid notices will run in the Friona Star.

Municipal judge Deborah Campbell was officially appointed to a two-year term. Mrs. Campbell has served as municipal judge since January after being appointed to the position.

Phipps then conducted a detailed explanation of the city's accounts payables and budget items for the benefit of the new mayor and councilwoman. It was noted that the state of Texas receives \$82 from each traffic violation ticket issued by the city and charges a sales tax on the city trash pick-up. With the recent rains this season, city water sales are down but expected to increase as summer begins. An interesting item, the city is required to pay itself for water usage such as Prairie Acres, watering city parks, etc. The city is not allowed to furnish free water to anyone.

The final agenda item was approval for a carport variance at 805 Prospect. The next meeting of the city council will be Monday, June 14, at 6:30 p.m. The council meets the 2nd Monday of each month unless changed for meeting conflicts. All council meetings are open to the public.

NRCS sign-up for CSP program

The USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) is accepting applications from Texas agricultural landowners for the next Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP) funding cycle that ends on June 11, 2010. Applications are accepted on a continuous basis and those not received by June 11 will be considered for funding after October 1, 2010.

"CSP supports ongoing stewardship of private agricultural lands by providing payments for maintaining and enhancing natural resources," said Don Gohmert, NRCS state conservationist for Texas.

Congress limited enrollment for CSP, nationally, at 12.7 million acres per year. Applicants will compete within state-identified ranking pools, which in Texas are water quantity, soil erosion, plant health and condition, water quality, and animal health.

Producers are encouraged to apply for CPS now to ensure their applications will be considered during this funding and ranking period. However, they can make their final decision to participate in the program before they

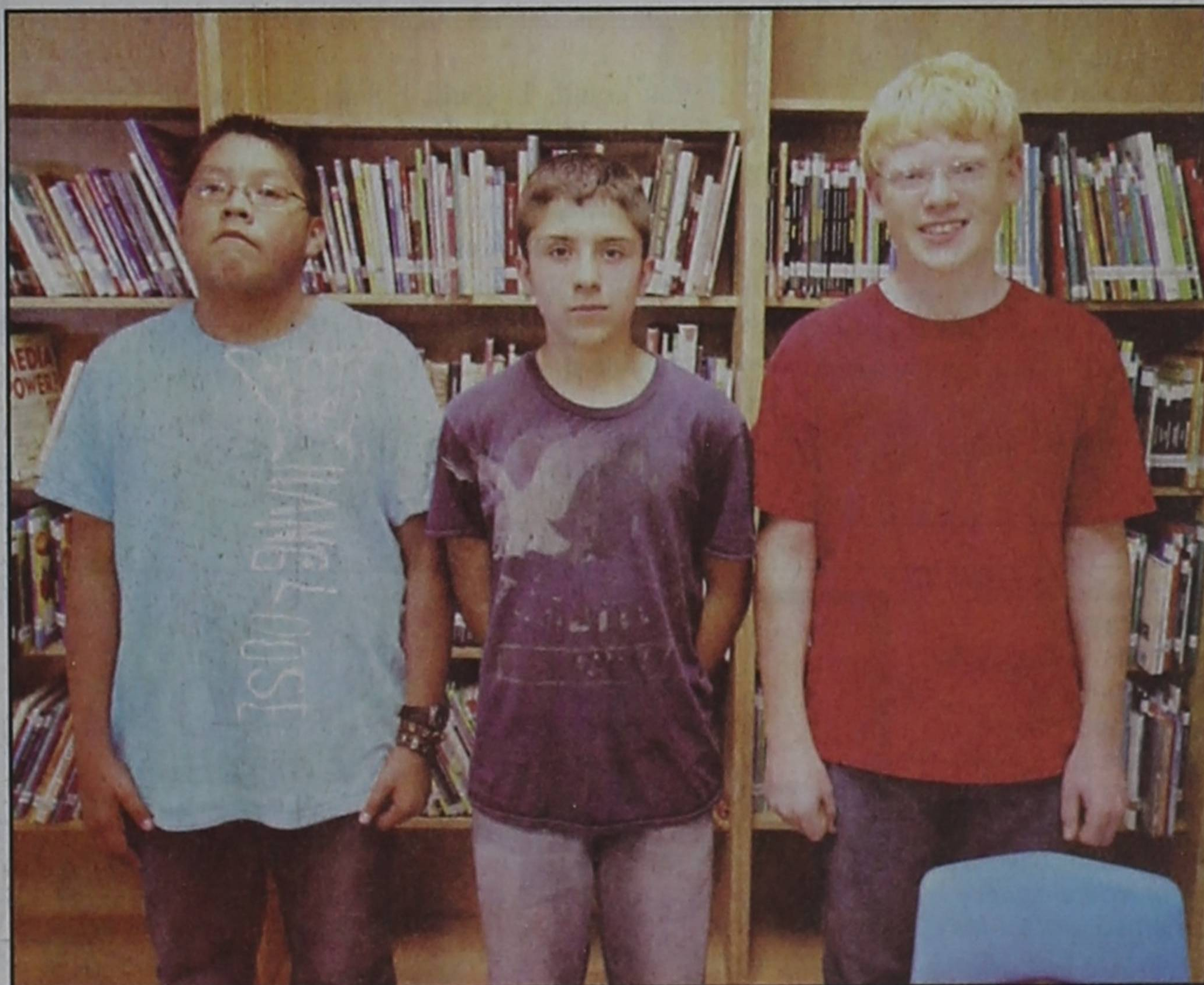
sign a contract. USDA expects the CSP final rule, which establishes the policies and procedures for the program, to be announced within the next several weeks.

CSP, authorized in the 2008 Farm Bill, offers payments to producers who maintain a high level of conservation on their land and who agree to adopt higher levels of stewardship. Eligible lands include cropland, pastureland, rangeland, and non-industrial forestland.

Potential applicants are encouraged to use the CSP self-screening checklist to determine if the new program is suitable for their operation. The checklist highlights basic information about CSP eligibility requirements, contract obligations and potential payments. It is available from local USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service offices or on the NRCS Web site at <http://www.nrcs.usda.gov/programs/new/csp/csphtml>.

CSP offers two types of potential payments—an annual payment and a supplemental payment. The annual payment will be determined by estimating the environ-

mental benefits produced by the conservation activities a producer installs and maintains. A supplemental payment is available to participants who receive an annual payment and adopt a resource-conserving crop rotation on cropland.

Area churches, schools, or other organizations are also encouraged to participate as a vendor during these celebrations with fundraising booths.

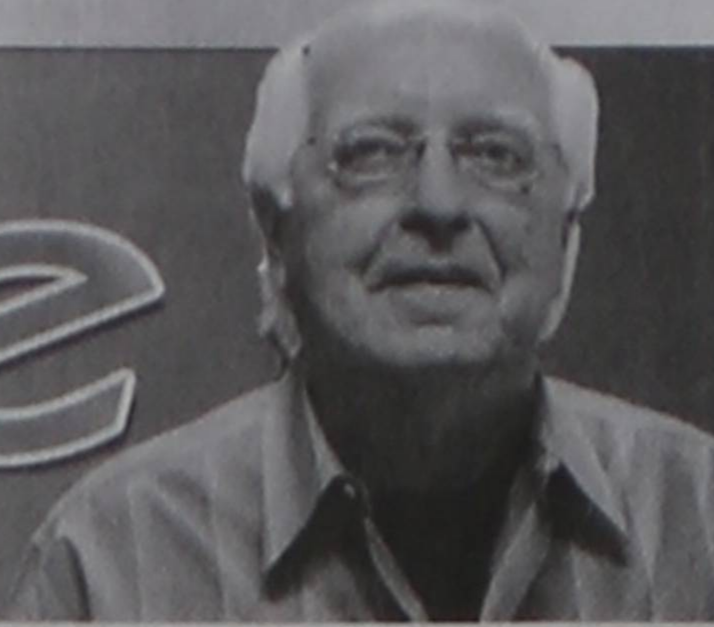

Squash & seafood w/cucumber limeade

Another interesting dish from Relish magazine. This one is from Mel Bartholomew, author of *All New Square Foot Gardening Cookbook*. It delivers a feast of simple salads, drinks, pestos, appetizers, and salsas. You can order the cookbook at RelishMag.com/store. It tells how to garden in small, square foot spaces.

They say this recipe is South Carolina inspired when the squash harvest is in full swing. You might have to make this without telling the kids and grandkids what is in it since squash and crab are not always on a kid's good taste list. Or some adults for that matter. But any recipe that starts with six tablespoons of butter gets my vote.

Squash & Crab Soup

Serves 8

- 6 tbsp butter
- 1 carrot grated
- 1 lg onion, minced
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1/2 tsp red pepper flakes
- 4 med yellow squash grated (about 7 cups)
- 4 cups reduced-sodium chicken broth
- 1 lb crabmeat, shell pieces removed
- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 cups whole milk
- 2 tbsp snipped chives, optional

1. Melt butter in Dutch oven or large saucepan over medium heat. Add carrot, onion, and garlic and cook until tender, about 8 minutes. Add pepper flakes and squash and cool until tender, about 10 minutes.

2. Add chicken broth and mix well. Bring to a simmer. Add crabmeat and cook over low heat until thoroughly heated.

3. Whisk together flour and a little of the milk to make a paste. Add remaining milk and mix well. Add to soup.

4. Cook, stirring until soup thickens, about 10 minutes. Do not boil. Garnish with chives to serve. Makes 10 cups.

Also in the cookbook, a Cool Cucumber Ginger Limeade drink. Take 3 cups chopped, seeded, peeled cucumbers, one 6-oz can frozen limeade, 2 tsp peeled and grated ginger, 2 1/2 cups cold club soda, lime wedges and cucumber slices. Put cucumber, limeade, and ginger in a blender until cucumber is pureed. (Taste for sweetening.) Put cucumber mixture and club soda in a small pitcher. Serve with lime wedges and cucumber slices. Sounds terrible. Hope you like it.

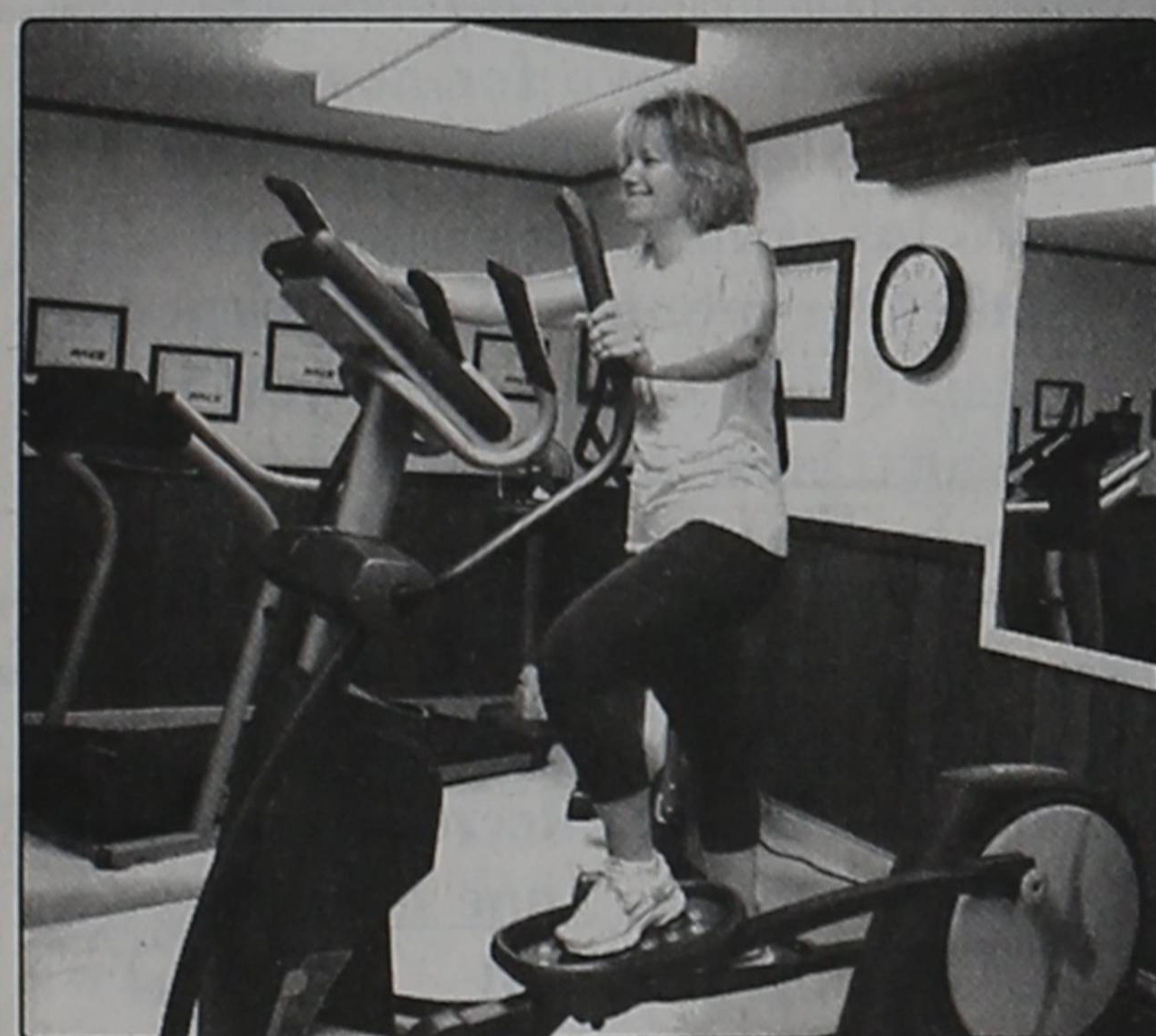

New booster seat law begins June 1

Are you ready for the next phase of the new booster seat law? Starting June 1, law enforcement officers may issue citations for violations of the recent changes to the child passenger safety law.

The law requires all children younger than eight years old – unless already taller than 4'9" – to be in the appropriate child safety seat system **anywhere** the child rides in a passenger vehicle. (A passenger vehicle is defined as a passenger car designed to transport not more than 10 occupants including the driver, a truck, light truck, truck tractor, sport utility vehicle and a passenger van designed to transport not

more than 15 occupants including the driver.)

The law also requires that all safety seat systems (safety or booster seats and safety vests) be installed according to the manufacturer's instructions – including age, height, weight requirements and the proper placement in the vehicle. (Some manufacturers prohibit using their products on the front seats of vehicles.)

The law was passed last year during the legislative session and went into effect on September 1, 2009. Officers could only issue verbal or written warnings for the first nine months – but now the enforcement phase is in effect.

Fines are \$25 to \$250 plus court costs...potentially much more than the cost of a safety or booster seat.

Safety seats and booster seats not only save lives; they save families. Consider the impact to your family if your child isn't buckled up properly and is injured or killed in a crash. Many times the injuries an improperly restrained child receives are life-long.

David Ray Smith

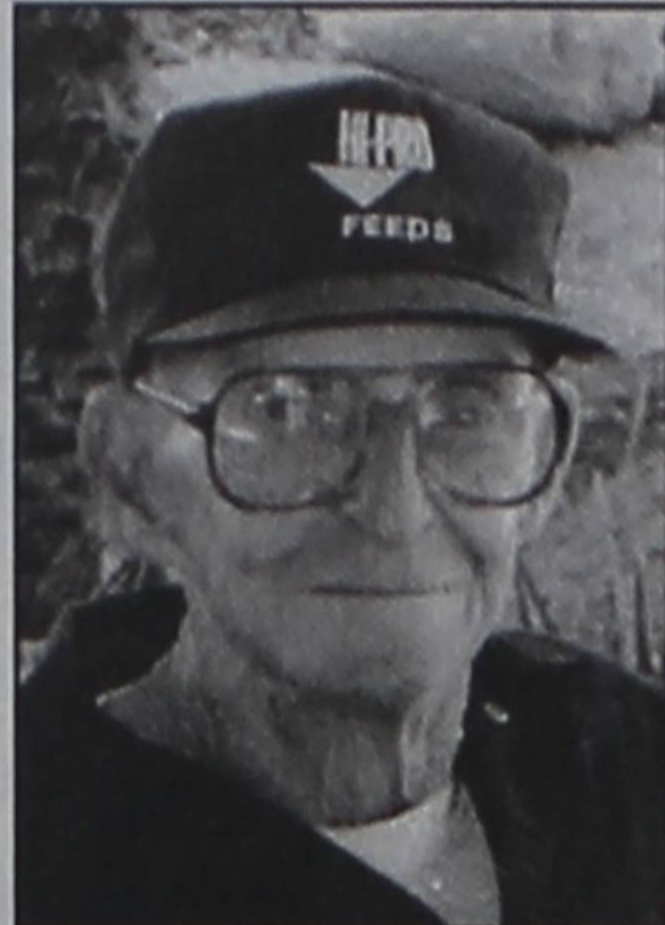

Oakley Stevenson

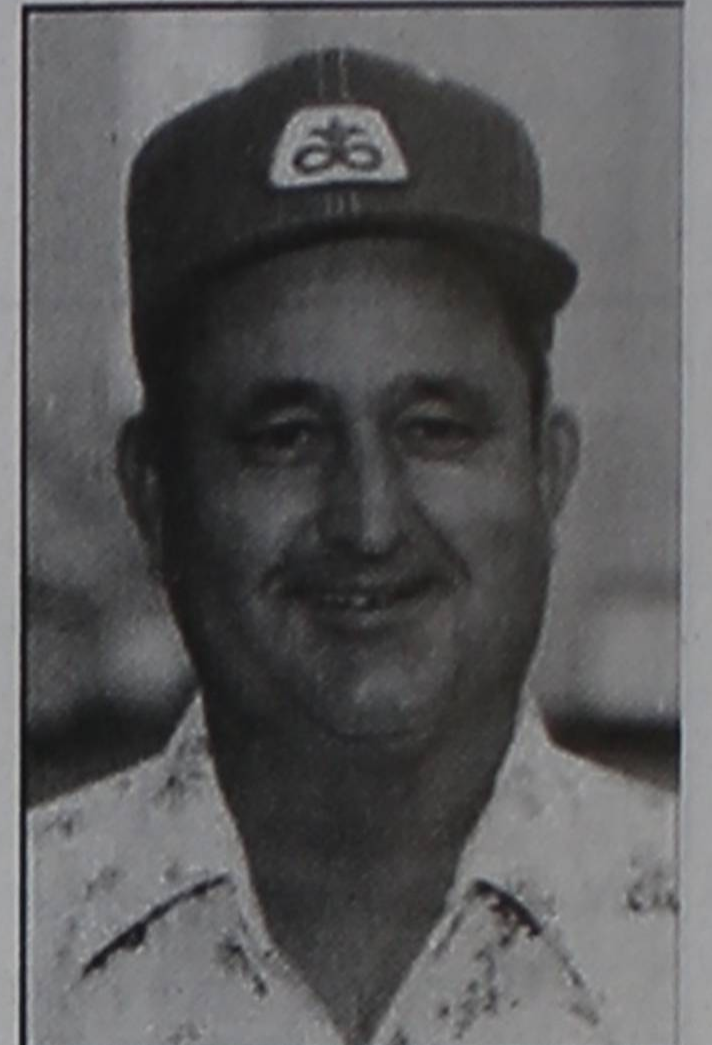
