## Emergency farm loan applications accepted

## Applications for emergency farm loans for losses caused by drought, occurring January 1, 2012 and continuing are being

 drought, occurring January 1, 2012 and continuing are beingaccepted at the Farm Service Agency (FSA) office located in Farwell, Sue Fields said today.
Parmer County is one of 252 in Texas recently named by Sec-
retary of Agriculture eligible for loans to cover part of actual retary of Agriculture eligible for loans to cover part of actual production losses resulting from the drought.
Sue Fields, said farmers may be eligible for loans of up to $100 \%$ the agricultural business, whichever is less. For farmers unable to obtain credit from private commercial lenders, the interest is 2.25 percent.
"As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30 percent loss of production to be eligible for an FSA emergency loan", Sue Fields said. Farmers participating in the Federal Crop Insurance program will have to consider proceeds from thos programs in determining their loss.
Applications for loans under this emergency designation wil be accepted until March 12, 2013 but farmers should apply as
soon as possible. Delays in applying could create backlogs in processing, with possible delays into the new farming season", Sue Fields said.
FSA is a credit agency of the U.S. Department of Agriculture. It is authorized to provide disaster emergency loans to recognized farmers who work at and rely on farming for a substantial par of their living. Eligibility is extended to individual farmers who meet U.S. citizenship requirements and to farming partnerships,
corporations, or cooperatives in which U.S. citizenship require corporations, or cooperatives in which U.S. citizenship
ments are met by individuals holding majority interest.
The FSA office in Farwell is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Additional information regarding disaster as sistance programs may be found online at http://disaster.fsa.usda.gov.
