Practices include contour farm ing, cover cropping crop residue management, range and pasture seeding and improvement farm and ranch ponds, terraces. field diversion irrigation lan preparation, improved water application, water facilities, and collective terrace outlets.

The farmer receives this free engineering assistance, including plotting of a contour map of his individual farm; and he in turn supplies his own labor of work contractor. There is absolutely no cost to the cooperator except compliance and rental of any equipment. Contracts are signed for a five year period, with privilege of renewal by mutual agreement.
