at any table, then make their way to a meal of fish, chicken, and beef.

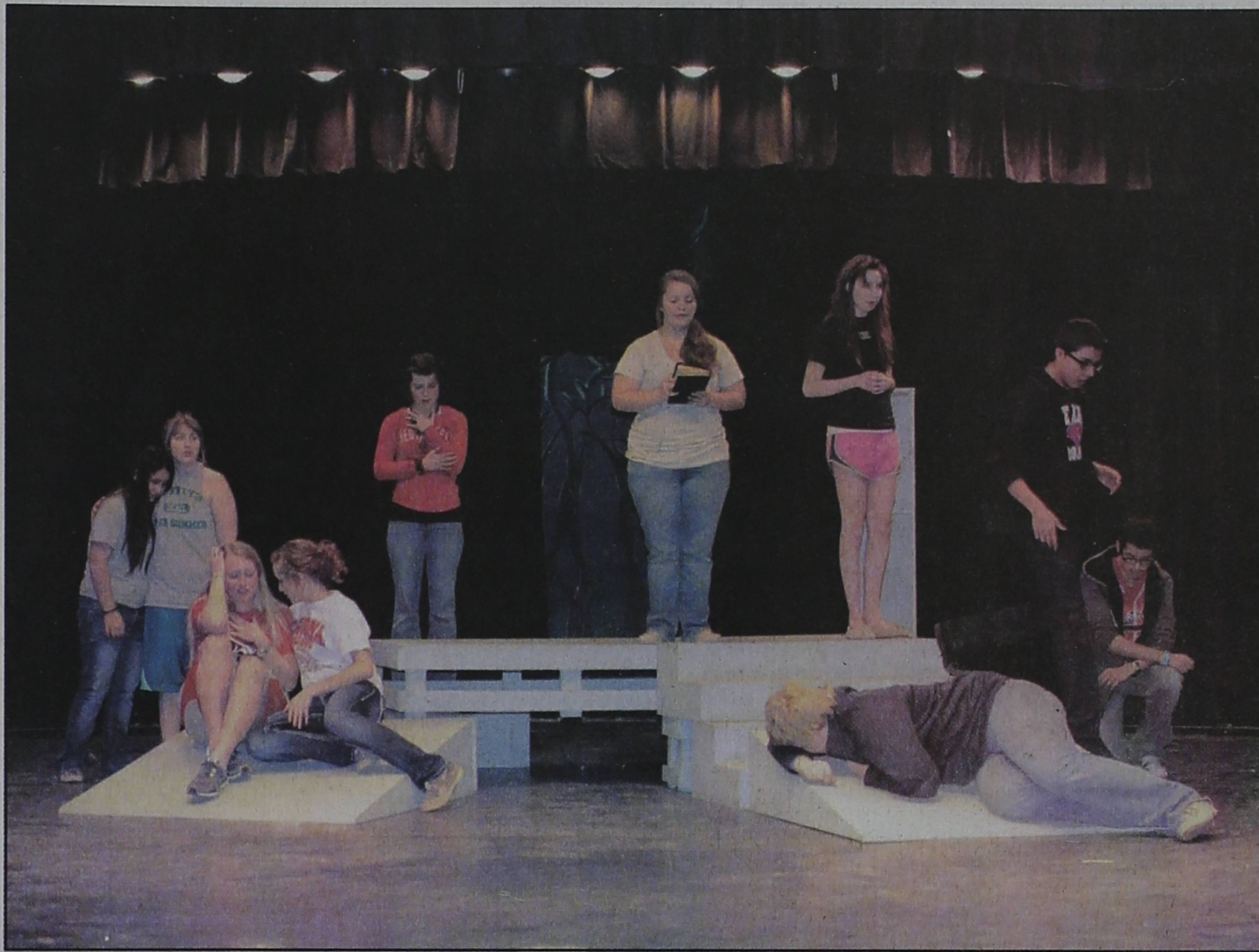
Two directors will be elected. Position One candidates are incumbent Vick Christian and nominee Stephen Schilling. Position Two candidates are incumbent Jerry Roberts

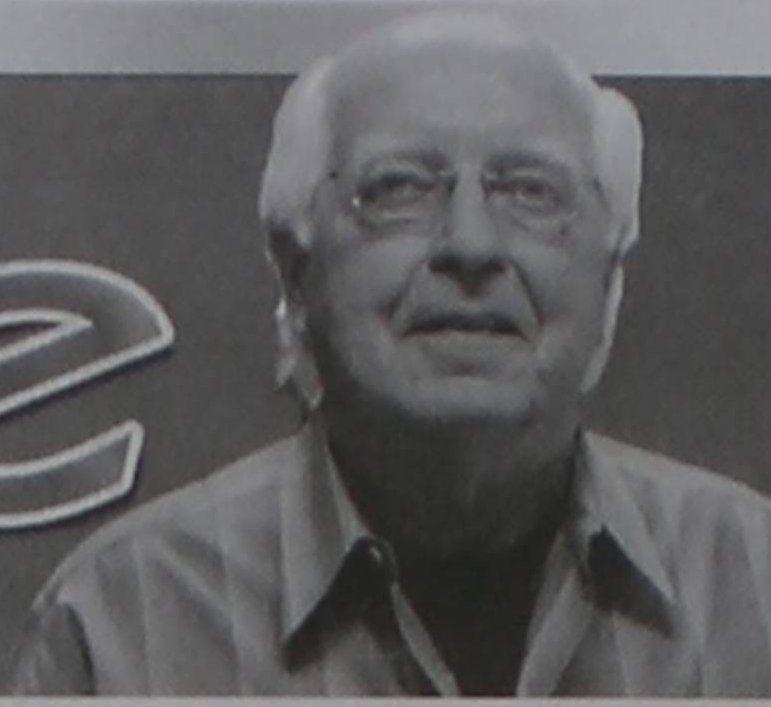

Out Here

In memoriam 1919-2013

Sunday evening our mom passed on. When I was a boy that's the term grownups would use when someone died. Mr. Smith or Aunt Mary passed on yesterday. It wasn't time for mom to pass on. It never is.

Mom's heart stopped about 6:30 p.m. Sunday evening in Room 771 at Baptist St. Anthony's Hospital in Amarillo. That's how the doctor described it to my brother Rick. Her heart stopped. He said they managed to bring her back three times but in the end, her heart, and pulse, and blood pressure stopped.

She was in Amarillo because Saturday about 2:30 p.m. she fell in her bedroom at home, fractured her pelvic bone, and hit her head on a bathroom cabinet, causing a 12-staple gash. After an EMS ride to the Friona Hospital for evaluation she was transferred to BSA. The doctors there said they would not perform surgery on her break because of her age and physical condition.

Besides they said they seldom operate on a pelvic break, it would just have to heal over time and with a lot of rehab, neither prospect having great appeal to a 93-year-old. Nonetheless we were making plans to bring her back to the Friona Hospital Monday to begin what would have been a long painful recovery.

But then her heart stopped. Life is what happens while you're busy making other plans.

Mother met Harry Lookingbill through

a mutual friend. They married in Hillsboro February 28, 1970, and she moved to Friona two days later. We kids had never heard of Friona. For 43 years this has been her home. She had a good life here.

While us kids, me, my brother Rick, sister Gena Beth, and sister Kathy caused her both joy and grief over the years, she always took up for us and cared for us, all the while describing in blunt detail the error of our ways.

On February 28, 1995, I came to Friona to celebrate mother and Harry's 25th anniversary. I lived in Tulsa, Oklahoma at the time. It was a period when things were not going particularly well for me so mother said, "Why don't you come out here, you could find something to do."

So I did. Landed a job at the Friona Star in June 1995. A couple of months later started to write a column called Out Here, which I named because of mom's suggestion to come 'out here.'

In the fall of 2001, my sister Kathy and mom's husband Harry died within days of each other. She stayed strong and moved on but we knew it left a permanent sadness in her heart.

The past three years mom has been in the hospital about six times for a broken femur, cracked vertebrae, pneumonia, and general old age miseries. This last break was more than her frail 93-year-old body could stand. Rick and I noticed something Sunday after-

noon. It seemed to us mom was tired and out of energy to fight another battle.

At one point a young phlebotomist came into her room. She said, "Can I see your arm so I can draw some blood?"

Mom's answer was "No." The young lady said "But the doctor ordered some blood work so can I see your arm please." Again the answer was a resounding "No." She didn't want any more sticking trying to find one of her old veins that would still yield a vial of blood. The young lady left. They didn't get any blood. Mom drifted back into a troubled half-sleep, content that she avoided the needle.

At home on the table beside mom's recliner in the living room we found a yellow sticky note on which she had written three names: Lindsey, Ashley, and Catherine. There was an "X" beside Ashley and Catherine. She had selected Lindsey as her choice to win on The Bachelor, writing the names down to help her failing memory. She looked forward to Monday nights and The Bachelor.

The sad ending to this story is that her heart stopped one day before the final episode that revealed the eventual winner. No matter. She would not have been happy that he picked Catherine. She has always been here. Today she is not and we are sad, but glad we had her for 93-years.

Bye mom. I will always miss you. And your banana bread.

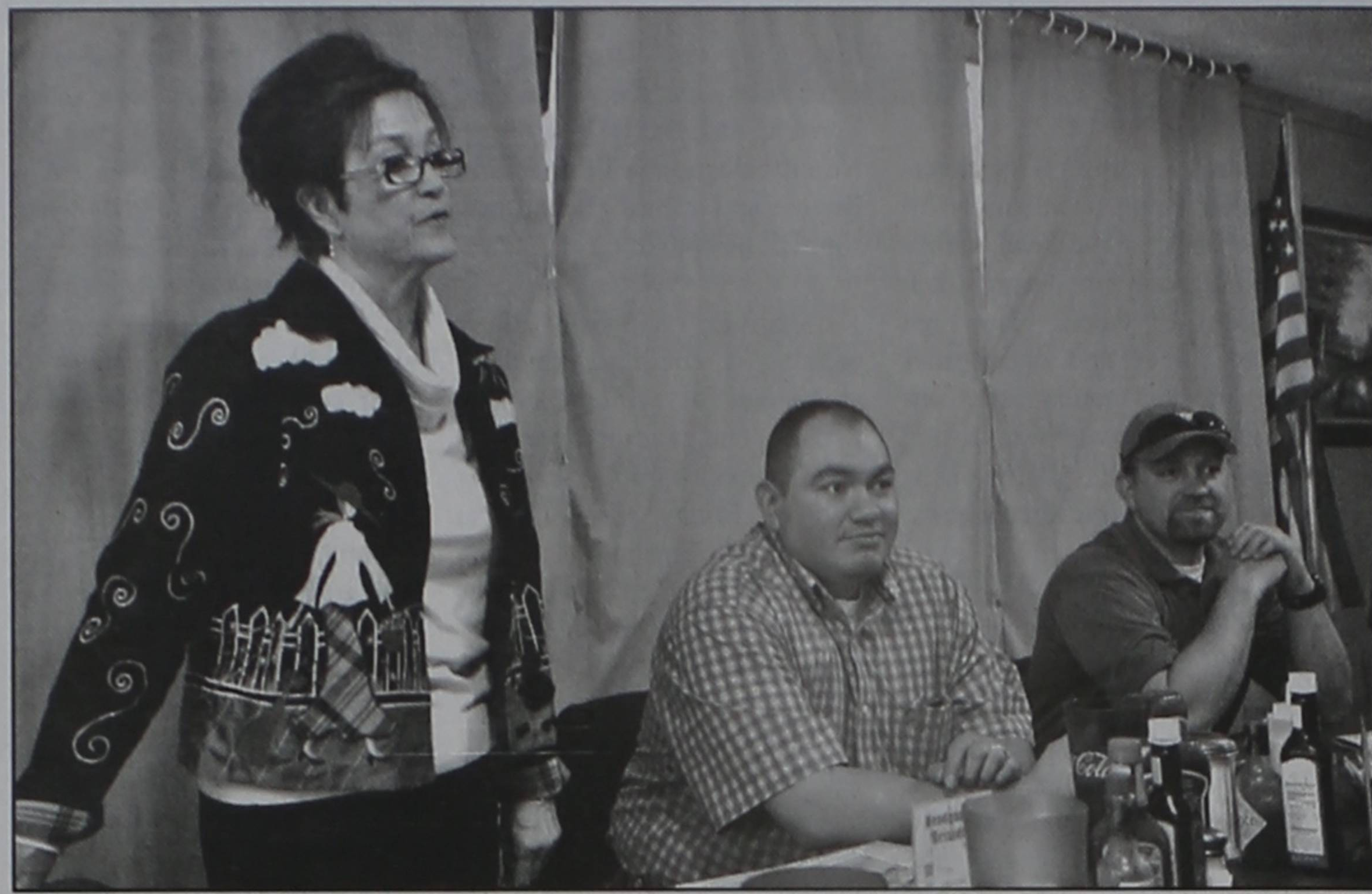

The next meeting of the Noon Lions will be Thursday March 21 at Headquarters Restaurant.

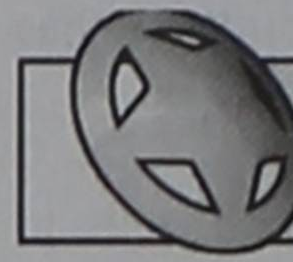

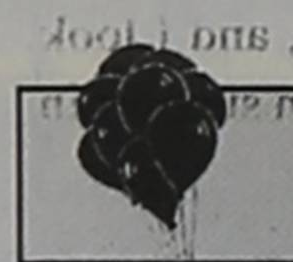

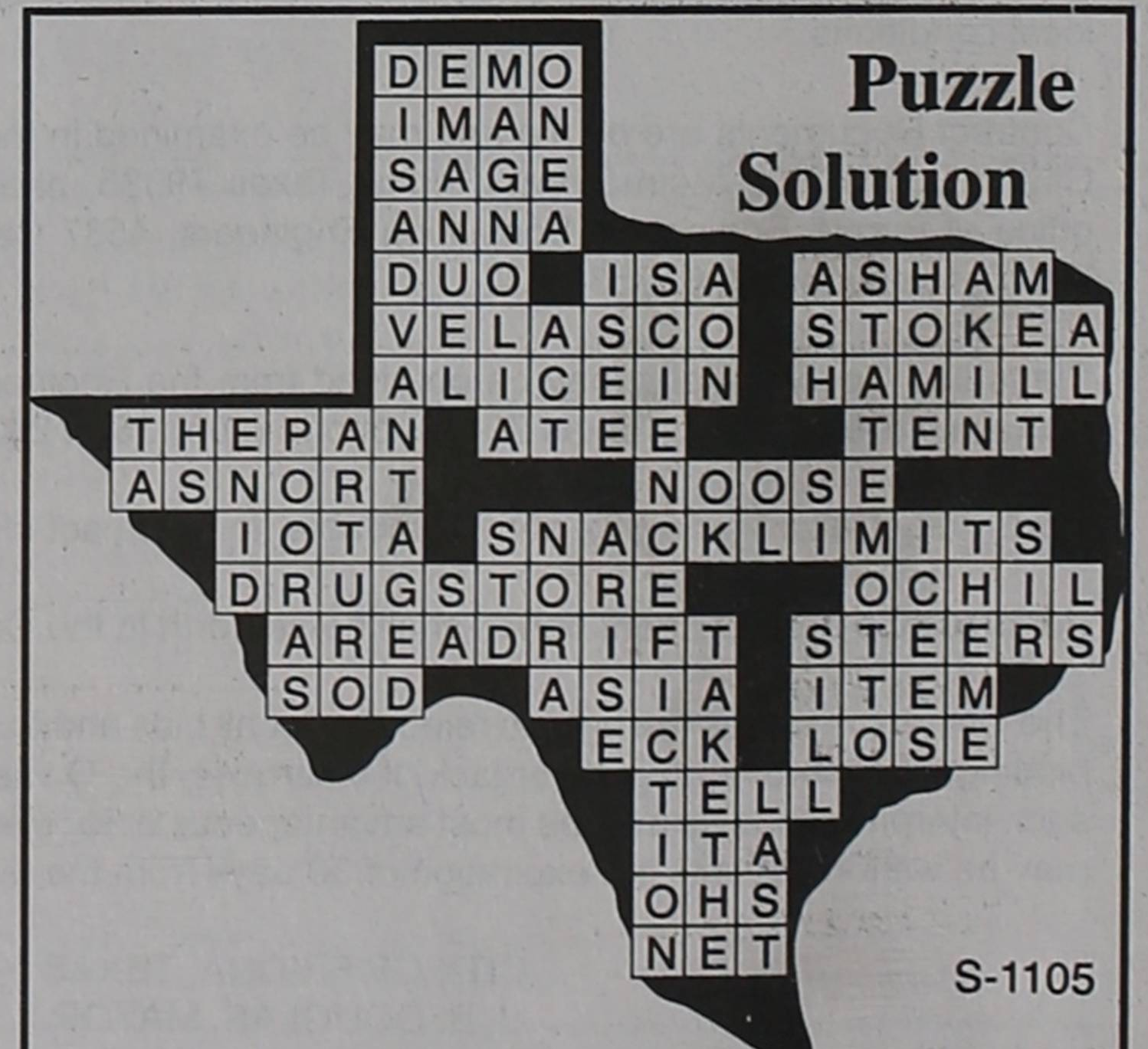

Neugebauer bill will ease fuel transport rules

Congressman Randy Neugebauer (R-TX) introduced H.R. 1026 today, a bipartisan bill that will make it easier for farmers, custom harvesters, and agricultural producers to safely transport the fuel they need for a day of field work. Rep. Collin Peterson (D-MN), Ranking Member of the House Committee on Agriculture, joined Neugebauer in introducing the bill. In the Senate, a companion bill was introduced by Senator Pat Roberts (R-KS) and Senator Heidi Heitkamp (D-ND).

"Farmers know that when it comes time to plant or harvest a crop, every minute matters. But current fuel transport restrictions on certain drivers force them to take multiple trips to the fuel station just to fill up their equipment. That adds time and money that they can't afford," Neugebauer explained.

Currently, Class A commercial drivers can only haul up to 118 gallons of fuel unless they have a hazardous materials endorsement, which is costly and time-consuming to obtain. There is already an exemption to these requirements for Class

B commercial drivers. H.R. 1026 simply broadens that exemption to Class A drivers, who are more stringently tested.

"This bill is a common sense update that reflects the needs of modern agriculture," Neugebauer said. "It simply broadens an existing exemption to federal laws so that producers can safely transport up to 1,000 gallons of fuel for their combines, harvesters, and other large equipment."

He continued, "This legislation is a safe, responsible solution that reduces federal burdens on the people who feed and clothe America, and I look forward to bipartisan support in Congress."

The bill enjoys widespread support from organizations including the Agricultural & Food Transporters Conference, American Farm Bureau Federation, American Soybean Association, Association of Equipment Manufacturers, National Association of Wheat Growers, National Corn Growers Association, National Sorghum Producers, and U.S. Custom Harvesters, Inc.
