



Local warrant issued in kidnapping case

A former teacher in Florida faces kidnapping and assault charges after allegedly spiriting a 13-year-old Big Spring girl to Tallahassee.

Gil Raimundo Cancel-Comas, 29, is being held without bond in a Tallahassee jail on charges of kidnapping, lewd and lascivious conduct, contributing to

the delinquency of a minor and custody interference.

In addition, Howard County authorities have issued a warrant for his arrest for kidnapping, said Mark Hall, chief deputy for the Howard County Sheriff's Office.

Cancel-Comas was arrested Wednesday after driving to Big Spring to pick up the girl and take her to Florida, officials

said.

Evidently, Cancel-Comas made initial contact with the girl on the Internet and they had been chatting for about a year, authorities said.

Sometime after Cancel-Comas transported the girl to Florida, she contacted family members in Big Spring, then Tallahassee police, Hall said. Cancel-Comas was arrested soon afterward.

In published reports, the Tallahassee Democrat stated that Cancel-Comas was a mathematics teacher at a Tallahassee high school until 2004, at which time his contract was not renewed because of his teaching performance. Officials at the school said there was no inappropriate conduct between him and his students, the Democrat report stated.

Hall said local officials are working with the Texas Attorney General's office to secure Cancel-Comas' extradition to Texas.

Meanwhile, the girl has been returned to Big Spring, he said.

Grand jury: Mother tried to murder her daughter

Others indicted for robbery, assault, DWI

A Howard County woman accused of trying to kill herself and her 12-year-old daughter was indicted on attempted murder charges during Thursday's session of the Howard County Grand Jury.

Callie Jo Nickle, 51, of 1811 S. Nolan, faces a possible prison term of between two and 20 years in prison stemming from an incident that occurred on or about June 7, 2006.

District Attorney Hardy L. Wilkerson said Nickle is accused of trying to kill herself and her 12-year-old daughter by means of an overdose of medication.

The two were discovered by Nickle's 24-year-old daughter and were subsequently transported to Scenic Mountain Medical Center.

Nickle quickly recovered from the incident, but her daughter had to be transported to a Lubbock hospital, where she remained for some time before recovering.

In addition to the possible prison term, Nickle faces a fine of up to \$10,000 if convicted of the second-degree felony.

Also indicted Thursday were three men accused of aggravated robbery in connection with an incident that allegedly occurred Dec. 17, 2006.

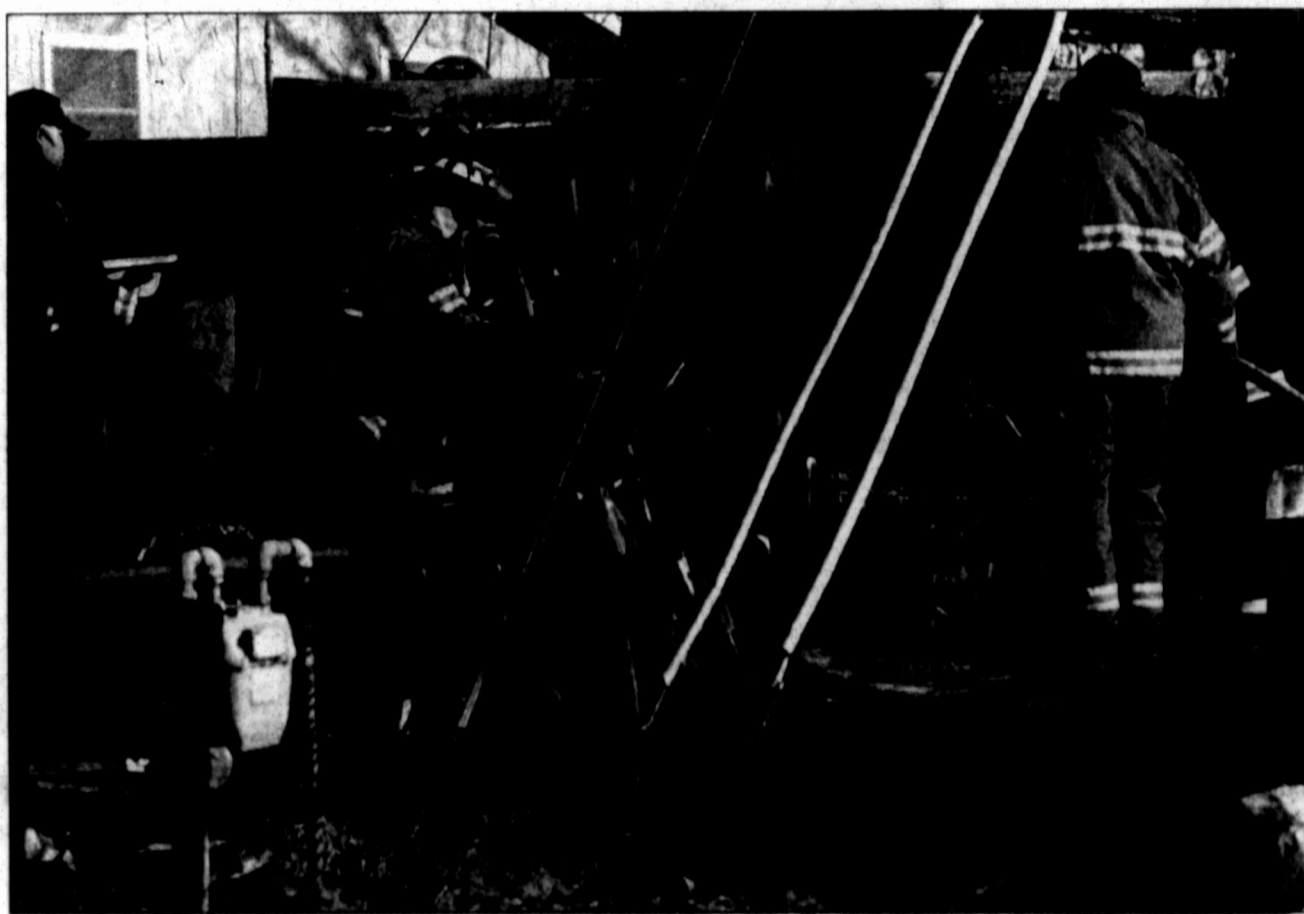
Daniel Lewis, 18, Terrance Monte Lewis, 20, and Jerome Mitchell, 25, all of Big Spring, allegedly entered a laundromat on 11th Place, threatened the clerk with a handgun and demanded money before making off with approximately \$124, Wilkerson said.

Scam foiled

Western Union agent warns public to beware

A local Western Union representative is warning area residents the Howard County area could be the target for a Jamaican money scam.

Vicki Osburn, a local Western Union agent, said a customer approached her to transfer funds to Kingston, Jamaica, late Friday afternoon, a transfer that threw up plenty of red flags.

"The woman had been told she had won a prize, but she had to send \$400 for shipping and postage

As tax season kicks into high gear, volunteers with the annual AARP Tax-Aide program have begun wading through the sea of red tape to help area residents file their income tax returns.

Program Coordinator Gloria Hopkins said she and her staff of volunteers have begun preparing tax forms and will be hard at it every Monday between now and early April.

"We'll begin doing taxes at the Senior

Center from 8 a.m. until noon on Monday, and will continue each Monday at those same times through April 9," said Hopkins.

This Monday is a holiday, President's Day, and the Senior Center will be closed, but volunteers will help with filings Tuesday.

"For those who are homebound and can't get to the center with their tax information, if they will call us, we'll be happy to pick up the information and get the taxes ready," she noted.

Hopkins said the volunteer-based program is designed to help people that might not otherwise be able to file a tax return.

"The AARP program provides free fed-

eral tax preparation assistance to people who cannot afford professional tax help, such as seniors, people with disabilities, those who don't speak English and people with low-to-moderate income," said Hopkins. "People need to be sure to bring all of the pertinent information with them, including a tax booklet if one was received through the mail, W-2 forms and 1099 forms. They also need to bring any forms that show their 2006 earnings and their 2005 tax returns. We also need a Social Security card for every person named on the return and a photo ID for the person filing."

"AARP has decided not to file any

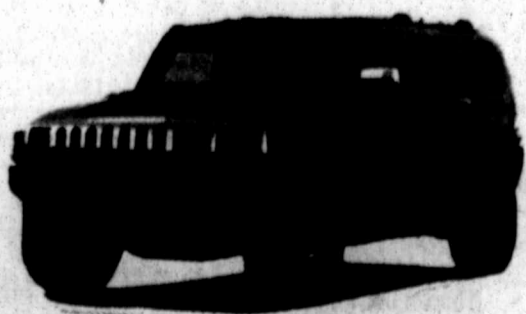

IRS: Don't forget to request special refunds

Live assistance is available 7 a.m. until 10 p.m. Monday through Friday

The Internal Revenue Service has started processing tax returns that claim key tax provisions renewed by legislation enacted in December and is urging taxpayers not to overlook the one-time telephone tax refund, according to government officials.

After completing planned updates to its systems to accommodate the "extender" changes, the IRS announced this week it has begun processing both e-file and paper tax returns claiming deductions for state and local sales taxes, higher education tuition and fees, and educator expenses.

The IRS emphasized that using e-file is the easiest and most accurate way to file a return, including any return claiming extender-related benefits. According to officials, makers of tax-preparation software have updated their prod-

ucts to incorporate these reinstated tax breaks.

"As we always do, we encourage taxpayers who think they may claim these deductions to file electronically," said IRS Commissioner Mark W. Everson. "They will get their refunds in half the time, and e-file greatly reduces the chance for making an error compared to using a paper return."

While taxpayers using software will fill out their returns as normal, taxpayers claiming the extender provisions on paper returns will have to take special steps. Because the extender legislation was enacted after the new tax forms went to print last year, IRS officials said separate lines for the affected deductions were omitted from 2006 individual income tax forms. For that reason, people filling out a paper return must use existing lines on the current Form 1040 and Schedule A to claim the

three major extenders provisions.

Whether claiming the extender deductions or not, the IRS is reminding taxpayers that a one-time refund of the telephone excise tax on long-distance and bundled service is available on this year's return.

One in three early filers are failing to request this special refund, according to statistics released by the IRS, and although many of them are likely not eligible, others may qualify and not know it.

returns if the taxpayer is listed as married but filing separately," she added. "We also have to physically see the Social Security cards for everyone listed in the tax return. In the past, the taxpayer could just provide us the number, but we're being required to actually see the card this

year."

Hopkins said the program is a necessity for many area residents who can't afford to have their taxes prepared by a professional. She also noted the heart and soul of the operation is its volunteers.

"AARP volunteers explain many special tax credits and deductions and how people may claim them on their tax returns," she said. "These volunteers help people

complete their returns, right down to any refunds that may be due them."

to an individual in Jamaica," said Osburn. "We've seen this plenty of times before. The locations and names of the individuals are always

changing, but the basic premise is the same. You get ripped off."

Osburn said she was able to warn the woman of the scam, but she doubts it will be the last time she sees this type of malicious attempt to bilk someone out of their hard-earned cash.

"When these people target an area for a scam, they rarely just send the notice out to one person," said Osburn. "So I seriously doubt the lady I spoke with is the only person they have contacted in this area."

"People really need to be on the lookout for

these kinds of scams. Even if the scam is deemed illegal, with them being in a foreign nation the chances of you ever getting your money back are next to nothing. You might as well just toss it right out the window."

Osburn said she would be victim said she plans

to report the matter to the attorney general's office.

"We hear about these kinds of scams all the time," said Osburn. "But sometimes we just need a quick reminder."

U.S. oil about to 'win' Iraq war

As members of Congress struggle even to begin to debate the war in Iraq, U.S. oil corporations move steadily closer to victory. The Iraqi government is considering a proposed new national oil law, which, if passed, would grant U.S. oil companies that which they have always wanted but have thus far been denied: access to and control of Iraq's oil under the ground.

For four years, the Bush administration and its allies in the oil industry have pressured the Iraqi government to pass this new oil bill that would turn Iraq's nationalized oil system over to private foreign corporate control.

Recent drafts of the bill would give private companies (including foreign ones) control of Iraq's oil production and 70 percent of the profits, specifying that up to two-thirds of Iraq's known oil reserves would be developed by private companies, and would lock the government into 30-year contracts.

The law originated in the U.S. State Department's Oil and Energy Working Group that recommended in April 2003 that Iraq "should be opened to international oil companies as quickly as possible after the war" using production-sharing agreements.

These agreements are preferred by the oil industry but rejected by all the top oil producers in the Middle East because they grant greater control and more profits to the companies than to the governments.

Plans for this new law were first made public at a news conference

in late 2004 in Washington, D.C. Flanked by U.S. State Department officials, U.S.-appointed Iraqi Finance Minister Adel Abdul Mahdi (who is now vice president) explained how this law would open Iraq's oil industry to foreign companies. This, in turn, would be "very promising to the American investors and to American enterprise, certainly to oil companies." The law would implement production-sharing agreements.

Last July, U.S. Energy Secretary Samuel Bodman announced at a press conference in Baghdad that oil executives told him that their companies would not enter Iraq without passage of the new oil law. "Petroleum Economist" magazine later reported that U.S. oil companies considered passage of the new oil law more important than increased security when deciding whether to go into business in Iraq.

On December 6, the highly anticipated report of the bipartisan Iraq Study Group was released. Page 1, chapter 1 of the report laid out Iraq's importance to its region, the United States, and the world with this reminder: "It has the world's second-largest known oil reserves." The report specifically (and publicly) called on the Bush administration to "assist Iraqi leaders to reorganize the national oil industry as a commercial enterprise" and to open it to "international energy companies."

While the rest of the Iraq Study Group Report was ignored by the White House and the press, the oil recommendations were in lock step with the Bush administration's Iraq. The president followed the release of the report with his first public demand of the Iraqi government to pass the oil bill. Shortly thereafter, U.S.

Ambassador to Iraq Zalmay Khalilzad and General George W. Casey Jr., the senior American commander in Iraq, made the same public demand.

On January 10, the same day that the president announced that he was sending an additional 21,500 U.S. troops to Iraq, the White House identified the key benchmarks required of the Iraqi government, including enactment of a "hydrocarbons law to promote investment, national unity, and reconciliation." Exactly seven days later, the oil bill passed its first official government hurdle in Iraq: passage out of the drafting committee. It now moves on to the Iraqi cabinet before moving to the Parliament. U.S. oil corporations and the Bush administration are simply trying to get the best deal possible from a war-ravaged and desperate people.

Our members of Congress must pull the curtain back to expose the three-letter word that now holds our soldiers and the Iraqi people hostage: oil. The must pull themselves together and do what the American public elected them to do—end the war in Iraq.

Only the end of the military and corporate occupations will allow the Iraqi public to make a truly democratic decision about how to manage their most vital natural resource, freed from the pressure of an occupying army and a powerful corporate lobby.

Fire burning at Sunray refinery

SUNRAY (AP) — Emergency workers say an explosion rocked a West Texas refinery Friday, injuring at least 13 people and sparking a fire that sent a huge black cloud billowing into the sky that was visible from 60 miles away.

No fatalities were reported and all employees at the Valero McKee Refinery were accounted for, said Valero Energy Corp.

Three people with burns were transferred to

University Medical Center in Lubbock, home of the regional burn unit. The three men were in critical condition Friday night, a nursing supervisor said.

Ten others were treated at Moore County Hospital in Dumas, most for smoke inhalation, said Theron Park, the hospital district's chief executive.

A Valero employee was taken to a local hospital after experiencing chest pains, the company said in the statement.

Valero said in a statement that the fire was believed to have started at the refinery's "propane deasphalting unit," where fuel is processed at high temperatures.

Witnesses in Amarillo, about 60 miles to the south, reported seeing the cloud of smoke.

Paul Jenkins, the fire chief in nearby Dumas, said the plant's 400-plus workers were evacuated following the blast around 2 p.m.

"The main thing is get-

ting them away from there," Moore County Judge Rowdy Rhoades told the *Amarillo Globe-News*. "It seems like they have a really good evacuation plan."

By Friday evening, the refinery was shut down, as were pipelines in and out of the facility as part of emergency response procedures, Valero said.

A command center had been set up and Valero's fire brigade was trying to put out the fire, Jenkins said.

Valero said in its statement that it has dispatched two planes from its corporate headquarters in San Antonio with support teams, supplies and other resources.

Valero, the largest refiner in North America, operates 17 refineries, 16 in North America and one in Aruba.

The McKee refinery, located about 10 miles northeast of Dumas, is one of six in Texas and has a capacity of 100,000 barrels per day.

Bid for Oswald's reputed sniper's perch falls through

DALLAS (AP) — The auction of a window said to be Lee Harvey Oswald's sniper perch in the killing of President John F. Kennedy ended with a bid of about \$3 million, but the deal fell through about an hour later.

The perch was up for auction on eBay Friday with a starting price of \$100,000, which quickly got up to seven figures. But 32 bids were either retracted by the bidder — normally because the wrong price had been entered, including one for

\$17 million — or canceled by the seller because the bidder didn't meet the qualifications.

Then, it turned out that the winner "didn't have the cash," said Fred McLane, a business representative for owner Caruth Byrd.

"This guy slipped into the bidding in the last minute. But he didn't have the money," McLane told *The Dallas Morning News* for its Saturday editions.

Byrd is the son of the man who owned the Texas School Book

Depository when Kennedy was assassinated on Nov. 22, 1963. Weeks after the assassination, Col. D. Harold Byrd ordered employees to remove the window. He then kept it in his home for more than two decades before his death in 1986.

His son, Caruth, took it to his home and later lent it to The Sixth Floor Museum at Dealey Plaza, where it was displayed for 12 years.

The winning bidder for the window was from the Netherlands and had only

six purchases on eBay. He placed his bid 22 seconds before the auction ended.

"Unfortunately, on certain high-profile items, this can happen," said Hani Durzy, a spokesman for eBay. "It's unfortunate. It's also illegal and considered fraud."

The listed seller, McLane's nephew Christian, initially required bidders to have at least three eBay transactions on their record and no worse than a 97 percent approval rating. He later increased that to 20 transactions and an

approval rating no worse than 98 percent.

With six transactions, the winner didn't qualify. But by bidding late, there wasn't time for the seller to cancel the bid.

Byrd said that the next step is to work down the list of qualified bidders to see if any want to purchase the window. That could take a day or two.



Lawmaker: Buy a hybrid, get a rebate

AUSTIN — Texans who buy hybrid vehicles could get a 10 percent rebate on their sales tax under legislation proposed Friday.

"This state must confront the serious challenge of reducing vehicle emissions — not to mention reducing our dependence on foreign oil," said Rep. Dwayne Bohac, a Houston Republican who made the proposal along with Rep. Rafael Anchia, D-Dallas. "This bill allows us to kill two birds with one stone by creating an incentive to drive more fuel efficient vehicles."

Buyers of hybrid engine or alternative fuel vehicles would be eligible for the rebate based on emissions ratings. Any vehicle that is rated in the Environmental Protection Agency's Green Vehicle Guide as emitting less than 0.45 pounds of car-

bon dioxide per mile, or averaging 44 miles to the gallon, would qualify.

The measure also includes a 7 percent rebate on vehicles that emit less than 0.45 but not more than 0.55 pounds of carbon dioxide per mile or average 36 to 43 miles per gallon.

"Incentivizing people in their pocketbooks is the best way to get their attention," Anchia said.

While people may not believe the scientific claims about global warming, "I know they believe in getting some money back off of their sales tax and also saving some money on gasoline. It's hitting people on the pocket book pretty hard."

Carbon dioxide is the chief gas blamed for global warming. The United States produces about a quarter of the world's greenhouse gases.

While the Bush admin-

istration has acknowledged the effects of global warming on the environment, President Bush has rejected mandatory controls on carbon dioxide.

When released into the air through vehicle emissions, carbon dioxide becomes trapped in the atmosphere, thereby heating the earth's surface, many scientists believe.

"A growing number of Texans consider air quality and its impact on the health of their families a crucial concern," Anchia said.

5 firefighters injured in blaze that guts building in Kansas City, Mo.

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Five firefighters were injured Friday morning while battling a blaze at a 1920s building that once housed vaudeville productions and showings of silent films.

The firefighters were hurt when there was a flashover inside the building, Battalion Chief Joe Vitale said. A flashover occurs when the contents of a room heat to their ignition point and simultaneously burst into flames.

One of the firefighters suffered burns on about 30 percent of his body, Vitale said. Four were still hospitalized late Friday afternoon, while a fifth had been released.

None of the firefighters' injuries were believed to be life-threatening, Fire Chief Smoky Dyer said.

The two-story building houses a Kennedy's Bar & Grill, a French bistro, a bridal shop and a clothing store. There were apartments on the second floor.

Tracey Snell, a barista at the French bistro, said the fire appeared to start at Kennedy's. No one was there at the time. She alerted colleagues and called 911.

"Next thing you knew, all hell broke loose," said Rosalind Morris, a co-worker.

The building was gutted but was still standing Friday afternoon. It opened in 1924 and had included a playhouse that later housed movie and theater productions.

Police: 7 killed in early morning fire

WAYNESBURG, Pa. (AP) — Fire swept through a house in southwestern Pennsylvania early Saturday, killing six young children and a woman and injuring one other person, state police said.

The fire broke out shortly before 3:30 a.m. and several people in the house were able to escape, state Trooper Brian Burden said.

Police said the young victims were four girls ages 4, 9, 7 and 10, and two boys ages 2 and 3. Authorities had not determined the relationship between the children and the woman, who was 26.

Another adult was flown to a Pittsburgh hospital, Burden said.

Police found multiple heating sources inside the home, but could not immediately determine what caused the blaze, he said.

The 1 1/2-story wood frame house was seriously damaged, but part of the roof was still up while authorities investigated in frigid weather.

Crews were struggling to remove the bodies because of the building's unsafe condition, Burden said.

Waynesburg is about 35 miles southwest of Pittsburgh.

Bald Britney Spears sits for new ink at Los Angeles tattoo parlor

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Britney Spears appeared in a tattoo parlor in the San Fernando Valley with her head shaved completely bald.

Video on KABC-TV showed the newly shorn Spears with tiny tattoos on the back of her neck as she sits Friday night for a new tattoo — a pair of red and pink lips.

"She just wanted something real small on her wrist, something dainty," Max Gott, the tattoo artist at Body and Soul in Sherman Oaks, told the TV station. "She got some cute little lips on her wrist."

Derrick Snell, who works at the tattoo parlor, said Spears showed up without notice and stayed for about 90 minutes as about 60 fans, photographers and gawkers gathered outside.

"She seemed fine," Snell said. "I didn't

really notice (the hairdo) at first, she had a hood on when she showed up."

The appearance came the same day as reports on TV and Web sites that Spears, who has drawn criticism for her recent partying and sloppy behavior, had briefly checked into rehab.

Larry Rudolph, Spears' manager, couldn't be reached for comment.

Syndicated entertainment TV show "Extra" first reported that Spears had

entered a treatment facility. Celebrity Web site TMZ.com then said the singer had entered a treatment center but had checked out one day later. Neither revealed their sources.

People magazine's Web site, citing "a source," said Spears had gone in and out of rehab, and identified the facility as Eric Clapton's Crossroads center in Antigua, in the Caribbean.

"Access Hollywood" then said the reports weren't true, but didn't cite a source.

A woman who answered the phone at Crossroads told The Associated Press that she couldn't confirm or deny anyone's presence at the facility.

Hank Williams Jr. files for divorce from 4th wife

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Hank Williams Jr. has filed for divorce from his fourth wife, Mary Jane, whom he married 16 years ago, he said in a statement Friday.

"Today is one of the toughest days in my life," the country singer said in a statement sent to The Associated Press by his publicist, Kirt Webster. "All families experience difficulties; I hope everyone will respect our privacy during this time."

It wasn't clear whether Mary Jane Williams had retained an attorney. A number for the couple's home in Paris, Tenn., is not listed.

The pair have two teenage children; the singer has three children from previous marriages.

Mary Jane Williams is a former model who met the singer after a concert in 1985, and they married in July 1990.

Williams, 57, is the son of country legend Hank Williams.

Big environmental fight pits industries against each other

HOUSTON — The state's most contested environmental fight in decades is a legal and political dispute over 19 proposed coal-fired electric power plants in East and South Texas, with rivals accusing each other of spending millions to confuse Texans about the plants' dangers and benefits.

Dallas-based TXU Power wants to build 11 of the plants and says they will lower utility costs and ensure a sufficient power supply for the future. Environmentalists, business groups and natural gas companies say the plants would generate so much pollution that the state would fail to meet federal clean-air standards, jeopardizing millions in federal funding.

Gov. Rick Perry issued an executive order "fast-tracking" the usual 18-month hearing process for such plants. The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality already has granted permits for four of the plants, and is expected to decide on the remainder within the next six months.

Administrative hearings on six of TXU's proposed plants are scheduled to begin Wednesday and continue for about two weeks. The hearing judge will then make a recommendation to TCEQ by April 23, and TCEQ officials will then decide whether to approve the plants.

With the clock ticking, plant opponents in the Legislature have lined up behind a nonbinding resolution sponsored by state Rep. Charles "Doc" Anderson, a Republican whose Waco-area district would be surrounded by nine of the plants. Anderson's resolution would ask the TCEQ to impose a 180-day moratorium on applications for pulverized coal-fired power plant permits. The resolution is now pending in the House Committee on Environmental Regulation, which is chaired by state Rep. Dennis Bonnen, an Angleton Republican usually at odds with environmentalists.

Both sides have launched expensive advertising campaigns and hired consultants and lobbyists to persuade Texans and their elected representatives.

"It's one of the biggest

environmental issues of the (legislative) session," said Ken Kramer, the director of the Lone Star chapter of the Sierra Club.

Pulverized coal plants crush and burn coal to generate steam, which is used to turn the turbines that generate electricity. Environmentalists consider such plants to be among the most hazardous to the environment and to residents' health, preferring natural gas, solar, or wind generation.

TXU, which plans to spend about \$10 billion on its new plants, has said it intends to use low-sulfur coal from the Powder River Basin in Wyoming, which makes the plants more environmentally friendly.

The company also says it will spend \$2 billion on emission-reducing technology and will offset any increase in emissions with reductions at older plants.

Kramer said even the best technology for coal isn't good enough.

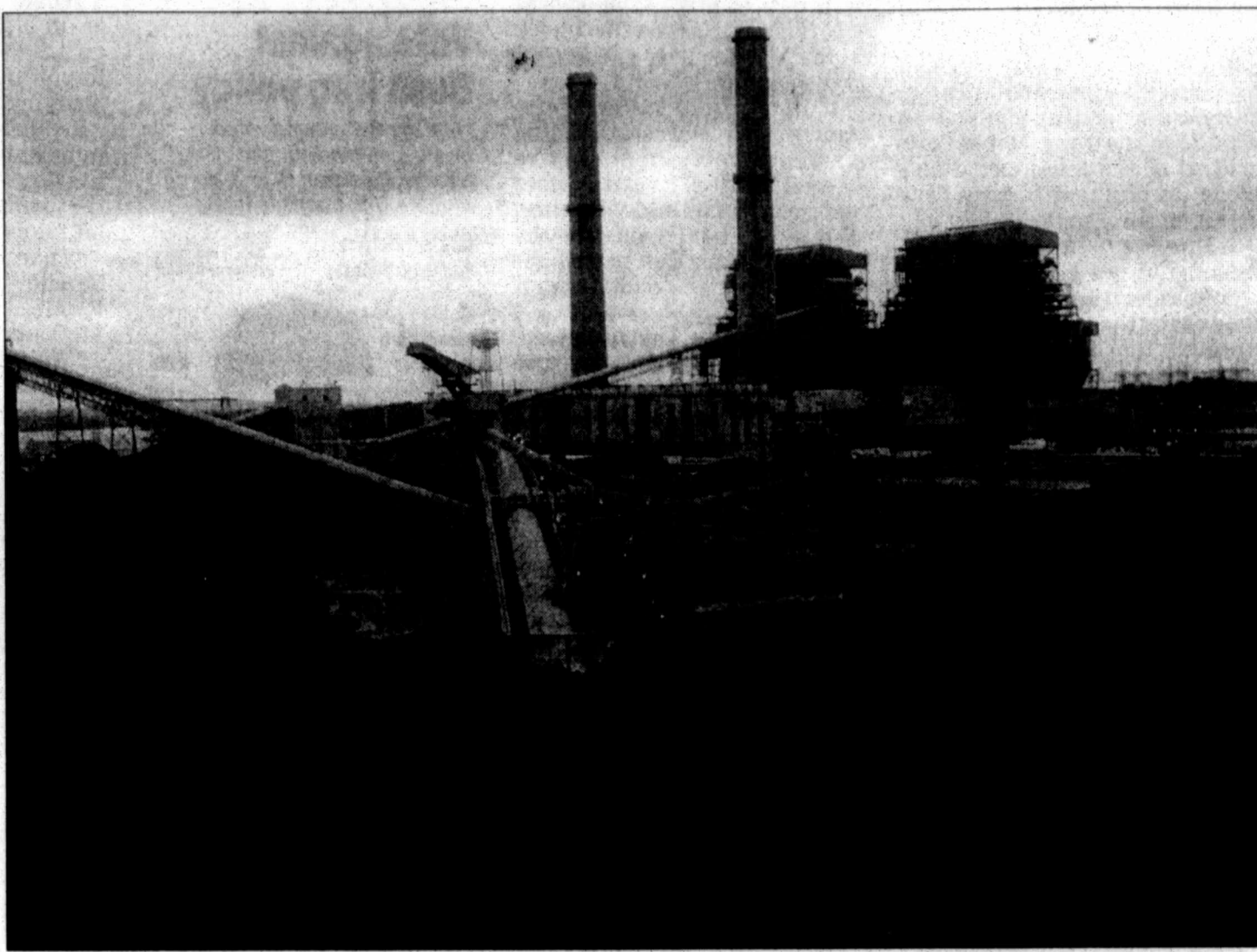
"Probably what they're proposing is better than the old outdated technology, but it's not what we consider to be the best available technology," he said. "We don't really buy into the 'clean coal' concept that some other groups do, and we think it's a shortsighted way of approaching it."

TXU spokeswoman Kim Morgan said plant opponents are either misinformed or lying. Morgan said TXU officials sent a letter to Environmental Defense last week, asking the group to pull a television advertisement the company called "egregiously false."

The ad accused TXU of building plants without modern pollution controls.

"We can have educated discussions and debates about important issues," Morgan said. "And we can do that in a very productive manner. But to start using scare tactics and to purposely mislead the public is taking that a little too far. You're talking about the energy future of Texas here."

But opponents say the truth is scary enough. Pulverized coal-fired power plants are inherently dirty and contribute to health problems and global warming, they said, and those proposed for Texas would damage efforts to help the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex

meet federal air-quality standards.

It could also push Waco and perhaps Austin below those standards as well.

If cities do not meet federal air standards, the federal government could cut off some of its \$3 billion in annual highway funding to Texas and impose severe restrictions on residential and commercial energy use.

Because those restrictions could disrupt business and industry, several business groups — like the Texas Business for Clean Air group — have joined the opposition to TXU and the coal plants.

But the most active opponents to the plants are environmental groups, health groups and coal's chief competitor, the natural gas industry — with the latter supplying much of the money behind the fight.

Federal officials are paying attention as well. Sen. Jeff Bingaman, D-N.M., the chairman of the Energy and Natural Resources committee, and Sen. Barbara Boxer, D-Calif., the chairwoman of

Senate set to vote Saturday on Iraq troop buildup

WASHINGTON—Determined to check President Bush, Democratic critics of the Iraq war hope a strong House vote critical of the administration's troop buildup will pay dividends in the Senate.

Senate Republicans, however, insisted on an alternative that would reject any reduction in money for the troops, making it unlikely that Democrats would prevail in a test vote planned Saturday.

"Americans deserve to know whether their senator stands with the president and his plan to deepen our military commitment in Iraq, or with the overwhelming majority of Americans who oppose this escalation," Majority Leader Harry Reid said Friday.

Ahead of the Senate session,

Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice visited Baghdad to check on the new security crackdown in the capital.

"If in fact militias decide to stand down and stop killing innocent Iraqis ... that can't be a bad thing," Rice told reporters traveling with her. "But how the Iraqis use the breathing space that that might provide is what's really important."

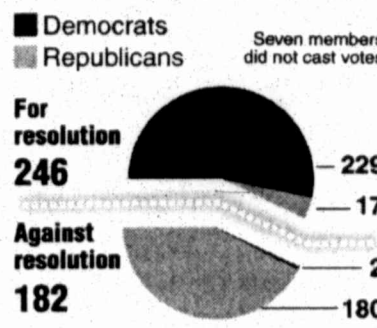
The House on Friday passed, by a 246-182 vote, a measure stating opposition to Bush's decision to send 21,500 more troops to Iraq.

The nonbinding resolution was a symbolic rebuke of a wartime president who has lost favor with the public.

Sixty-three percent of people surveyed oppose Bush's decision to send more troops, although support for the president's plan has risen in the past

few weeks from 26 percent to 35 percent, according to an AP-Ipsos poll.

Senate Democrats tried earlier in February to push their own resolution, but Republicans succeeded in blocking debate.

Republicans wanted senators to be able to vote on a proposal by Sen. Judd Gregg, R-N.H., that would promise not to cut off funds for troops in combat. "That remains a demand of Senate Republicans," said Republican leader Mitch McConnell, R-Ky.

"We think it's fundamentally fair and totally relevant to the issue at hand."

Several Republican senators wary of the president's Iraq plans were expected to side with Democrats, saying they were frustrated that Senate leaders could not agree on the ground rules for such an important debate.

Still, Democrats were not expected to get the 60 votes

needed to move ahead. But Reid, D-Nev., said the vote would help determine where senators stood.

A no vote, he said, is a vote "to give the president a green light to escalate the war."

In the House, supporters of the nonbinding measure included 229 Democrats and 17 Republicans.

Fewer GOP lawmakers defected than Democrats had hoped and the White House and its allies had feared.

Two Democrats — Reps. Gene Taylor, D-Miss., and Jim Marshall, D-Ga. — joined the 180 Republicans in opposition.

Bush has said passage of the measure will not deter him from proceeding with the deployment of an additional 21,500 troops, designed primarily to quell sectarian violence in heavily populated Baghdad.

Marine 'truly sorry' for kidnapping

CAMP PENDLETON, Calif. — A Marine who pleaded guilty to kidnapping and conspiracy apologized Friday to his country, the Marine Corps and the family of an Iraqi man his squad killed.

"I can honestly and truly say that I am sorry that I did what I did," said Lance Cpl. Robert B. Pennington at his sentencing hearing. "Saying I feel bad just does not begin to describe it."

Pennington, 22, pleaded guilty Tuesday to kidnapping and conspiracy. He was part of an eight-member squad accused of kidnapping and murdering Hashim Ibrahim Awad, 52, last April in the Iraqi town of Hamdania. A murder charge will be dismissed, provided Pennington sticks to the terms in a pretrial agreement requiring him to testify for the government and remain on good behavior. He was the sixth member of the squad to plead guilty in the case, though one of those troops withdrew his plea ahead of his sentencing.

The serviceman was interviewed by his civilian attorney, David Brahm. He did not take the stand and was not sworn in, meaning he could not be cross examined.

Describing his mission in Hamdania as "fuzzy at best and convoluted at worst," Pennington said that as a Marine he had been taught to be aggressive, to take the initiative and to take the fight to the enemy.

"As callous as it sounds, it's guilty until proven otherwise," Pennington said. "You have to make the assumption that unless they show you otherwise, treat them as thought they are your enemy."

The Marine said he believed that eventually his squad was going to get attacked in Hamdania and the men decided to take pre-emptive action. Pennington said the squad initially went after a man they knew to be high up in the insurgency, but when they couldn't find him they killed Awad instead to "send a message."

Under questioning from

the military judge, Pennington said his squad had no legal justification for dragging Awad

tencing Thursday, the Navy medic who patrolled with the Marines testified that

Judge dismisses lawsuit against architect, others over drownings

FORT WORTH (AP) — Calling four tourists' drownings at a downtown park a "terrible, unfortunate tragedy," a judge threw out a lawsuit after deciding Friday that the architects, contractors and private foundation were not liable.

State District Judge Len Wade said his review of the law, along with evidence presented in the legal filings, indicate that Texas law would not support any verdict favorable to the plaintiffs.

Jenks Garrett, the families' local attorney, said they were disappointed but not shocked by the ruling and will file an appeal, the Fort Worth Star-Telegram reported in its online edition Friday.

Chicago residents Myron Dukes, 39; his daughter, Lauren, 8; his son, Christopher, 13; and a family friend, Juanitricia Deadmon, 11, drowned at the Fort Worth Water Gardens in June 2004. Investigators said one of the girls apparently slipped into one swirling pool and the others died trying to save her.

Not long after the incident, the families sued the city of Fort Worth and a number of companies involved with the water park, including the Amon G. Carter Foundation, which paid for the \$6 million park and donated it to the city in 1974. None of the park's pools are meant for swimming.

Fort Worth settled out of court with the families for \$750,000. The city's settlement did not include an admission of liability and allowed it to avoid a long legal dispute.

The victims were members of Chicago's Antioch Missionary Baptist Church and were in town attending a religious convention. Some children intended to dangle their feet in the cool water at the 5.4-acre park when one girl slipped into the 9-foot-deep Active Pool.

In the Active Pool, water flows down several long steps, creating waterfalls that empty into the pool of water that is recirculated through a drain at the bottom. Smaller, dry steps over the waterfalls lead down to the edge of the pool.

Prompted by an engineering firm's report released a month after the drownings, the City Council approved nearly \$3 million in safety improvements, which are to be completed next month, along with a memorial to the victims.

Chippendales dancers arrested during show in Lubbock

LUBBOCK (AP) — Police arrested eight Chippendales dancers and three others during the first of three sold out performances Friday, accusing them of violating the city's adult entertainment ordinance.

Officers raided Jake's Sports Cafe about 30 minutes after the show started and the venue was closed. They arrested the venue's manager, the show's promoter and the dancers' manager along with the dancers in front of a disgruntled crowd of women.

Shortly after, several hundred women began chanting, "Bring them back, bring them back" and "the City Council sucks, the City Council sucks."

Authorities say the dancers violated a city ordinance which bars contact between entertainers and patrons. Lt. Greg Stevens of the Lubbock Police said the dancers were simulating sexual positions with audience members.

Jake's Sports Bar owner, Scott Stephenson, said his establishment did everything as planned to abide by the city ordinance.

"Comparatively, it's a classy production," said Greg Jackson, Jake's Sports Cafe booking agent, adding that Chippendale dancers do not take off all their clothes.

Stephenson said he feels the police were there to shut them down.

Police says they intend to get an arrest warrant for Stephenson.

Texas family sues ConAgra over salmonella

WAXAHACHIE (AP) — A Texas couple sued ConAgra Foods Inc. on Friday, saying their two children got sick after eating peanut butter linked to a salmonella outbreak.

The suit filed by Dr. Charles Osborn and Brie Osborn in state district court in Ellis County says that their 5-year-old daughter and 2-year-old son got painful gastroenteritis after eating the peanut butter.

About 300 people in 39 states have fallen ill from salmonella since August. Federal health investigators said they suspect Peter Pan peanut butter and certain batches of Wal-Mart's Great Value house brand — both manufactured by ConAgra.

This week Omaha, Neb.-based ConAgra and the Food and Drug Administration announced a product recall. Customers nationwide were told to throw out jars with a product code on the lid beginning with "2111."

Another lawsuit against ConAgra over the salmonel-

la outbreak linked to its peanut butter was filed Friday in U.S. District Court in Kansas City.

ConAgra spokeswoman Melissa Baron said Friday that the company had not yet received the Osborn lawsuit and could not comment.

The Osborns' attorney, Clay Lewis Jenkins, said that "their primary goal is to find out what the company knew and when they knew it."

The lawsuit seeks damages for medical bills, pain and suffering and exemplary damages. The lawsuit caps the damages at \$75,000 for each child, he said.

"We wanted to be clear this is not about someone trying to get rich off of peanut butter. This is about someone wanting to protect their kids and the kids around them," Jenkins said.

The Osborn family bought the Peter Pan peanut butter with the "2111" product code at a Waxahachie grocery store, according to the lawsuit.

Charles Osborn said that his children had high fevers, stomach cramps, diarrhea and vomiting. He said his daughter was sick for several days in January, and both children were ill in February.

"I want the answer: How long did they know, and what steps did they take to prevent it?" Osborn said. "I know that my children were exposed to something that could have killed them."

Salmonella sickens about 40,000 people a year in the U.S. and kills about 600. No deaths have been reported in the ConAgra peanut butter-related cases.

Apple CEO lambasts teacher unions

AUSTIN (AP) — Apple Inc. CEO Steve Jobs lambasted teacher unions Friday, claiming no amount of technology in the classroom would improve public schools until principals could fire bad teachers.

Jobs compared schools to businesses with principals serving as CEOs.

"What kind of person could you get to run a small business if you told them that when they came in they couldn't get rid of people that they thought weren't any good?" he asked to loud applause during an education reform conference.

"Not really great ones because if you're really smart you go, 'I can't win.'"

In a rare joint appearance, Jobs shared the stage with competitor Michael Dell, founder and CEO of Dell Inc. Both spoke to the gathering about the potential for bringing technological advances to classrooms.

"I believe that what is wrong with our schools in this nation is that they have become unionized in the worst possible way," Jobs said.

"This unionization and lifetime employment of K-12 teachers is off-the-charts crazy."

At various pauses, the audience applauded enthusiastically. Dell sat quietly with his hands folded in his lap.

"Apple just lost some business in this state, I'm sure," Jobs said.

Dell responded that unions were created because "the employer was treating his employees unfairly and that was not good."

A fine declarer is always on the lookout for an unlikely lie of the cards when he plays a contract that appears to be a cinch. It is easy enough to do well when suits break normally; the trick is to do well when suits break abnormally.

Here is a typical example. South was in three notrump, and West led a spade. Declarer ducked twice and took the third round with the ace. He then played the ace of clubs, on

which East showed out, and the hand collapsed.

What had appeared a moment before to be a shoo-in for 10 tricks — seven clubs and three aces — changed drastically when East failed to follow to the first club. South struggled a while, but eventually went down two.

Had South taken the proper precautions to guard against a 4-0 club break, however, he could not have failed to make the contract. As soon as dummy came down, he should have realized that only a 4-0 club division could defeat him, and his sole concern should have been to guard against that possibility.

There was a simple way to do this. After both opponents followed to the third spade, proving that the opposing spades were divided 4-3, he should have led a low club from his hand. The worst that could happen then would be that the defense would take three spades and a club to hold him to three notrump.

It is true that in most hands this precautionary measure would have cost South an overtrick or two — since the clubs were much more likely to be divided 3-1 or 2-2 — but this minor investment to assure making a vulnerable game was well worth the price.

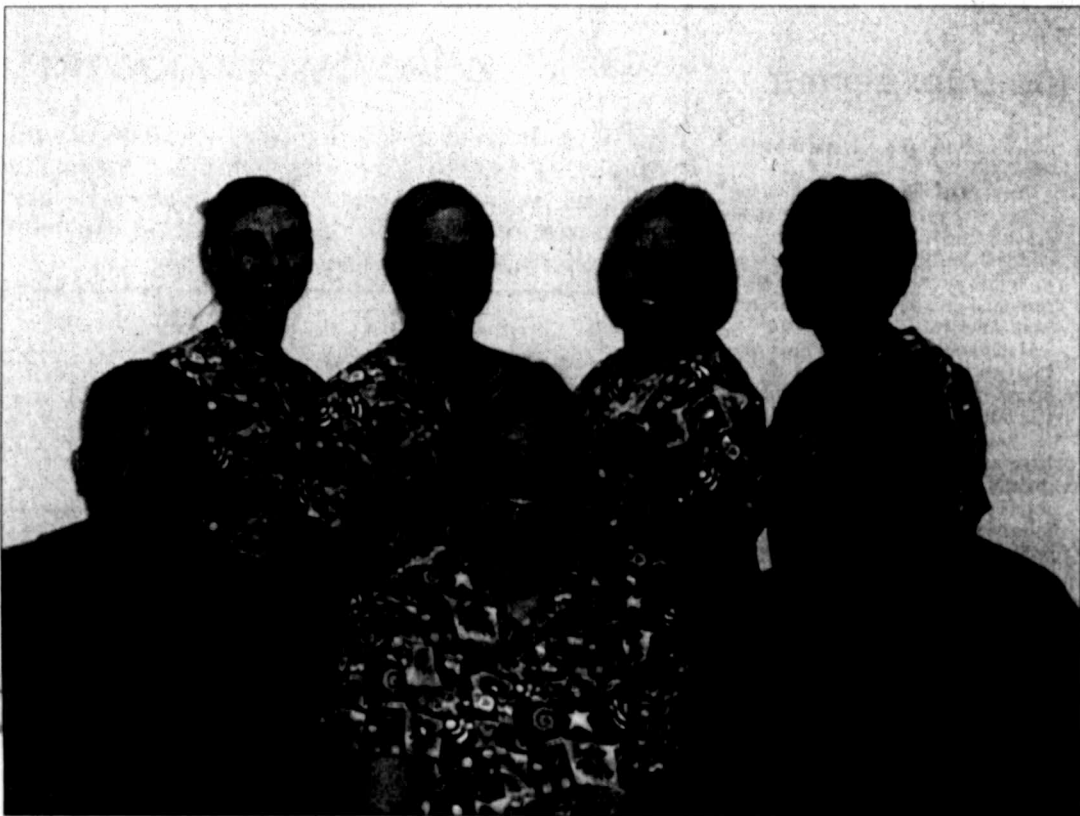

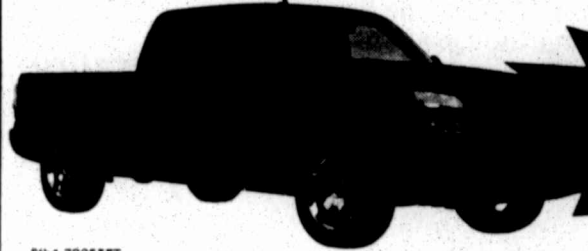

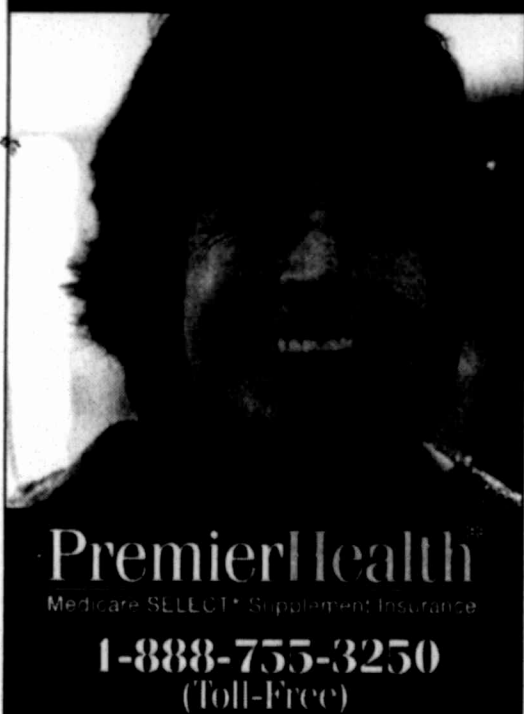

Ford exec: U.S. auto industry has good future

SAN ANTONIO — A Ford Motor Co. executive came Friday to the home of Toyota Motor Corp.'s newest U.S. assembly plant to deliver a message: Domestic automakers remain an important part of the economy.

"It concerns me that too many people downplay the importance of the homegrown auto industry," Mark Fields, Ford's president of the Americas, told the Greater San Antonio Chamber of Commerce on the same day that news organizations reported the company will miss cost reduction targets and that employees had misgivings about the turnaround effort.

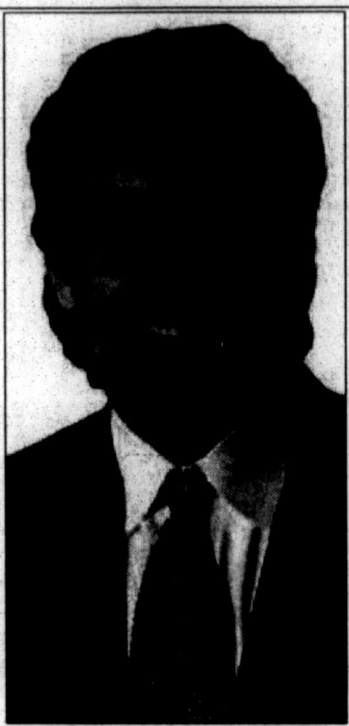
He said even with job cuts announced by Ford and other domestic auto companies, the American auto industry will continue to employ 300,000 people in the United States. Ford expects to cut about 38,000 blue collar jobs by fall and 10,000 salaried jobs this quarter.

Toyota opened an assembly plant for its Tundra trucks here last year, helping intensify the competition for the truck market Ford leads.

Ford advertisements in Texas are emphasizing the company's community involvement here even as civic and business leaders have celebrated the arrival of the Toyota plant in a city that is heavily dependent on U.S. military installations. The mayor of San Antonio had a news conference when he bought a San Antonio-built Toyota Tundra earlier this month.

"We are American at our core, and we never

forget that," Fields said. "Our profits stay right here in America."

In an interview with The Associated Press after the speech, he said Ford continues to offer better features and models, like its new Super Duty truck, but it is also proud that as an American company, it brings additional benefits to the U.S. economy.

"We can never just rest on our laurels about just being American. You have to have a good product," he said.

Ford, which like other domestic automakers is suffering declining marketshare, has been trying to remake its product line to become less dependent on higher-margin trucks and sport utility vehicles because consumer tastes have shifted toward more small cars and alternative-fuel vehicles, Fields said.

Persistent high gasoline prices and concern about dependence on foreign oil have "permanently affected customer's mind-sets," he said.

Even if the strategy turns domestic auto sales around, analysts say U.S. automakers may have trouble making money at it because per-car profits are lower on cars and car-based crossover vehicles than on SUVs and trucks.

Dow Jones and The Detroit News reported Friday that an internal employee report showed the company hit its material cost reduction target in January but will miss its target for February and March by a wide margin. Fewer than half the employees said they were confident in Ford's long-term success, the reports said, citing the internal memo.

Fields told the AP that company executives were

sharing a lot of information with employees right now, given the changes at the company.

"The good news is the trend we show is that the morale surveys are heading in the right direction," he said. "You'd expect it to be tepid right now."

Fields said he believes that better product appeal and reducing costs will help improve the margins despite the highly competitive car market.

In the next week or so, company officials will know how many of its salaried workers have accepted buyout offers. He said Friday he was unsure how close the company was to meeting its goal of 10,000 this quarter.

"People really don't make their decision until right before" the deadline, he said.

But he said he's confident the company will not lose too many key workers in areas like design, which Ford is banking on to revamp the business.

"We've been very careful in retention efforts for the key folks. We have so much bench strength" the buyouts shouldn't hurt the company, he said.

As a reminder to the motoring public, the Auto Theft Prevention Authority and the Midessa Metro Auto Theft Task Force encourages and promotes the H.E.A.T. program to all Texas registered vehicles. The Help End Auto Theft (H.E.A.T.) program is a statewide registration program that helps law enforcement officials identify stolen vehicles.

At no charge, any vehicle owner in Texas can obtain a special decal for the back of their vehicle window that authorizes law enforcement officers to stop the vehicle and verify ownership between 1 a.m. and 5 a.m. anywhere in Texas.







Daytona 500 sends Gordon to the back

Gordon's car fails inspection

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. — Just when it looked like racing would snatch the spotlight from the cheaters at Daytona, Jeff Gordon's winning car failed inspection.

Gordon, who won the second of Thursday's two 150-mile qualifying races, now will start the Daytona 500 in 42nd place.

NASCAR inspectors said his Chevrolet was almost an inch too low but blamed it on a part failure — not cheating. He was not stripped of the victory.

"We feel it was unintentional, and actually fairly unsafe," said NASCAR competition director Robin Pemberton. "We feel that it was a part failure, and we feel that it was unintentionally done. I think it would be marginal at best if there was any advantage."

"I am 100 percent sure this is unintentional." NASCAR said it believed a mechanic made a mistake when the shocks were installed before the race.

Gordon's was the sixth team in three days to be caught with technical violations. The earlier problems led to expulsions, suspensions, fines and loss of championship points — and the sea-

son hasn't even begun.

The most serious of the violations was committed by the new team of Michael Waltrip, whose Toyota failed inspection after an illegal substance was found in the gas line. His crew chief and

team director were suspended indefinitely and kicked out of Daytona International Speedway. Waltrip was docked 100 driver and car owner points.

That was on the heels of lesser violations by the teams of Matt

Kenseth, Kasey Kahne, Elliott Sadler and Scott Riggs, whose crew chiefs all were fined and suspended. All drivers also lost points.

Stewart wants Daytona 500

— As Tony Stewart sat in front of a TV watching the Indianapolis Colts celebrate their Super Bowl victory, he thought about the burden lifted from quarterback Peyton Manning.

"I sent him a text message right after the game was over," Stewart recalled. "I said, 'You got yours, finally. Now it's time for me to go get my Super Bowl.'"

That's Sunday's Daytona 500.

The two-time NASCAR champion is 0-8 in the race that every NASCAR driver wants, and one that has been very tough — or impossible — for some of the sport's biggest names to win.

It took the late Dale Earnhardt 20 tries, while Darrell Waltrip finally got to Victory Circle in his 17th attempt. Rusty Wallace never won it, and Mark Martin will get is 22nd try Sunday.

Stewart already has 10 victories on Daytona International Speedway's 2.5-mile oval, including the non-points Budweiser Shootout last Saturday and his 150-mile qualifying race Thursday.

This week's victories — and the ease with which he got them — have made Stewart the heavy favorite to win. Three-time 500 winner Jeff Gordon, who won Thursday's other qualifying race, agreed.

"He looks like he's just been hooked up," Gordon said. "The thing is, you need a great car, a little luck and a lot of confidence to win this race. It looks like Tony has all of that right now."

But Stewart, whose best finish was second in 2004, has been the guy to beat before.

"I'm excited where we are starting the race," said Stewart, who will start third, on the inside of the second row in the 43-car field. "Having had the best car in the past

and not being able to finish it off kind of leads me to think it's one lap at a time for 200 laps on Sunday."

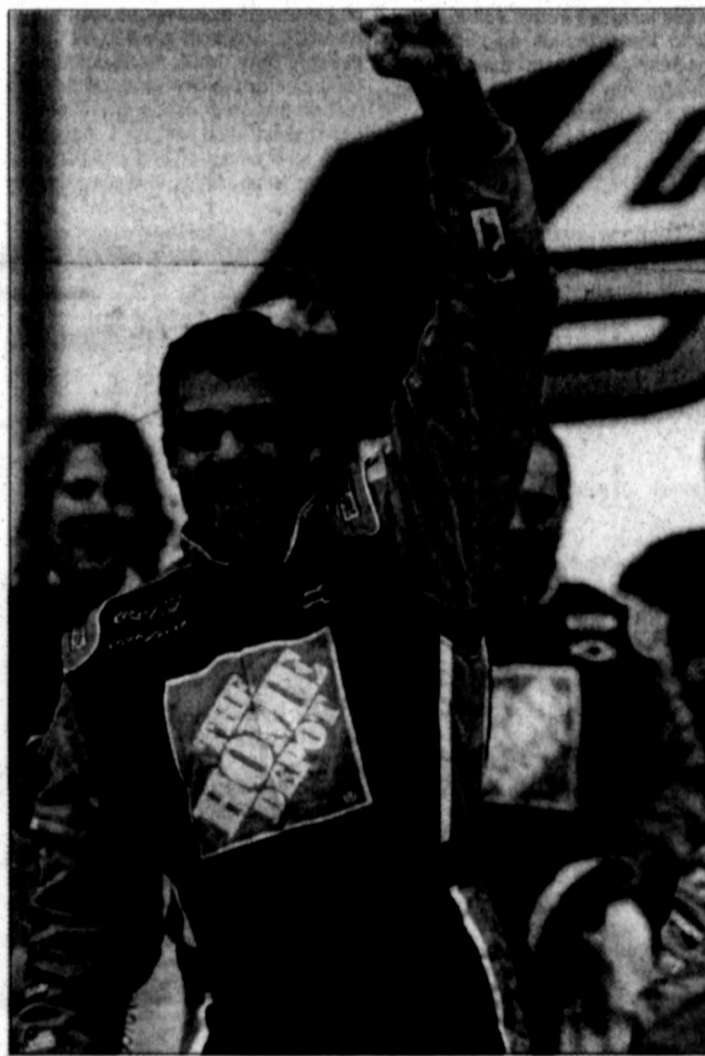
"I feel like this is the best opportunity that we've had so far to win the 500," Stewart said. "This is definitely the most momentum we've had going into it."

Stewart just missed making NASCAR's 10-man Chase for the championship last year, but won three of the 10 Chase events. Over the winter, he won a pair of midget races in Fort Wayne, Ind., and the sprint car Chili Bowl in Tulsa, Okla.

Even crew chief Greg Zipadelli, who has been with Stewart since he came to Cup in 1999, is whispering in his driver's ear about how this could be the year.

"I'm superstitious about everything, and I kind of

The casinos were packed, traffic on the Strip slowed and brokers

were asking thousands of dollars in anticipation of the first All-Star game held outside an NBA city.

"I think it's a good match," Bryant said. "Basketball is the greatest show in the world. Everybody loves watching, and what better place to have a great show than Las Vegas?"

Still, the NBA still couldn't escape all its problems. The first half of a season that began with the controversial switch

UT's Barnes should know NBA talk comes with territory

AUSTIN — Texas coach Rick Barnes doesn't like what he's hearing these days.

Not from the Longhorns' fans, who chant "One More Year!" hoping freshman Kevin Durant will put off the NBA another season. And not from reporters who assume Durant will leave Texas and are debating whether he should be the No. 1 pick in the draft.

Barnes' message: Back off. Back at you coach: Lighten up. The fans are having fun and Durant's playmaking has put unranked Texas on the sports highlight shows. College basketball is paying attention to Texas, a solid team contending for the Big 12 title, mostly because of its spectacular freshman.

The kid has been so good he's among the favorites for national player of the year honors and many assume he'll turn pro.

If the fans want to chant "One More Year," Barnes should be happy they're coming to the games. He's complained in the past about small and quiet crowds at big games, and there's no doubt Durant is putting butts in the Erwin Center this season. Now fans want to see his lanky arms launch 3-pointers and snag rebounds in person before he's gone.

Before this turns into a complete smack-back of Barnes, let's be fair: The coach may just be trying to take some of the pressure off an 18-year-old kid who so far hasn't gotten caught up in the hype of his own game.

Barnes complained that reporters — some of whom the coach said "have no

idea what the hell is going on" — keep asking Durant about the NBA.

And he delivered this warning shot: According to Barnes, Durant said he won't do any more interviews if the question keeps popping up.

Watch Durant score 37 points in a Big 12 game and he appears to be a selfless player who wants to share the credit with his teammates, who in turn look like they enjoy playing with him and don't begrudge his celebrity.

Texas insiders say they doubt Durant is thinking about the NBA right now even though he could be only a few months shy of an enormous NBA salary and even bigger endorsement riches.

That's believable. Most 18-year-olds only have a couple of things on their mind, and they don't usually involve thinking beyond next weekend.

"It really amazes me that people want

to talk about this right now because from the time the Final Four is over with to the draft is a month," Barnes said, referring to the April 29 deadline for underclassmen to declare for the draft.

"That's when it becomes a story," Barnes said.

Actually, it became a story when the NBA imposed an age minimum that all but forced the best high school players to go to college for at least one season.

And by signing Durant to play at Texas, Barnes invited the story to his doorstep. It gets bigger every time Durant lights up another team for 30 points and 10 rebounds.

The genie is out of the bottle and he's had a magical season. Which only leads to more speculation that he'll leave Texas after one season.

"You couldn't stage this stuff, even if you wanted to," Pemberton said.

"Are you serious? That sucks. I'm mad about that right now," he said with a look of disbelief on his face.

Asked what the penalty should be, Gordon wasn't sure.

"I mean, what do I think it should be? It's whatever NASCAR decides for it to be. That's what it should be.

feel, the way things are lining up, like maybe we'll have the opportunity to get it done this year," Stewart said.

A native of Indiana, Stewart started in open-wheel racing but never won his beloved Indianapolis 500 before moving to stock cars. In August, 2005, he finally got to kiss the strip of bricks at the Indy finish

line after winning the Brickyard race.

That was a watershed moment, but the overwhelming satisfaction didn't last as long as he thought it would.

"And, if I win Daytona, I haven't won a race yet at Darlington, Talladega, Vegas and California. It's getting those other four tracks and being the only guy who has won on all the tracks we run on. That would be cool."

Stewart shut his eyes, rubbed his stubble of

beard and leaned back, thinking for a moment.

"But then Indy will come back into play," he added. "There's always going to be something. I'll never be satisfied."

"So don't think that even if I win Daytona and I go on and win California and Darlington and Vegas and Talladega this year that I'll be satisfied. I will be, but then I'll be wanting to win a third championship and catch Jeff at 75 wins and all of that."

Astros rotation spots up for grabs

KISSIMMEE, Fla. — Wandy Rodriguez shakes his head at the notion that he's locked up a starting role in Houston's rotation.

"I've got to really work on it," Rodriguez said Friday after the Astros' first spring training workout.

More than half a dozen pitchers reported to Kissimmee this week with realistic shots at landing the No. 4 or No. 5 spots at the bottom of the rotation. But none of them are sure bets, creating the fiercest competition of the spring at Astros camp.

"That's very healthy," said right hander Chris Sampson, a leading candidate after three sparkling starts in 2006. "You're going to get the best out of everybody and really see what everybody's made of."

The other contenders include:

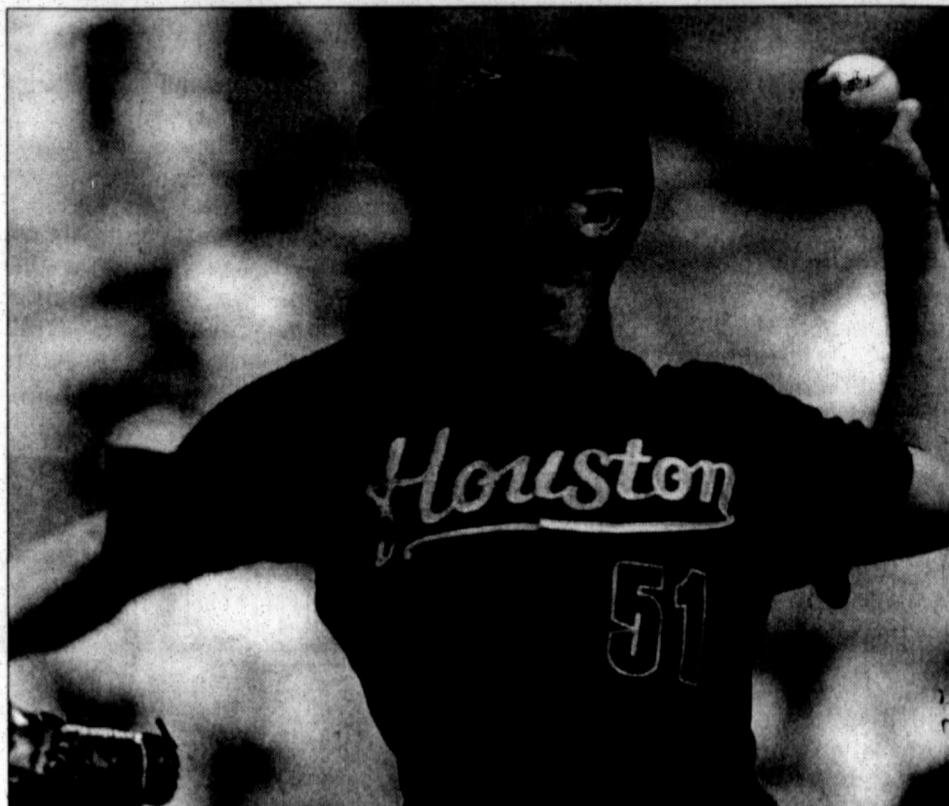
— Brian Moehler, a 10-year veteran who started 21 games for the Florida Marlins last season.

— Fernando Nieve, who started 11 games last season before hyper-extending his right elbow.

— Matt Albers, a 24-year-old who lost his only two major-league starts last season, but went 12-3 in 23 starts in the minors.

— Dave Borkowski, who didn't start a game last season but went 3-2 with a 4.69 ERA in 40 relief appearances.

— Ezequiel Astacio, who went 8-4

with a 4.86 ERA in 17 starts at Triple-A Round Rock in 2006.

Manager Phil Garner will take his time evaluating the candidates and said he probably won't set the rotation until the season begins.

"Some guy may come fast out of the gate and then he may fade," he said. "That's why you don't make the decision until the last day."

The top of the rotation is set with offseason pickups Jason Jennings and Woody Williams backing up

ace Roy Oswalt, who had the NL's lowest ERA in 2006 (2.98).

Rodriguez appears to have two key advantages to land the No. 4 spot — Andy Pettitte's departure to the New York Yankees has left Rodriguez as the Astros' only proven left-handed starter. He's also the most experienced pitcher in contention, with 46 starts over

Bonds' deal approved, Soriano reports early

There's nothing quite like that first morning of spring training. Sun high in the sky, players chatting it up, the familiar pop-pop of soft leather mitts.

Baseball is back!

Barry Bonds' contract was approved at last, while Alfonso Soriano, Daisuke Matsuzaka and Barry Zito were among the big names already in camp Thursday as nine teams opened workouts for pitchers and catchers throughout Florida and Arizona.

"We're jogging from station to station, just to keep things going. There's no walking in baseball," rookie manager Manny Acta of the Washington Nationals said after an enthusiastic first day.

Kerry Wood is sidelined again (after slipping out of a hot tub), and it was a typically busy day at New York Yankees camp. Mike Mussina had some pointed words for oft-injured teammate Carl Pavano, only hours after owner George Steinbrenner's son-in-law and designated successor was arrested.

Bonds finally signed his \$15.8 million, one-year deal Tuesday and it was approved Thursday by the commissioner's office, ending more than two months of wrangling between the slugger and the San Francisco Giants over contract language.

With both sides satisfied, Bonds is scheduled to report Monday to spring training in Scottsdale, Ariz. He is likely to participate in the Giants' first full-squad workout Tuesday.

"I expect he will be ready to go," general manager Brian Sabean said.

The 42-year-old Bonds is 22 homers shy of breaking Hank Aaron's career record of 755.

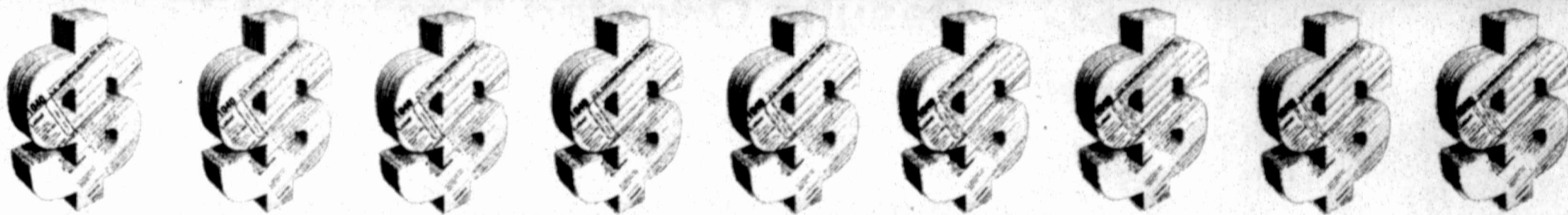
Bonds' new teammate, Zito, raised a few eyebrows when he unveiled a different delivery on his first day with the Giants, making pitching coach Dave Righetti nervous.

Righetti went as far as to say the tweaks Zito made this winter — seen by the team for the first time Thursday — could cause him to lose his dominant curveball and wear down his body.

Mickelson, Harrington tied at Riviera

LOS ANGELES — Phil Mickelson and Padraig Harrington spent Friday afternoon on opposite sides of Riviera as they played vastly different styles. All they had in common when the second round ended was a share of the lead at the Nissan Open.

Mickelson made only one bogey and got hot with his irons on the back nine with back-to-back birdies inside 5 feet and a 3-wood from 287 yards that set up an eagle on the 17th hole, sending him to a 6-under 65 and a chance to win for the second straight week.

Harrington only made two pars on his first 10 holes, a round filled with

brilliance and bogeys, until he finally settled down in the twilight hours off Sunset Boulevard to polish off a 68.

They were at 11-under 131, three shots clear of Charles Howell III, who shot 65.

"Anything in the 60s was really the goal today," said Harrington, playing the Nissan Open for the first time. "I knew going out there I would be a little erratic. I'm still making mental errors here and there, so I put up with that. And I made some birdies to counteract some of the bogeys, which was very nice."

Mickelson hasn't played Riviera since 2001, and he only added this tournament to his schedule at

the last minute to test the newfound confidence in his driver. Two rounds, he hasn't found any flaws.

"I like the way I put the ball in play," Mickelson said. "It feels easy."

He reached all three par 5s in two, none more impressive than the 17th. Coming off his only bogey of the tournament, when he pulled his tee shot into a back bunker on the par 3 16th, Mickelson hit a bullet of a tee shot down the left side of the fairway some 310 yards. He followed that with a hard 3-wood that drew slightly and found the middle of the green, rolling to 15 feet.

It was another command performance, similar to last week when he won at Pebble Beach.

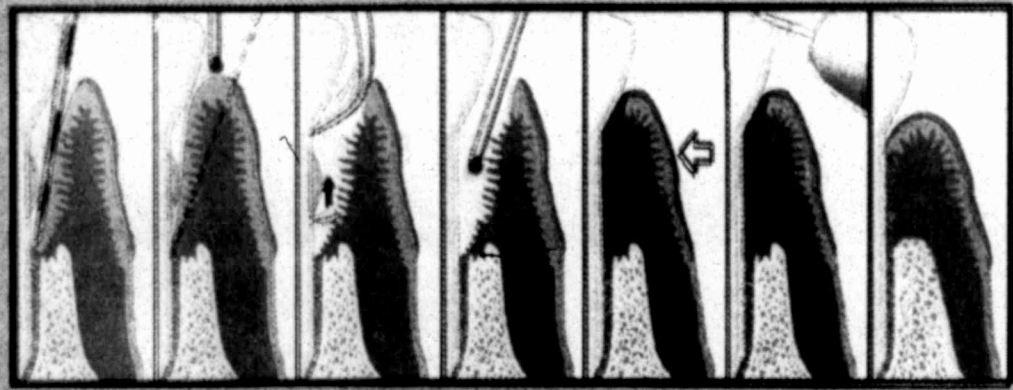

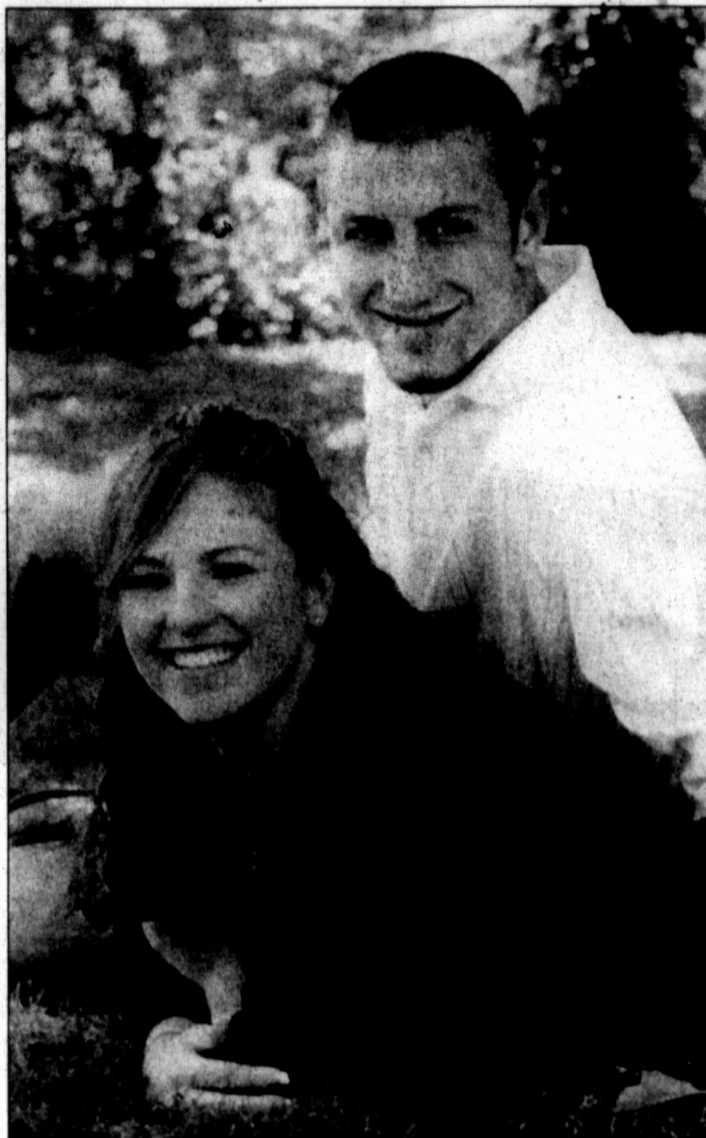

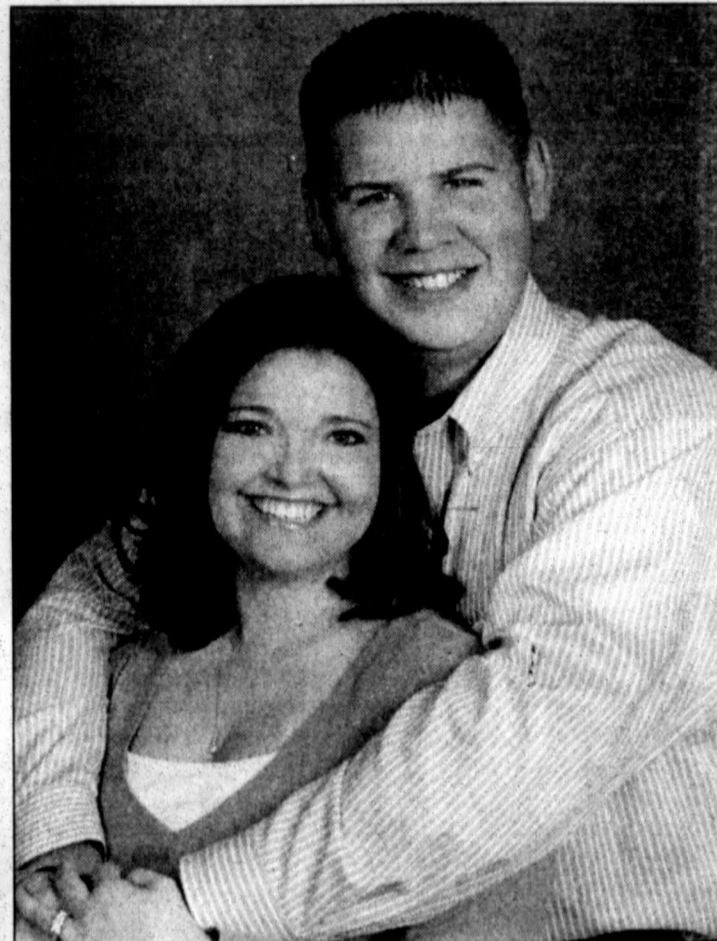

IRS raids tax preparers in seven cities over phone tax refunds

WASHINGTON (AP) — IRS criminal investigators this week conducted raids in seven cities, including three in Texas, to shut down tax preparation businesses suspected of abusing a one-time telephone tax refund. The Internal Revenue Service, in a statement Friday, said some tax-return preparers are requesting thousands of dollars of refunds for clients despite IRS pronouncements that the tax break should be in the \$30 to \$60 range. "We have seen limited but serious instances of abuse, and we've sent in criminal investigators to pursue the matter accordingly," IRS Commissioner Mark W. Everson said. Investigators served search warrants at tax preparation businesses in Atlanta; Dallas, Tyler and Athens,

March 12 deadline set for director nominations in regional boll weevil vote

Cotton producers in the Permian Basin Boll Weevil Eradication Zone who wish to represent the area on the Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation's statewide board of directors have until March 12 to officially place their names into nomination. The deadline comes as cotton farmers and landowners who farmed cotton in 2006 are set to decide in an April 12 referendum whether a boll weevil eradication program should continue in the Permian Basin Zone. Cotton producers who farm in the zone and who have at least

seven years of experience as a cotton grower may place their names on the ballot for the board member position. Those wishing to be placed on the ballot must fill out a nomination form along with a biographical information sheet. In addition, the signatures of at least 10 other eligible cotton growers in the zone must support the nomination. Producers can mail the form to the Texas Department of Agriculture at P.O. Box 12847, Austin 78711 or fax the form to (800) 835-2981. The nomination must be received on or before March 12. Nomination forms are available

at local county extension service offices and the Texas Department of Agriculture in Austin at (512) 936-2450. The Permian Basin Boll Weevil Eradication Zone consists of all of Dawson, Ector, Howard and Martin counties; all of Borden County except all land east of a line seven miles west of the Scurry County line that runs from the Garza County line to the Howard County line; and all of Midland County except for the southern region located south of a line 15 miles south of Interstate 20 running from the Ector County line east to the Glasscock County line.

Topping trees can be deadly

Paul Johnson goes through a range of emotions when he sees trees being topped: anger, disgust, sorrow, frustration and worse. That's why he, as an urban forester with the Texas Forest Service in the Lower Rio Grande Valley, is spreading the word that topping does serious damage to trees, their value and the value of the entire urban forest.

"Topping is a kind word for the indiscriminate butchering of a tree," Johnson said. "It is the most harmful tree-pruning practice known, yet is very common." In usually well-intentioned efforts to prune back or reduce the size of a tree, tree trimmers and homeowners sometimes go overboard, leaving nothing more than the tree trunk and a few stumps branching from it, Johnson said. The entire crown of a tree, the area that contains a tree's leaves, is chopped off and hauled away. "Topping is bad," Johnson said. "Don't do it. It's tree mismanagement at its worst. When people indiscriminately cut large branches at mid-stream and leave a large stub of a branch behind, they are doing great harm to the tree that could lead to decay and eventually kill the tree." When a spring flush pushes tiny branches out of the ends of those stumps, they are very weakly attached to the branch, he explained. A strong wind, insects or disease can easily wipe them out, leaving the tree without a food source and susceptible to decay. "Topping a tree reduces the value and longevity of that tree," Johnson said. "Valuable tree shade is gone, and the tree is just not going to live as long as it should." Less is better when pruning a tree, Johnson said. "Try to never remove more than 25 percent of the crown, the leafy area of the tree," he said. "And when you do trim off a branch, don't cut it flush to the trunk, but

don't leave a big stump either." With the weather improving and more people outdoors pruning trees, Johnson sees other "tree violations" that harm trees. "Tree trimmers who use spikes to climb up a tree are leaving large wounds in the tree that serve as entry points for insects and diseases," he said. "Lion-tailing, or mule-tailing is another no-no. This is when a homeowner will strip all the leaves off a limb except those at the very end. That leaves a branch looking like a lion's tail. This is as bad as topping a tree." Those leaves closer to the trunk are there for a reason and should not be removed, Johnson said. They serve as a second line of defense of a tree, protecting its trunk from sunburn. They also help strengthen the entire limb from wind damage and serve as a tree's food source. "If a tree's outer leaves are removed by insects, ice or wind, the interior leaves become the food factory for the tree," he said. "Trees live off its inner leaves. They are important for the long-term life of the tree." So, what is the proper way to trim a tree? Proper tree pruning is difficult to explain without using illustrations or photos, Johnson said. He suggested hiring a qualified tree trimmer certified by the International Society of Arboriculture, or visiting ISA's Web site at <http://www.treesaregood.com>. The loss of a tree affects the entire community, Johnson said. "The trees of a community or a city are considered an urban forest, and when even one tree is damaged or lost, it hurts everybody's property," he said. "Proper tree care is everybody's responsibility because we all benefit from healthy trees." Johnson urges homeowners to turn away tree trimmers who offer tree topping. "Find a qualified tree trimmer who knows what he or she is doing," he said. "It could mean the difference between a thriving, beautiful tree and a dead one." Texas, Riverside, Calif., Miami, Fla., and New Orleans. Agents temporarily closed businesses, seizing computers and documents to be used as evidence. The tax agency said that IRS auditors also are visiting tax preparers across the nation who are seeking questionable telephone tax refunds. The agency is advising taxpayers to stay away from preparers making exaggerated claims about refunds. In several instances, it said, taxpayers have put in for a refund of \$30,000, while others are requesting refunds for the entire amount of the taxpayer's phone bill, rather than just the 3 percent long distance tax. The government stopped collecting the long-distance excise tax last August, and has authorized a refund of tax collected on service billed during the period from March 2003 to July 2006. The IRS has urged taxpayers to request a standard refund amount, requiring no documentation and ranging from \$30

to \$60, depending on exemptions claimed. Those basing refunds on actual taxes paid must have documentation available if the IRS questions the claim. Banco Bilbao buying Compass Bancshares in \$9.6 billion deal BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — Compass Bancshares Inc., which operates banks in six states with the largest number in Texas, said Friday that it is being purchased by Spain-based Banco Bilbao Vizcaya Argentaria S.A. in a cash and stock deal valued at about \$9.6 billion. The transaction consists of roughly \$4.6 billion in cash and about 196 million shares of Banco Bilbao common stock. Compass will become a subsidiary of Banco Bilbao, with Banco merging its U.S.-based banking affiliates with Compass. The boards of both companies have already approved the deal, which is expected to close in the fourth quarter of 2007. The deal is a 16.3 percent premium over Compass' closing stock price of \$61.78 Wednesday on the Nasdaq Stock

Market. Compass shares rose \$4, or more than 6 percent, to \$70.37 in morning trading on the Nasdaq. Compass shareholders can choose to receive either 2.8 Banco Bilbao American depository shares or \$71.82 in cash per Compass share. After the acquisition is complete, Compass will rank among the top 25 banks in the United States with about \$47 billion in total assets, \$32 billion in total loans and \$33 billion in total deposits. Compass has 417 branches in six states from Arizona to Florida. Its biggest centers are 165 branches in Texas and 90 in Alabama. Banco Bilbao is Spain's second largest bank by market value after Banco

Santander. Its Mexico-U.S. division includes Bancomer, Mexico's largest bank, as well smaller operations in Puerto Rico, California, Texas and Banco's U.S.-Mexico money transfer business. In June Banco Bilbao announced its acquisition of two Texas banks, to become the fourth-largest bank in the state. Dell picks head of emerging-markets consumer business DALLAS (AP) — Computer maker Dell Inc. said Friday it was naming a former Motorola Inc. executive as president of a new division that will sell technology products to consumers in developing markets such as China and India. Ron Garriques will join

Dell on Monday. He had most recently been an executive vice president at Motorola and president of that company's mobile-devices division. The move is the latest in a string of changes in Dell's executive ranks since founder Michael Dell took back the chief executive's duties last month. Dell has struggled with slowing growth, disappointing earnings, shareholder lawsuits and a federal accounting probe. The new division will sell all consumer products, including desktop and notebook computers, software and peripherals. Garriques has held several senior-executive-level jobs at Motorola, including general manager of personal communications services for Europe, the

Middle East and Africa. Before that, he held management jobs at AT&T, Lucent Technologies and Philips, according to Dell. Earlier this week, Dell named Solectron Corp. Chief Executive Mike Cannon to oversee global manufacturing, procurement and supply chain. Cannon and Garriques will both report directly to Michael Dell, the company said. Two senior vice presidents have announced they will leave Dell. In December, the company replaced its chief financial officer with Donald Carty, the former chief executive of AMR Corp., parent of American Airlines. Dell has also lured executives from General Motors Corp., Hewlett-Packard Co. and others.

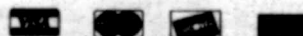

'Unknown' too twisted for its own good

OK, lets lay down some ground rules.

First, Greg Kinnear ("Little Miss Sunshine," "Bad News Bears") is not allowed to have a gun in any movie, at any time. I don't care if he's playing the part of Osama Bin Laden in a NC-17 flick, no more guns for Greg.

Second, James Caviezel ("The Passion of the Christ," "The Count of Monte Cristo") is not allowed to play anything even close to a bad guy, especially if he begins looking dangerously

like Eric Roberts.

He played Jesus, for pete sake. And before you call that type-casting, let me say... Yeah, it is. But that's what happens when you portray the son of God in what amounted to a two-hour snuff film.

And last, if you're going to go for the quick, twisty gimmick with your film, make sure the footage leading up to the twist (or twists, in this case) are interesting enough to keep you from signing off, turning in your cape and tights, and moving on to something better.

And so, with those things in mind, we take a look at "Unknown."

It's a well-known secret amongst debut filmmakers that the way into a second feature is to dazzle audiences and executives with some kind of gimmick flick or trick ending, normally within the crime genre.

It paid off pretty well for Quentin Tarantino ("Reservoir Dogs"), Bryan Singer ("The Usual Suspects"), Christopher Nolan ("Memento") and James Wan ("Saw") and not so well for the dozens of copycats who

never learned one of the first lessons of film school. Gimmicks never prosper, for if it prospered, film surveyors none dare call it a gimmick cause the filmmaker or screenwriter had more to offer than just a riddle — or a classic quote paraphrased.

Simon Brand and Matthew Waynee may have tried to get around that rule by including just about every gimmick employed by the aforementioned directors, but here's hoping they take a remedial course before their next film.

A man (Caviezel) wakes up in a warehouse. He has no idea where he is, why he's been put there and possibly who he even is. And he's not alone. Finding no way out, he discovers four other men who have been knocked out.

One is tied to a chair (Joe Pantoliano, "The Matrix," "Bad Boys"), a second has a head injury on the floor (Kinnear), a third is handcuffed to a railing and left dangling over the side with

a bullet wound to his shoulder (Jeremy Sisto, "Suicide Kings," "Wrong Turn") and a mistrustful fourth (Barry Pepper, "Knockaround Guys," "Flags of our Fathers") wakes up just in time telling Man #1 not to untie Man #2. Not one of them has any memory of why they're there or who they are.

A phone call does come in though and the man on the other end seems to know Caviezel's voice. A Luger has been left behind in error in a desk and they are coming by sundown. Meanwhile across town, a

ransom drop is going down by a scared woman (Bridget Moynihan, "I, Robot," "Prey") and a collection of cops that's clearly related to the five men in the middle of the desert. Thanks to a newspaper that's been left behind, these John Does piece together a few things.

First, they've been there for at least two days. Second, a tycoon and his business partner have been kidnapped. A lastly, that makes three of them — the kidnapers.

Oooh, intriguing! Two good guys. Three bad guys. And they don't even know it. Their memories do begin slowly coming back to them, lost thanks to a noxious chemical that's knocked them out for at least two days without killing them, and they must decide to trust their instincts or work together against the impending foes.

This makes for a potentially interesting sociological experiment. If you lost all identity of yourself, could you just as easily start over and create a whole new persona for yourself? Does memory define our actions and, in essence, ourselves?

The answer to that is to go watch "Memento." Anything intriguing in this realm is basically left to an afterthought in-between the plotting which doesn't get past whatever cleverness in the setup that hasn't been lifted from about a dozen other setups.

On its own, this could

have worked as a tight little one-set thriller, with characters engaged in a battle of wits to gain the upper hand as their memories slowly return. As it stands, the movie has no concern with any character-fueled drama that such a situation must create.

Instead, the story is opened up to a larger, clumsier field containing the outside world, in which cops fumble their attempt to catch up with the kidnapers while the wife of one of the men (which one?) stands around waiting for something to happen.

Much of this "outside" plot involves too little happening; it exists merely to break up the monotony of a single set. There are moments in which the police chase down the kidnapers' bosses, but these scenes are so predictable in their efforts to be unpredictable that they consistently disappoint — anyone surprised by the way the bad guys repeatedly

outsmart the cops simply hasn't seen enough movies in which people outsmart other people.

The only thing keeping our interest is the cast, all of whom breathe a bit of much-needed life into their stale characters. The lead, meanwhile, is dangerously lackluster, enhanced by the fact that he is played by Caviezel, the World's Most Boring Actor five years running.

The cast makes a few scenes work when they otherwise wouldn't, such as a few fits of desperation as one tries to convince another that they are the kidnapers, or another in

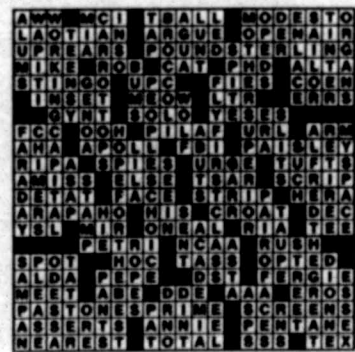
which Sisto's character recounts a story from his childhood.

shallow end of the pool.

Puzzles as such though can be fun for a while, if only cause you always want to know the answer. That allows us to forgive any lack of urgency in the pacing, including cutaways to two cops trying to track-down a face at the ransom scene and everyone look-

Soze finales, with rambling padding barely holding them together. You'd grow tired of the twists all too quickly as you'd have nothing making the twists worth watching.

Or imagine a magician who kept pulling rabbits from his hat, one after another, with no set-ups, just constant rabbits. After a while, we'd stop watching the trick. And that's where "Unknown" goes wrong, by forgetting that before we can be stunned by the surprise, we have to want to watch the set-up.
