that stood on Calvary.

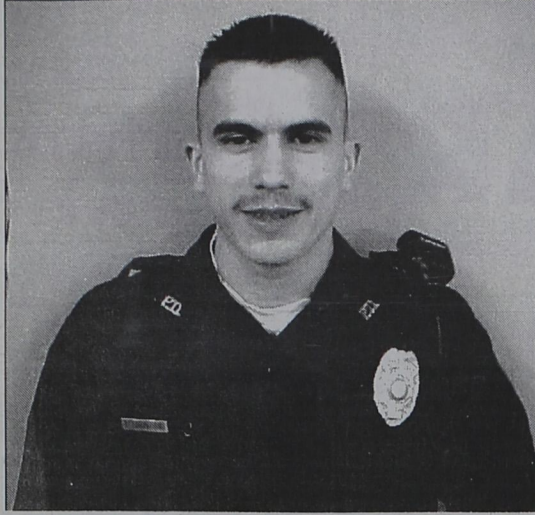
Across the years that grew between,

## Letter To The Editor

Dear Editor:  
I feel compelled to answer last weeks letter concerning the Friona EMS because the facts were distorted. Let me first explain that there are two certified personnel on call 24 hours per day. When we are paged for an out-of-town transfer from the hospital, protocol states that we must first secure back-up to the first-out unit returns to town.

On the occasion that Mrs. Terry referred to, the EMS was paged out for a transfer to Amarillo. They immediately began calling to see who was available to take a back-up call. It was a Sunday morning and evidently no one was in town. At that time, some of the services in neighboring cities were called for back-up, but none were available. The hospital was notified that a back-up crew could not be secured and that we were unable to take the transfer because it would leave Friona without EMS coverage.

There are two types of strokes. The first, Ischemic, is caused by blood clot in the brain. The treatment for this

type of stroke is a medication that must be given within a period of six hours from when the stroke occurs. If this is the type of stroke the patient was having and the window "slammed shut" as Mrs. Terry said in her letter, why was it so long before the EMS was called for transport?

The second type of stroke is a hemorrhagic stroke. This is caused by bleeding in the brain. Treatment for this type of stroke is emergency surgery. Sometimes this treatment is not an option depending on the patient's age, condition and past medical history. If the patient was that critical and the time factor was that critical, then calling the helicopter would have been the right transport option to begin with.

Mrs. Terry also failed to mention that this was a Bovina resident, brought to the hospital by Bovina EMS, and left for us to transfer. There are four other EMS services in Parmer County, but Friona EMS is expected to do all the transfers to

### 70 Yrs Ago--Apr. 10, 1931

Main Street has finally been put in good shape, having been in a disgraceful condition all winter. Commissioner W. M. Alexander suggested that the city buy a four-horse light maintainer, costing about \$250 and after each rain hire a man and teams to smooth the streets. He believes that one man with four horses can be hired at \$7 a day and that he could scrape every street in town in one day.

### 60 Yrs Ago--Apr. 11, 1941

Local news items revealed that Lee Spring was in Lubbock recovering from an appendectomy and Ray Landrum was in a Clovis hospital having had the same

operation. Walter Loveless suffered a broken leg in a farm accident involving a tractor.

### 55 Yrs Ago--Apr. 12, 1946

Raymond Schlabs exhibited the grand champion boar, and Joe Osborn had the grand champion female, in the Parmer County Livestock Show in Friona last Friday and Saturday. Other winners included Friona FFA, the grand champion bull; R.V. Miller, senior champion female; Lloyd Rector, junior champion female; and Miller, grand champion female.

### 50 Yrs Ago--Apr. 12, 1951

Measles, mumps and throat infections have this week taken their toll in absences from the local school system, with 88 grade school students and four high school students being absent yesterday. Though hampering classroom activity, the epidemic has not yet been termed of a nature severe enough to warrant any closing of the school.

### 45 Yrs Ago--Apr. 13, 1956

One of the larger real estate transactions recorded within the Friona city limits was completed this week with the sale of all undeveloped property within the Lakeside Addition to Carl G. McCaslin of Hereford. The Lakeside and Staley Additions were each commenced last year at a time of acute housing shortages in Friona. Building in both locations has proceeded at a rapid pace.

### 40 Yrs Ago--Apr. 13, 1961

Kenneth Miller, 28-year-old head coach at Groom High school, was selected from 15 applications Monday night to become Friona High School's head football coach. Miller has coached the Groom High School Tigers to two consecutive Class B district championships. Miller replaces Earl Smith, who resigned recently after two

years as the Friona head coach.

### 35 Yrs Ago--Apr. 14, 1966

A large crowd attended dedication services for the new Friona Masonic Lodge Monday. H. W. Fulling IM, Most Worshipful Master of Masons in Texas, made the dedication address. Jack Hightower, grand orator, also made an address. Mrs. Pearl Kinsley, who donated the land for the new building and \$5,000 toward its construction, attended the cornerstone laying.

### 30 Yrs Ago--Apr. 15, 1971

Parmer County Commissioners voted Monday to join the cities of Friona and Bovina in paying a monthly subsidy to Claborn Ambulance Service, thus assuring that Parmer County would continue to have a qualified ambulance service. Commissioners, after an hour of heated debate, passed a motion by a 3-1 vote to make a monthly payment of \$420 to defray losses Claborn said he was incurring. The City of Friona had earlier agreed to pay \$200 monthly, and Bovina had indicated it would pay \$100.

### 25 Yrs Ago--Apr. 11, 1976

In one of the best voter turnouts in recent years, Floyd Reeve, George Frye and Teddy Fangman were elected to the Friona School Board last Saturday. A total of 560 voters marked their ballots, an increase of 139 from the voter turnout in 1975. Reeve, the only incumbent running, led the voting with 403. Frye received 233 votes and Fangman 226 votes to gain the other two seats up for the election.

### 20 Yrs Ago--Apr. 12, 1981

The FHS Squaws won the District 2-AAA track and field meet Thursday at Hereford, scoring 160 points to 115 for runner-up Muleshoe.

We hold EMT certification classes and the only enrollees are from other cities. It is understandable why no one wants to be in EMS service. First, you have to attend classes for three months, do in-service in a hospital and on the ambulance, and then pass a very tedious Texas Department of Health state exam. After you are certified you must then maintain continuing education hours and attend training classes to be able to keep your certification current.

Then, and perhaps more importantly, you are on call. For either 12 or 24 hour shifts, you are on constant alert. You cannot leave town. Your meals, job, shower and sleep are interrupted. You must be in a state of constant readiness in order to respond when the pager goes off. You certainly do not do this for the money. It's not that good!

Mrs. Terry is worried about who will drive the ambulance if someone is having a heart attack and both crew members are doing CPR. I assure you that when a situation like that occurs there are always other people such as police, fire personnel and even bystanders who are qualified to assist us in any way. All of our patients are given the very best emergency care possible.

This personnel shortage is not just a problem for Friona. It is a problem for every EMS service in the U.S. But, small cities such as ours are especially hard hit. I have been appointed to the Governor's Rural Task Force. I will be attending meetings in Austin where this issue, along with other problems of rural EMS will be addressed.

I believe that considering what our EMS volunteers sacrifice for this city, it is a shame that they are not appreciated more, and then get slammed in a letter to the newspaper in such a manner. For a very long time, five volunteers have carried this service 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. When Mrs. Terry was asked if she would like to volunteer for the EMS she stated, "No, I have a full-time job." Well, Mrs. Terry, so does everyone else.

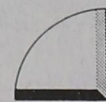

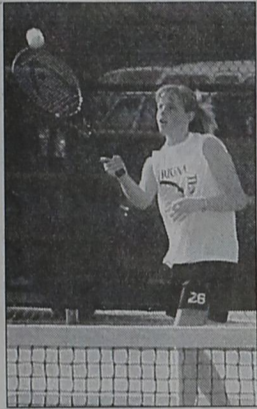

## Squaws Have Final Tuneup For District

The Squaws' track and field team took part in a final "tuneup" prior to the district meet last Thursday at Floydada.

Friona's team was trimmed down due to members participating in other activities, but no team points were recorded, so it turned out to be just a practice meet.

Two members of the Squaws' relay teams, V'Laura and V'Lesha Wilcox, were suffering from muscle strains, and their participation was limited.

V'Laura complained of soreness after she had won the 100-meter hurdles, the event she has dominated in most of the meets, and that was her only event to compete in. The Squaws sprinter's time was 16.8, about a second off her best time.

Amy Murpree continued to improve in the discus throw, with a toss of 124-11, which became the third best throw among those listed this week in the Amarillo Globe-News' "Area Girls' Track Honor Roll." Kayla Smiley was third with a toss of 89 feet, four inches.

Miss Smiley placed second in the shot put with a throw of 30 feet, four and a half inches. She trailed the leader by only five inches. Miss Murpree was third at 30-0, and Kristie Jack was fifth at 28-4.5.

Christie Nava finished third in the 200-meter dash with a 28.05 time, and Cara Evans was fifth at 29.01.

Miss Clark was fourth in

the 400-meter dash at 88.84, and Miss Nava was fifth at 89.41.

With their sore muscles and missing players, the Squaws didn't run in the relay events. All of the district teams took part in the practice meet with the exception of Morton.

## AT PLAINVIEW

### Chiefs Win Third Season Track Meet

The Chieftain varsity track team won their strong spring last weekend by capturing the team title at the Bulldog Relays in Plainview. It was the third invitational meet the Chieftains have won this season.

The team secured the title by amassing 134 points. Runnerup Amarillo High JV scored 95 points, followed by (3) Lubbock Roosevelt, 56, (4) Hereford JV 52; (5) Hale Center 50; (6) Plainview JV 45; (7) Dimmitt 44; and (8) Clovis JV 35.

Friona won only three events, but its depth prevailed. The Chieftains swept 1-2-3 in the 110-meter high hurdles race, for 24 points. Friona also placed 2-3-4 in the 300-meter hurdles, for another 18 points, or 42 points in the two events.

The Chieftains took part in the District 5-AA meet Thursday at Lockney. Results in the Plainview meet were as follows:

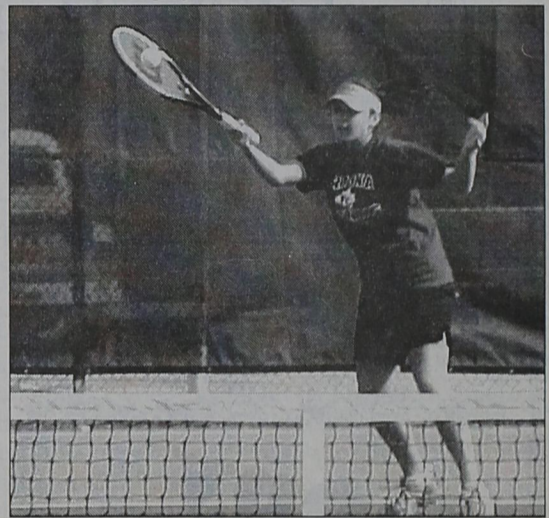

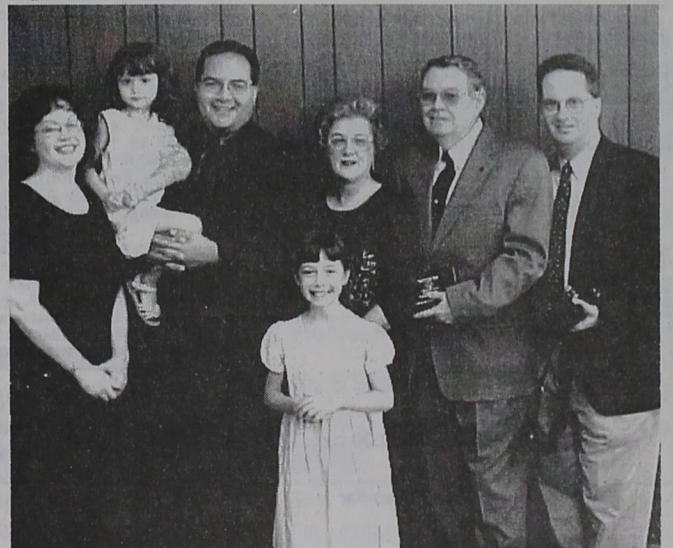

She is a loving mother to Chance and Chad, and husband Mike.

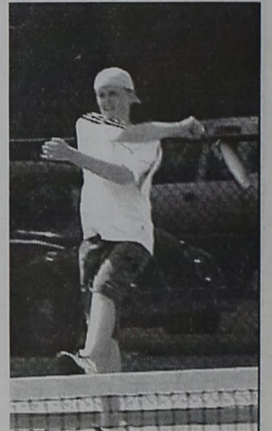

# Teacher Shortage Is Most Serious Problem Facing Schools In Texas

 A serious public teacher shortage exists in the United States. Texas, with its growing student population has been hit particularly hard. It is estimated that

beginning the 2000-01 school year there were 40,000 teacher vacancies in school districts around the state. The shortage is especially acute in subject areas such as math, science, bilingual and special education.

It is also believed that one of the primary reasons teachers are leaving the classroom is to take a job in the private sector with a better package of benefits.

Many small, rural school districts can't even get an insurance company to make them an offer on coverage. A host of others wind up with employee-only coverage that is two or three times more than what it would cost a large employer.

So the simple act of creating a self-funded group, even without putting any state money into it, would help address the issue of availability and affordability for a number of school teachers in Texas.

Rising health care costs for state employees and retired teachers is one of the major costs driving this year's state budget. The decision to commit the state to take on an additional 540,000 school employees in a health insurance plan is huge.

The Senate Education Committee has been warned that any health insurance proposal we consider must be undertaken with the understanding that, like the \$3,000 pay raise teachers received in 1999, new funding will have to be found in future sessions to cover whatever program the Legislature ultimately approves.

During this session, the Legislature is attempting to address this situation. The Texas Senate has passed legislation to quadruple the size of the "Teach for Texas" scholarship program which is designed to offer the most generous scholarship available in Texas to those who commit to going to the classroom upon graduation.

In the meantime, I have been working with the Bush Administration and members of Congress to create a teacher mortgage assistance program modeled on the Veterans Land Board, the successful veterans' mortgage assistance program that has existed for 40 years in Texas.

But the teacher recruitment and retention tool that has gotten the most attention by far this legislative session is the effort to create a state-funded health insurance plan for employees of independent school districts.

Health insurance is typically the most expensive cost a school district faces each year. Both the affordability and availability of insurance are issues faced in almost every school district.

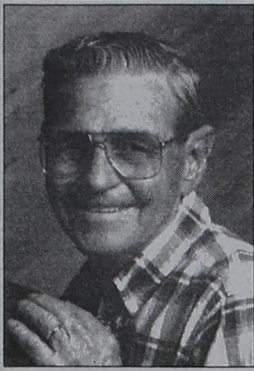

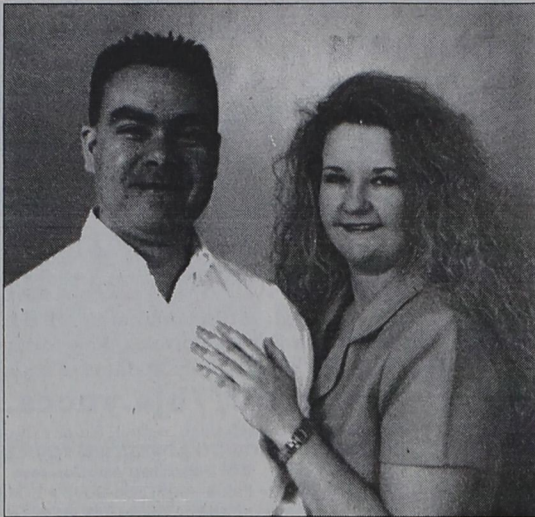
He passed away Saturday, April 7, 2001 at Medical Center Hospital in Odessa after a lengthy illness.

# TAEX Cautions About Alfalfa Aphids, Weevils

Aphids have been of concern in area alfalfa fields the past two weeks.

The cow pea aphid is about one-eighth of an inch long. In the spring and summer all aphids are female and give live birth to up to 100 young over a ten to twelve day period. Twenty generations may occur in a single year.

Cow pea aphids can produce huge population increases when not kept in check by weather, predators, parasites or disease. The greatest amount of damage occurs in the spring. Resistant cultivars help reduce their damage.

Threshold for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service (TAEX) is 40 aphids per stem with alfalfa under ten inches tall. Pea aphids congregate along the stems, terminal shoots and leaves. Heavy infestations cause plants to wilt and yellow. Honey dew is not abundant on infested plants. These aphids can be bright green or solid black.

The spotted alfalfa aphid is one-sixteenth of an inch long and grayish-yellow with four to six rows of raised dark spots on the back. This aphid is found on the underside of the lower leaves. As populations increase they move to all parts of the plant.

Spotted alfalfa aphids secrete large amounts of honey which interfere with cutting and baling and degrade hay quality.

These aphids fall from the plant when disturbed. Winged females can travel up to 70 miles with the wind. Rain and high humidity will reduce populations. This aphid causes a toxic reaction as it feeds which results in plant injury or death of seedling alfalfa.

Established stands stunted growth and yellow areas on the leaves appear. Veins of new leaves are discolored, known as

"veinbanding." Resistant cultivars can be planted. TAEX threshold is 20 aphids per stem with less than ten inch tall alfalfa.

The alfalfa weevil has been emerging and is an important pest of alfalfa. Adult weevils lay eggs inside stems in fall, winter and early spring. Eggs are laid in groups of up to 40 eggs per stem. Each female can lay up to 800 eggs.

Eggs hatch into small, light green, black headed larvae. Young larvae are white and feed within the stem for three or four days. Larvae emerging from the stem are yellowish green. As larvae mature they turn darker green and develop a single white stripe down their back.

Larvae feed for three to four weeks on the terminal and upper leaves. Damage increases with larvae growth, resulting in stunting of

plants. High populations result in defoliation of leaf tissues on the first cutting and delayed, low yielding second cuttings.

The mature larvae spin a spherical cocoon about one-fourth of an inch long on the plants or in the curl of fallen dead leaves. Adults emerge in one to two weeks and leave the field to aestivate for the summer and will return to the fields in the fall.

Winter grazing helps destroy the fall laid eggs. TAEX threshold is 1.5 larvae per terminal with 25-30 percent damaged terminals with presence of one medium or larger larvae per stem with alfalfa seven to fourteen inches tall.

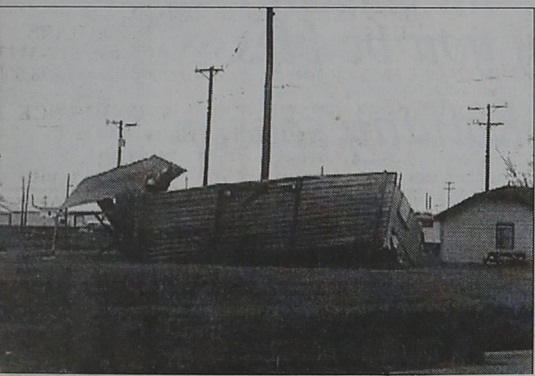

# Out Here

If you have ever had two children close together in age, you are familiar with the first experience in life we have with saying "I'm sorry."

When Child A whacks Child B with the TV remote (used to be with a stick) and Child B screams bloody murder, you grab Child A by the arm and demand, "Tell your sister (brother) you are sorry."

Child A will then do the following: fold his arms across his little chest, stick out his little bottom lip, and utter the very first word he ever learned, "NO."

At this point there is no threat a grownup can use to make the little urchin say he or she is sorry.

"You tell her you are sorry right now."

"NO!"

"I'm going to whip you if you don't say you are sorry right now."

"I don't care."

"All right then you can't watch TV for the next ten years and you'll have to do

They look alike, act alike and talk alike. A long time ago when they stuck out that bottom lip and refused to budge, I confess I had to turn away so they wouldn't see me laughing.

Admit it. The little boogers are so cute it is impossible to impose the capital punishment we threaten them with.

I thought about these great memories the last couple of weeks when America stuck it's bottom lip out, arms folded, and refused to say "I'm sorry" to China.

Of course we say we didn't do anything wrong. Many of the Democrats said we ought to say we're sorry anyway.

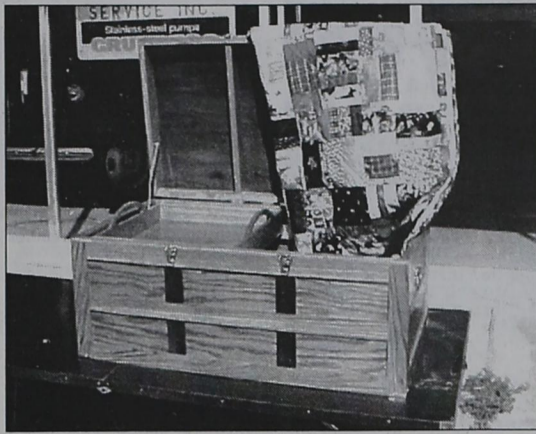

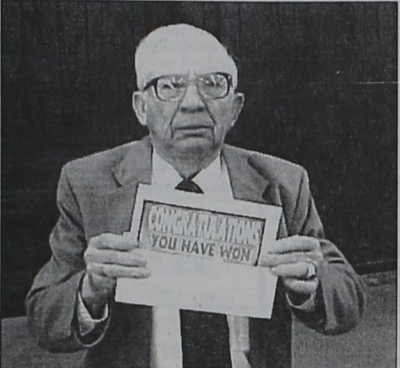

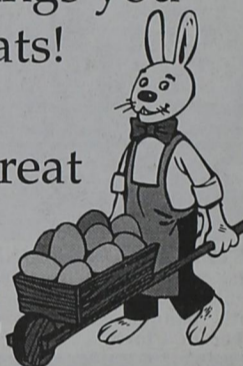

## YOUR EYES

### Toys Can Cause Serious Eye Injuries

Toys are not always fun. Even those that pass safety standards can cause eye injuries. Over 10,000 toy-related eye accidents are reported by U.S. and Canadian hospitals each year. This number does not include the number of patients going to a doctor's office or getting treated at home. Projectiles, balls and high-speed toys can cause considerable damage including black eyes, internal eye bleeding, scratched corneas, detached retinas and even total loss of an eye.

Toy packaging is marked with the appropriate age range. However, it usually does not include a warning about possible eye injuries. When shopping for a toy, check to see if it has any sharp points that may cause an injury if improperly used. If the toy has a projectile or slingshot-type mechanism, carefully read all directions and take necessary precautions for eye safety.

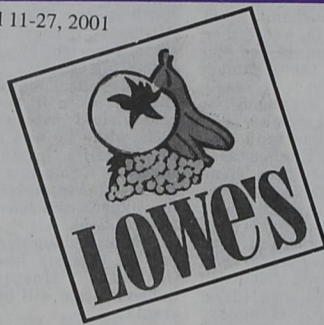

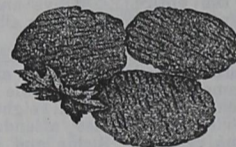

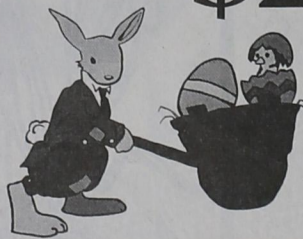
