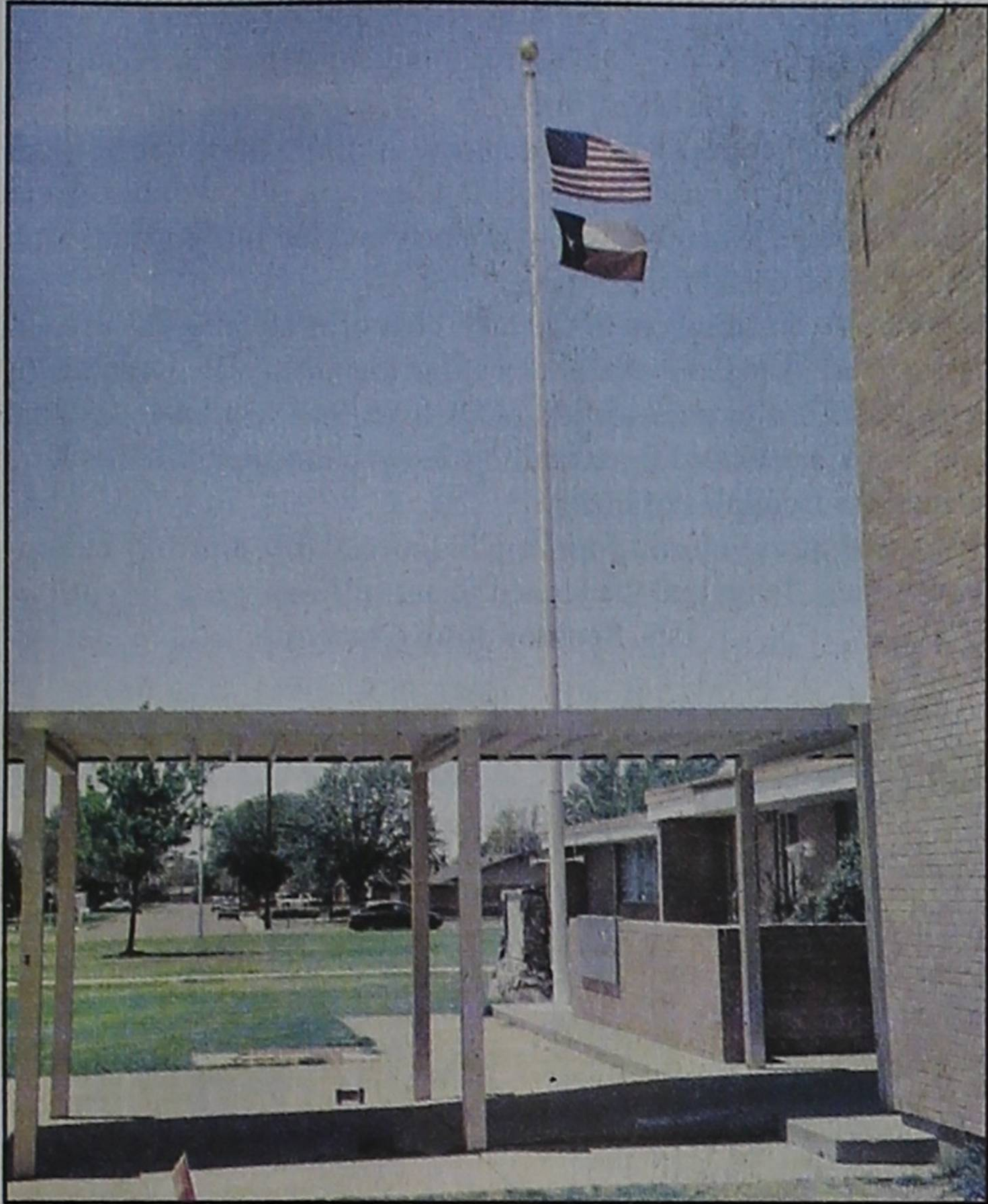

Red Cross, roofing, and tank painting on council agenda

The Friona city council will meet in regular session at 6:30 p.m. Monday July 8 in council chambers at 619 Main St. All council meetings are open to the public.

A public hearing will be held at the first of the meeting for public comments on the 2013 drinking water quality report.

Other items on the agenda include: departmental reports from the Friona library and Friona Police department, financial statements for June 2013 and 3rd quarter 2013, accounts payable for June 2013.

In other business the council will discuss authorizing the city manager to solicit bids for tank painting and rehabilitation of the one-million gallon tank at the north well field, and to solicit bids for the roof at the Friona Public Library.

The council will discuss and take action on statement of agreement between the Texas Panhandle Chapter of the American Red Cross and the City of Friona. Council will also discuss an amended land lease and wind easement between the city and Scandia Wind.

Two other items will conclude the agenda. Kathy Sandoval and Ann Kelley will be considered for appointment to the Friona Library advisory board for a two-year term and a carport variance at 1411 Euclid, requested by Eufemia Cardenas and Arturo Ortiz will be considered.

The council will go into executive session for the annual evaluation of the city manager. After the executive session the council will return to regular session and consider action, if any, in the executive session discussions.

Agenda items noted here are tentative and can be subject to change. The final agenda is posted on the front window of city hall 72 hours prior to the Monday meeting.

Free voter ID cards available

Pursuant to a U.S. Supreme Court ruling, new voting requirements passed by the Texas Legislature in 2011 will take effect immediately. Photo identification will now be required when voting in elections in Texas.

On June 26, 2013, the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) will begin issuing Election Identification Certificates (EIC) to individuals who do not already have an acceptable form of photo identification (ID) to present when voting. Applications for the EIC will be accepted at DPS driver license offices across Texas.

If an applicant already has any of the following documents, they are not eligible to receive an EIC:

- Texas driver license – unexpired or expired less than 60 days
- Texas personal identification card – unexpired or expired less than 60 days
- U.S. passport book or card – unexpired or expired less than 60 days
- Texas concealed handgun license – unexpired or expired less than 60 days
- U.S. Military identification with photo – unexpired or expired less than 60 days
- U.S. Citizenship Certificate or Certificate of Naturalization with photo

To qualify for an EIC, applicants must be:

- A U.S. citizen;
- A Texas resident;
- Eligible to vote in Texas (show a valid voter registration card or submit a voter registration application when applying for the EIC); and
- 17 years and 10 months or older.

Beginning June 26, individuals may apply for an EIC by visiting a Texas driver license office and completing an EIC application (DL-14C). Applicants must also bring the following items to the office to verify U.S. citizenship and identity.

The EIC receipt an individual receives will include their photo and can be used for voting until the permanent card is delivered by mail.

The EIC is free of charge to qualifying applicants and is valid for six years. There is no expiration date of an EIC for citizens 70 years of age or older.

The EIC can only be used for the purpose of voting in an election and may not be used as personal identification.

Residents with a documented disability may apply at their county voter registrar for a permanent exemption from the photo ID requirement. If approved, they will not need a photo ID to vote. Also, if individuals are voting by mail, they do not have to submit a photo ID.

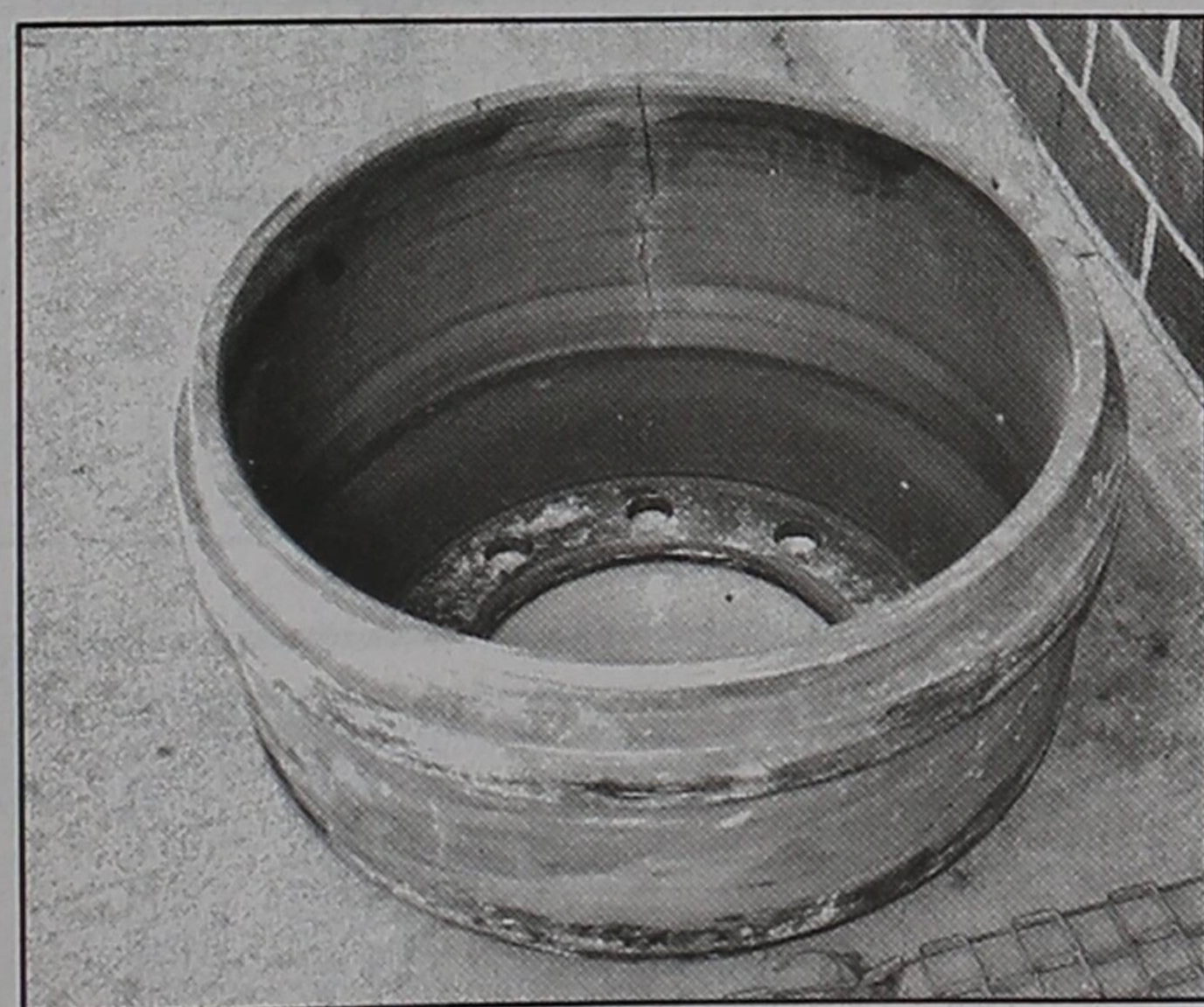
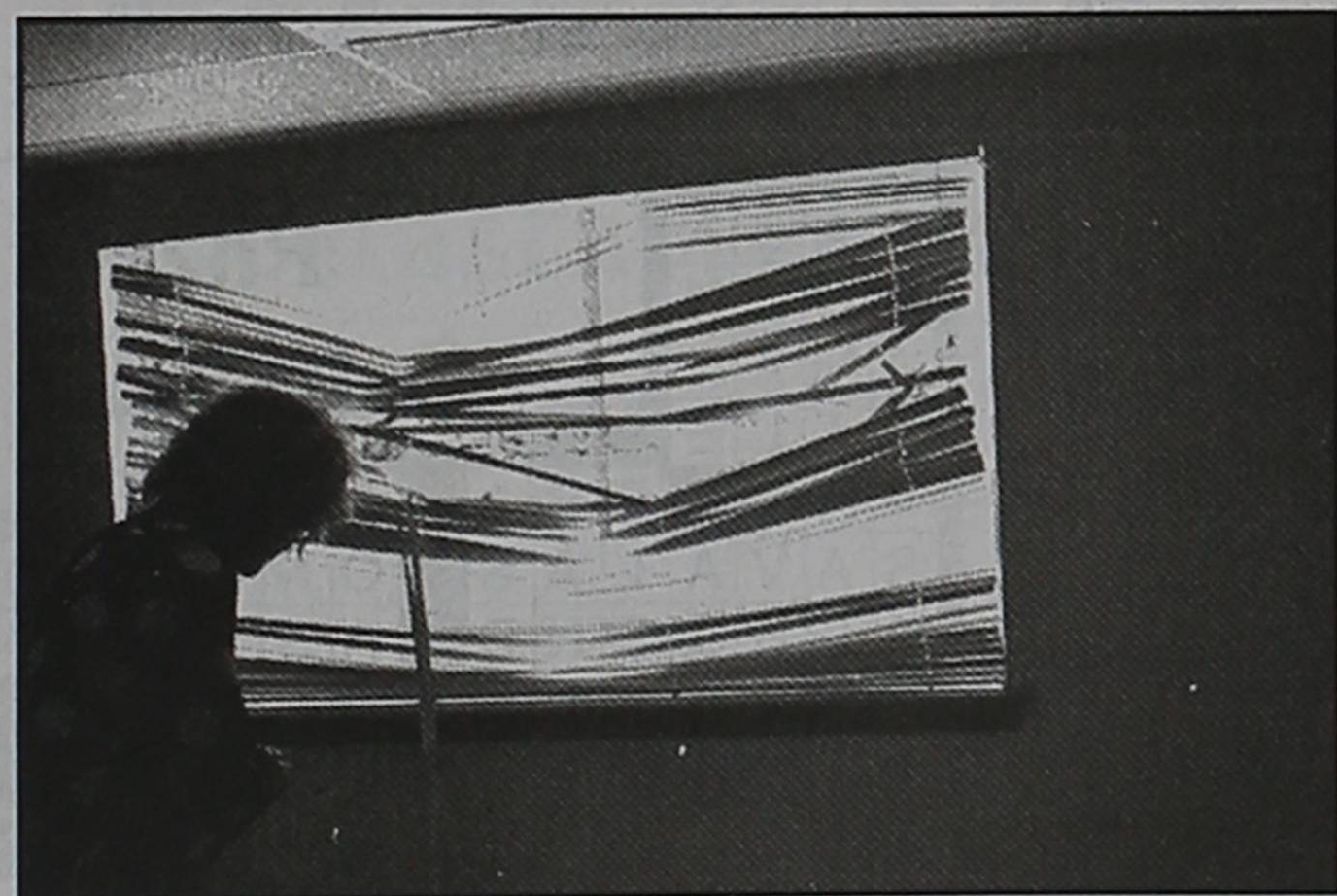
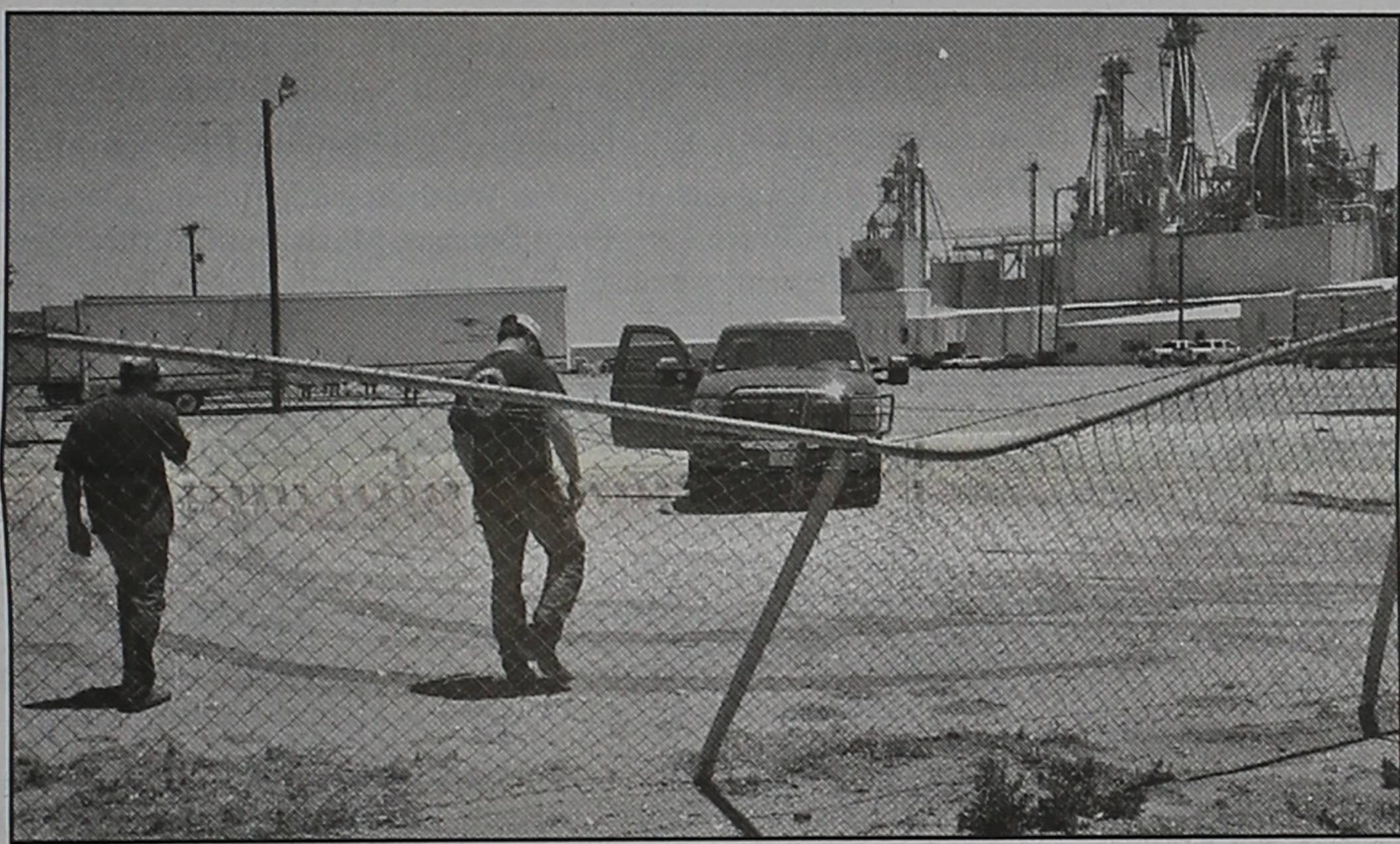

King's Manor founders BBQ

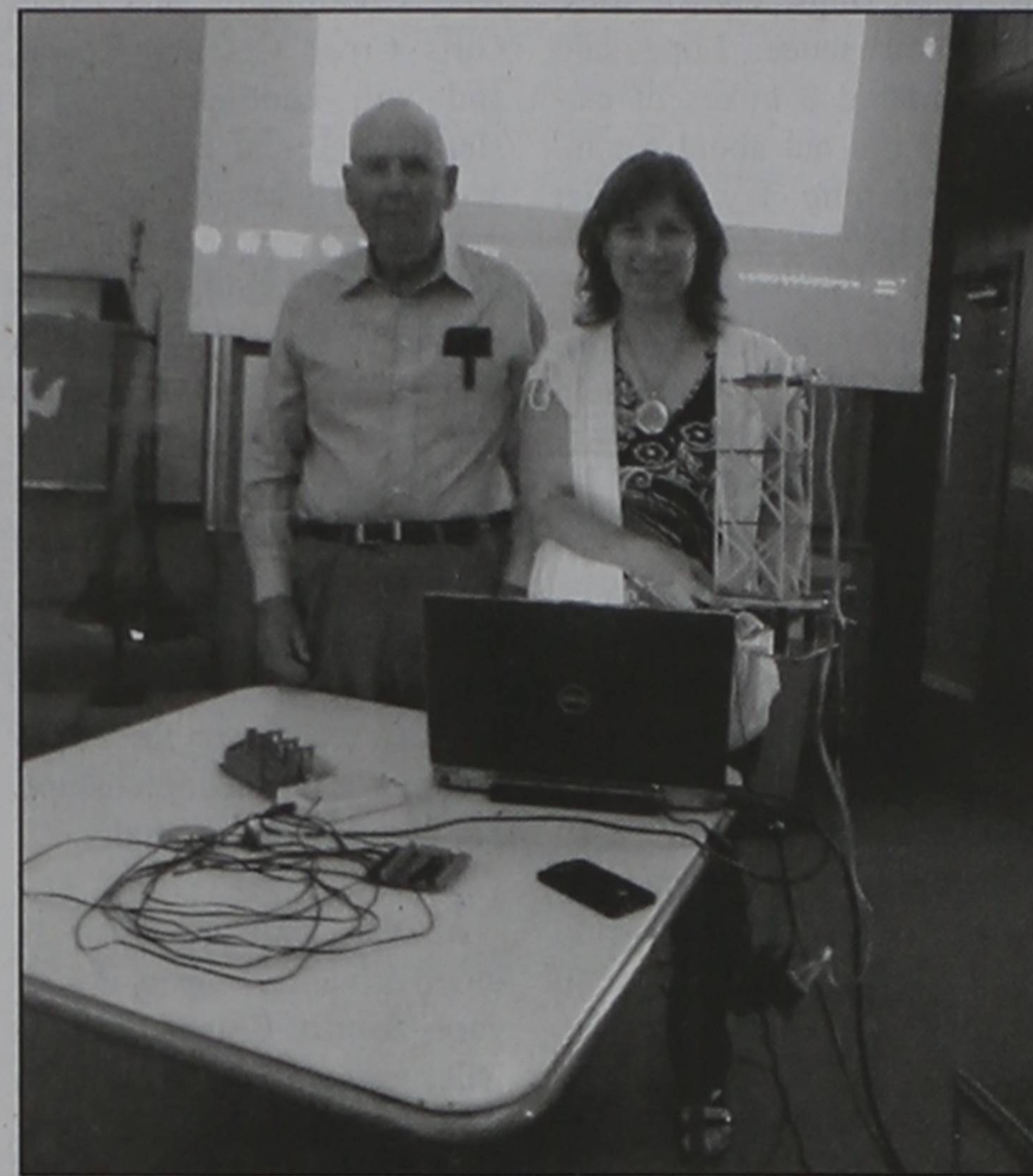

Water district interim manager

Conkwright served 12 years as HPWD manager (2001-2013) and before that, 14 years as Precinct Four District Director representing the portions of Armstrong, Deaf Smith, Potter, and Randall Counties within the district (1978-1992).

"The Board wishes Jim Conkwright all the best on his

retirement. We thank him for 26 years of dedicated service to the High Plains Water District," said Board President Lynn Tate of Amarillo.

"We appreciate Carmon McCain's willingness to serve as interim manager, and have

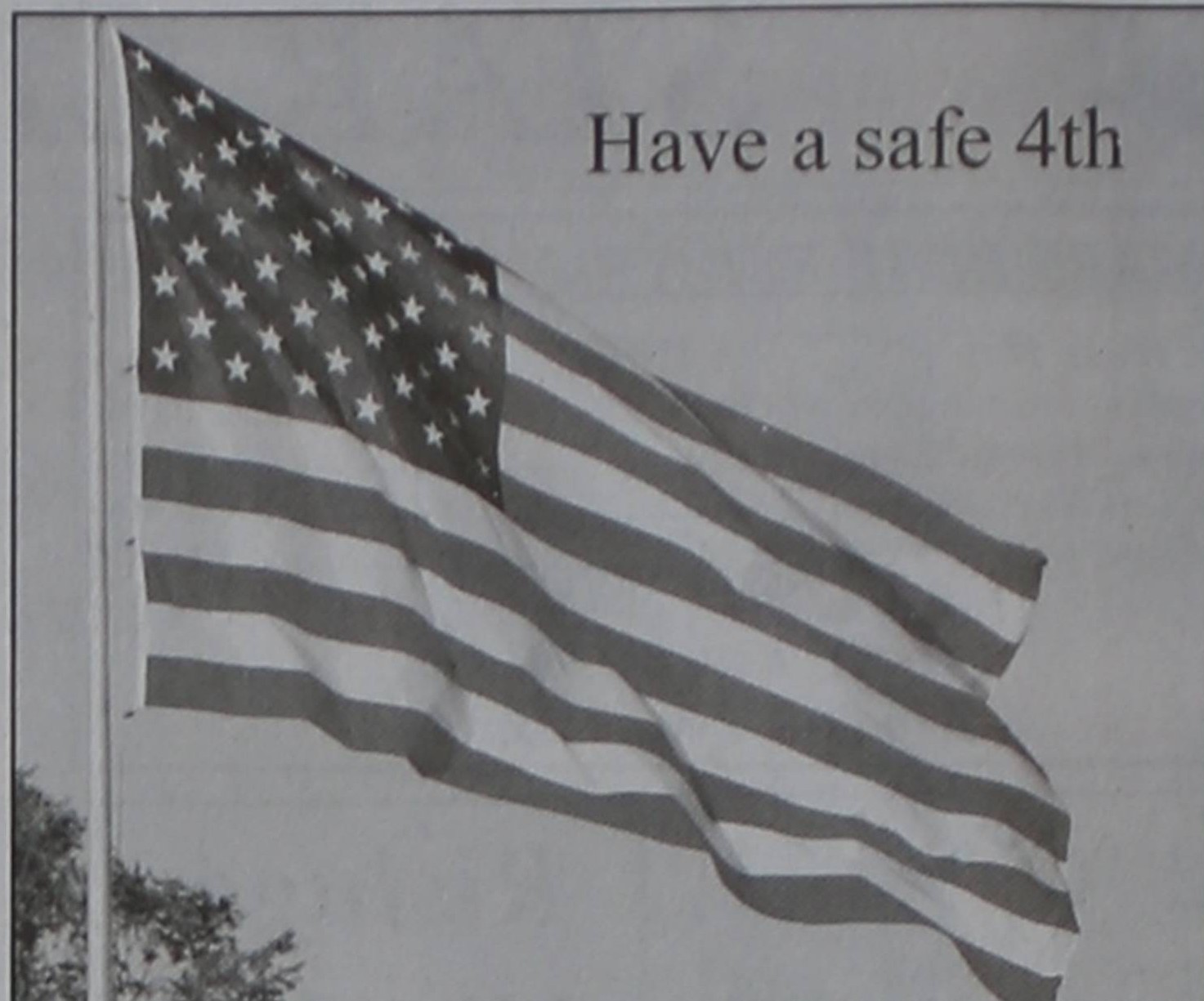
confidence in his abilities," Tate said.

McCain joined the HPWD staff in April 1987 as Information/Education supervisor. Some of his duties include publishing *The Cross Section*, the district's monthly newsletter; writing and distributing news releases; writing and producing radio and television announcements; giving public presentations; maintaining the district's web site; and assisting students in learning the importance of water and water conservation.

He will serve in both positions until a new manager is named.

McCain is a 23-year member of the American Water Works Association (AWWA). He has received seven Watermark awards from the Texas Section AWWA for efforts to raise public knowledge about water issues in Texas.

McCain is a past district governor of Lions Clubs International. In addition, he is a member and former chairman of the Lubbock Chamber of Commerce Agriculture Committee. He is also a member of the Chamber of Commerce's water conservation council.





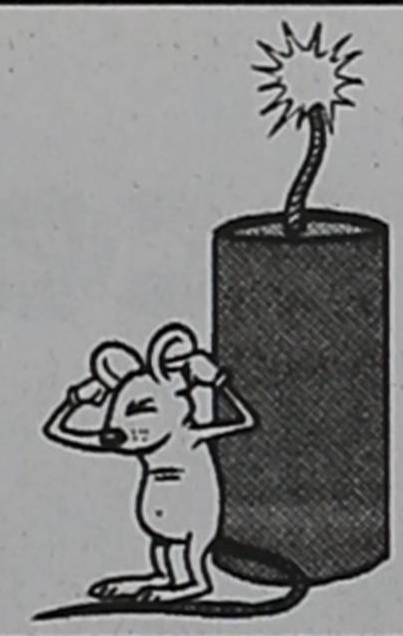

- Business owners along Highway 60 please take care of your right of ways.

Also the city needs to remind citizens of items that cannot be placed in or around dumpsters: mattresses, box springs, concrete, rock, roofing materials, appliances, oil, batteries, and dead animals. The alleys are serviced by trash trucks. The drivers will report any new trash in or around dumpsters and the city will investigate to see who is in violations.

Residents found in violation of any of the city codes may be assessed a fine plus the cost of cleanup.

You do not have to wait for the city to get involved if a problem exists. We can all work together to keep our city a clean and safe place to live.
