WT President To Address FHS Graduates

He was appointed professor and head of the education department at Pan American University in 1971, held a similar position at East Texas State in 1975, and was named ETSU's vice president for academic affairs a year later. He served as president of Tarleton State University on September 1, 1982.

Valedictory address will be given by Elaine White.

Salutatory address will be by Dan Neelley.

Special music will be presented by Kim Thomas and Kendra Gordon, singing "One Moment in Time."

Miss White, the class president, will present the class gift to the school, and Superintendent Hal Ratcliff will make a special presentation.

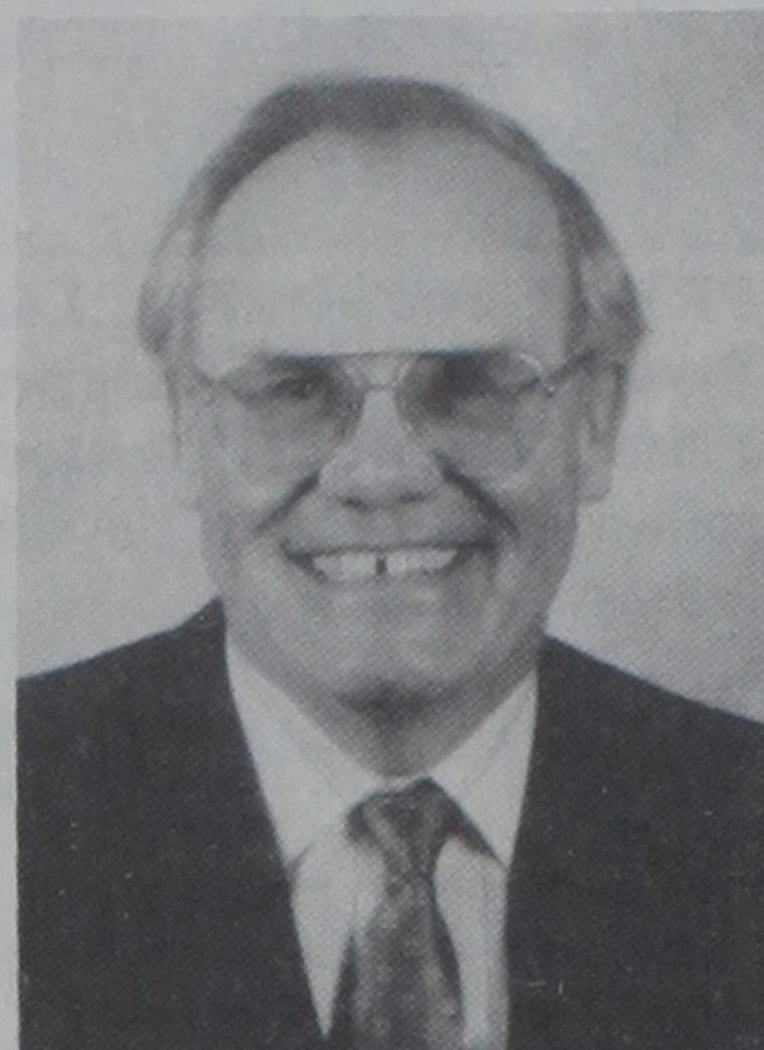
A slide presentation will be given, under the supervision of Miss Gordon, Raina Roden, Carolyn Taylor, Kim Thomas and Lisa Weatherly.

Hospital District Passes By Huge Majority Vote

Voters in Friona and most of Parmer County gave a better than 3-1 margin in approving the creation of a Parmer County Hospital District in the special election last Saturday, May 18.

Final vote was 801 in favor, and 243 against, a favorable margin of 76.7 per cent.

Following are the box-by-box totals, with the approval totals given in parenthesis:

Friona: 503-127 (79.8%); Bovina: 120-57 (67.8); Lakeview: 32-6 (84.2%); Rhea: 40-4 (91.0%); Lazbuddie: 11-24 (31.4%); Absentee: 95-25 (79.2%). Totals: 801-243 (76.7% in favor).

Members of the board of directors of Parmer County Community Hospital and hospital officials hailed the vote, saying they felt it would save the hospital.

"We were gratified by the margin of approval, and felt that the voters spoke their minds in creating a hospital district," said hospital board member Dale Schueler.

"We can set our tax rate at 18 cents per \$100 and that should give us \$400,000 with which to operate the hospital in 1992," said board chairman Wendell Gresham.

Dr. Schueler indicated that if it were at all possible, the board would attempt to roll the tax rate back, if the board's objectives are taken care of.

Area Finally Gets Much-Needed Rain

(Editor's note: This survey was taken at the Star's deadline, noon Thursday. Rainfall which fell after that time is not included in the following quotes. A total of .30 inch was measured by 6:30 p.m.)

After a long dry spell, we've finally received some rain. The Tuesday evening showers brought different amounts, but it seems the rainfall was pretty general. Friona's official measurement was .81".

Jack Patterson, who lives about 18 miles northwest of town in the Rhea community, received .6 inch that afternoon and a trace on Wednesday.

Gauges in the Jayson Grimsley-Butch Preston farming area northeast of town registered an inch. Residents of the Clay's Corner area reported 1.5 inches Wednesday.

At the Clyde Woodard farm, east of Hub, .7 was measured. This area had received about 1.5 inches of rain a couple of weeks or so ago.

A spokesperson for B&W Cafe in Lazbuddie reported one inch.

Terry Copley, who operates T&S York Hog Farm southeast of town received one-half inch of moisture.

These aren't really impressive totals, but considering the lack of moisture we've been having makes them more important.

A check of the records by Bill Ellis, weather recorder for the National Weather Service, revealed that prior to this week, the total rainfall for the Friona gauge for the past nine months amounted to only 5.68 inches, and for the previous 12 months, it came to just 10.66 inches, much below normal.

January's snows had a moisture content of 1.07 inches, and prior to that, you had to go all the way back to September 29 when a measurement of 1.18 was logged. Following are the monthly totals for the past 12 months in Friona:

June, 1990: .06; July, 1990: 2.63; August, 1990: 2.29; September, 1990: 2.29; October, 1990: .37; November, 1990: .77; December, 1990: .24; January, 1991: 1.07; February, 1991: .01; March, 1991: .63; April, 1991: .00; May, 1991 (through 23rd) 1.43.

Commencement exercises for Friona's 1991 eighth grade class will be held at 8 p.m. Friday, May 24, 1991.

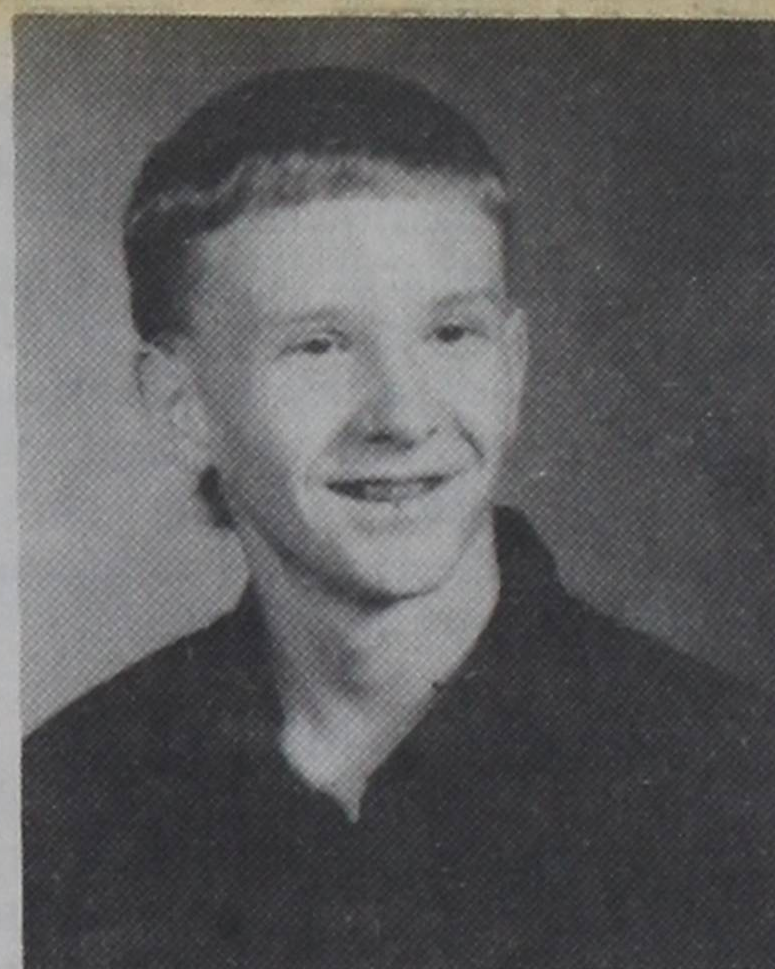
Seth Houston is the class valedictorian, and Cory Hamilton is the salutatorian.

Houston had a grade average of 99.8 for the school year. He is the son of Sammy and Sandy Houston.

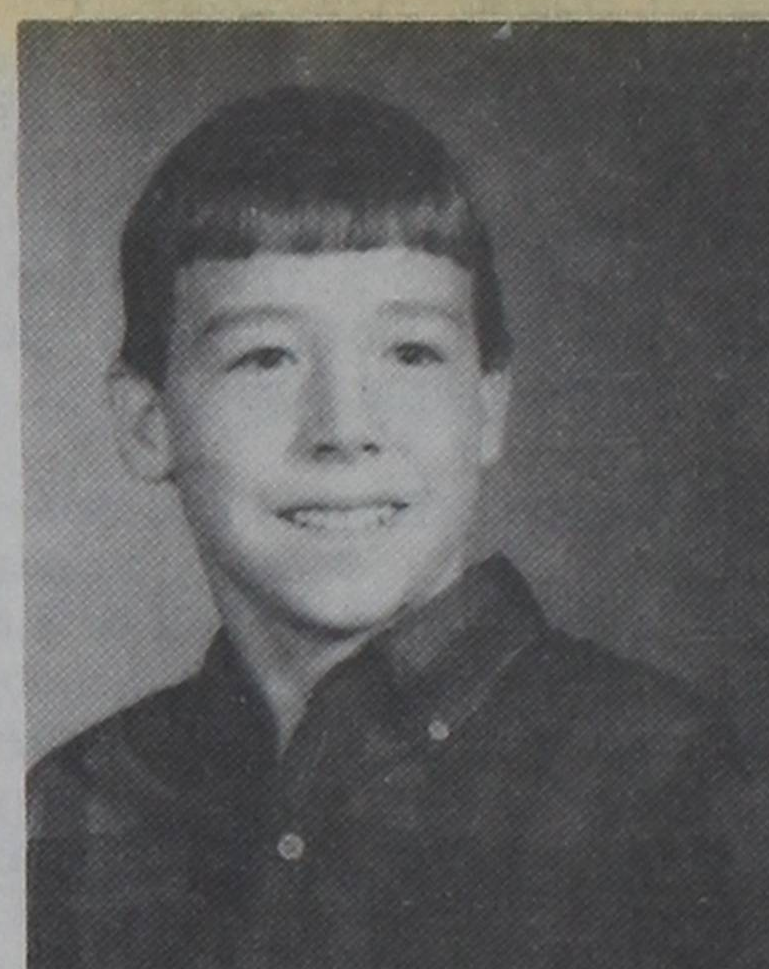
His classes have included Spanish I, English, athletics, American History, Earth Science, and Algebra I.

60 YEARS AGO--MAY 8, 1931

Tuesday night, the Friona Chamber of Commerce met with the Bovina Chamber of Commerce at Bovina to discuss the matter of paving Highway 60 through Parmer County. Attending from Friona were Howard Morris, Dan Ethridge, F.S. Truitt, John Guyer, Oscar Lange and L.E. Bauerfeind. The group is to secure a state engineer who will make a preliminary survey and an estimate of the cost involved in paving the road.

55 YEARS AGO--MAY 8, 1936

The high school commencement exercises will be held in the high school auditorium the night of May 15. The senior class held its annual picnic on Thursday of last week. The class went to Palo Duro State Park. In the evening, they attended the show, "A Message to Garcia," in Amarillo.

50 YEARS AGO--MAY 9, 1941

B.T. Galloway, who is agent for the Baldwin Combine and Dempster farm implements, last week moved his business from the small building on the east side of Main Street, where he has been located for the past three or four years, to the building adjoining him on the north, which has until recently been occupied by the Johnson Trading Post.

10 YEARS AGO--MAY 10, 1981

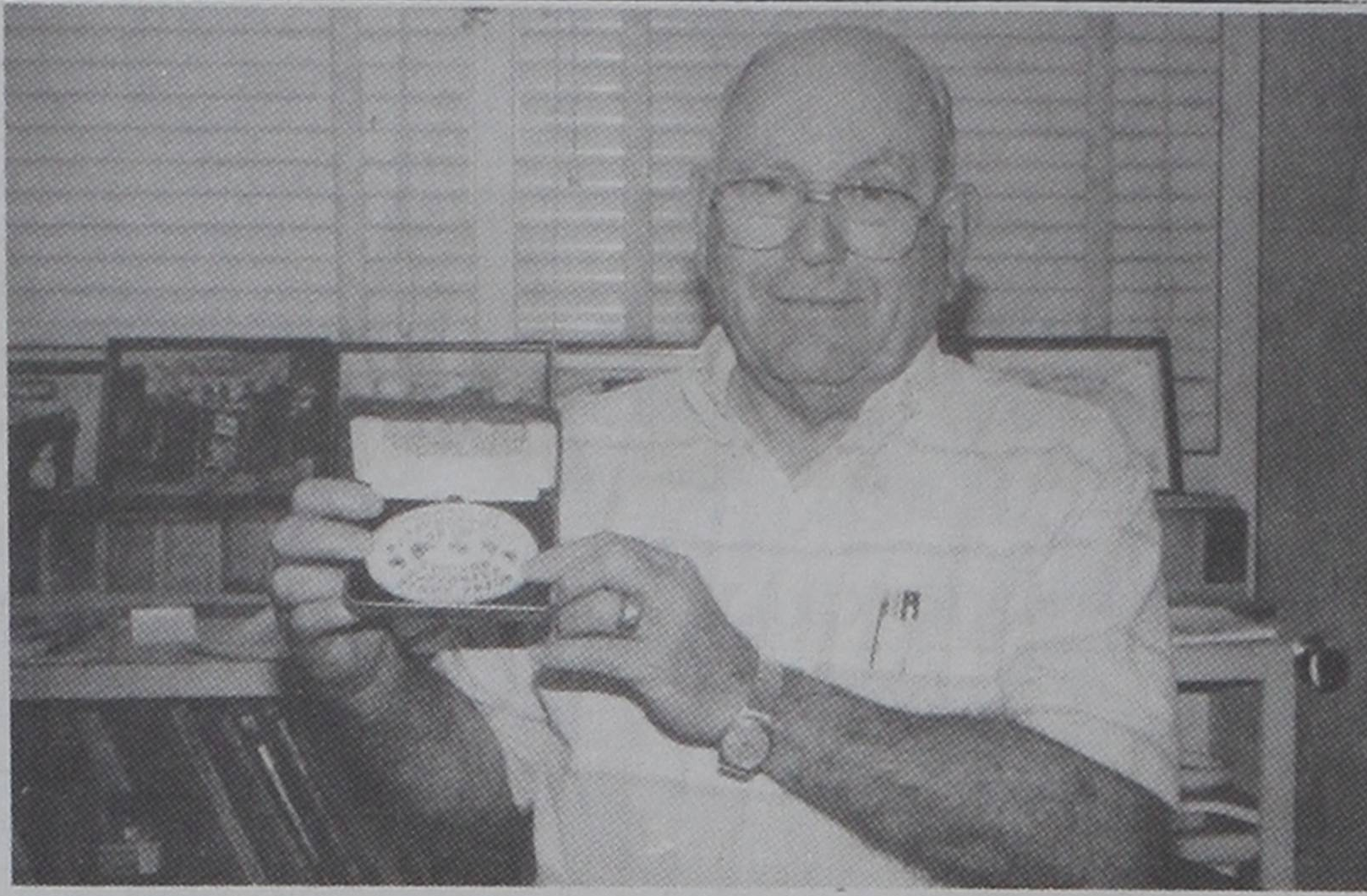

Letter To The Editor



Dear Editor:

Seventy-six students were recognized recently in a special ceremony at Wayland Baptist University, Plainview.

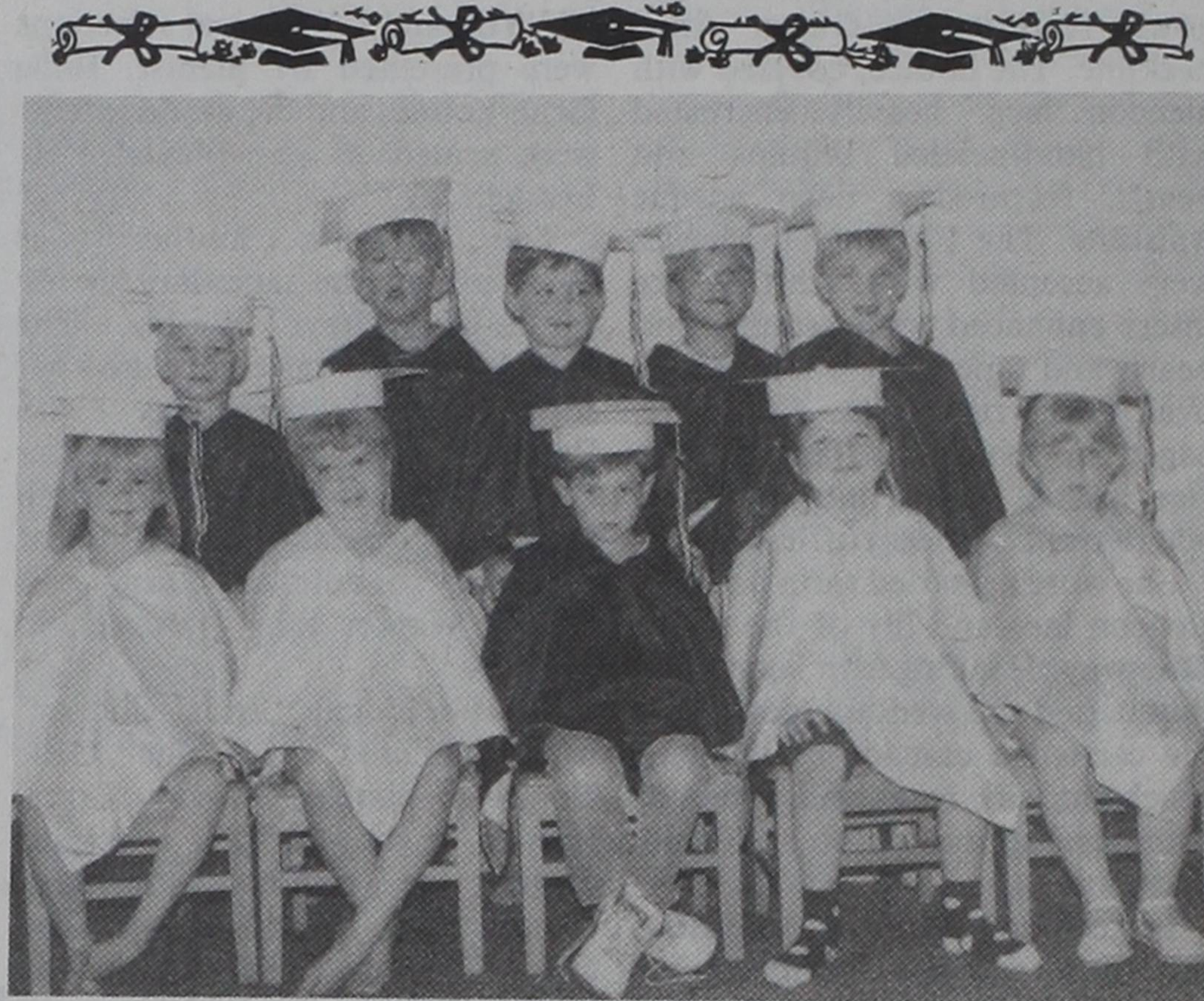

A Rich Taxpayer's Message to Congress

Have you ever heard that the rich don't pay taxes? The saying has been around so long that there must be some truth to it, right? According to Paul Craig Roberts, a former assistant secretary of the U.S. Treasury, the "rich" actually pay more than their share of taxes.

The first question to ask in determining whether this is, indeed, true is, who is rich? To be in the top five per cent of income earners, you must have an adjusted gross income of \$73,757 or more. The top ten per cent have incomes of \$58,368 or more. The top 25 per cent drops to \$35,609, according to Roberts.

With figures like these, it's apparent that there are millions of hard-working, tax-paying citizens who are "rich" and don't know it. If you happen to fall into one of these "rich" categories, watch out.

*The top five per cent of U.S. wage earners paid 45.9 per cent of all the income tax collected in 1988. That's up from 37.6 per cent in 1979.

*The top ten per cent of U.S. wage earners paid 56.9 per cent of the total income tax revenues, up from 49.5 per cent in 1979.

*The top 25 per cent paid 77.8 per cent of the total income tax revenues in 1988, up from 73.1 per

cent in 1979.

*The bottom 50 per cent of all U.S. taxpayers paid only 5.5 per cent of total income taxes collected in 1988.

Roberts concludes that Internal Revenue Service statistics show upper income taxpayers (\$58,000 or more, or about half of a congressman's salary) pay the bulk of the income tax and have paid a rising percentage of the total income tax throughout the 1980s.

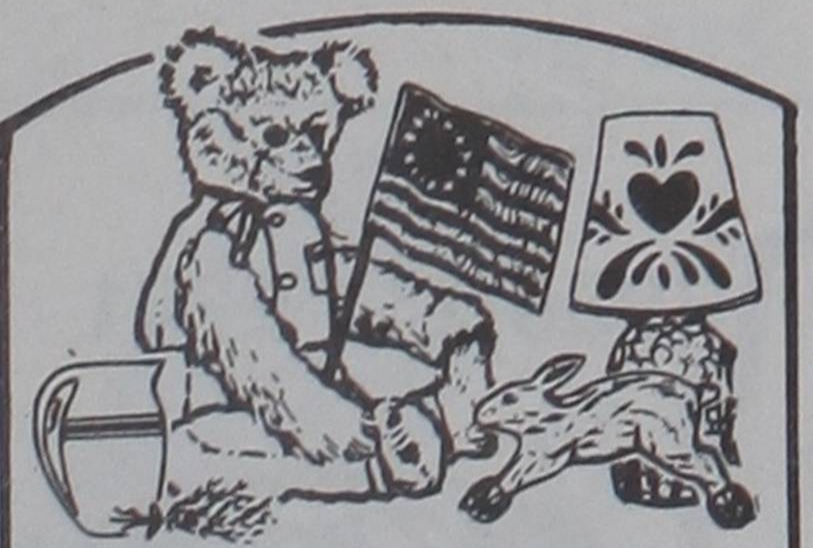
My purpose is not to encourage a tax revolt but to dispel the myth that economic problems are solved by more taxes for the rich or, for that matter, more taxes for anyone.

As a rule, tax revenues increase as the Gross National Product (the value of all goods and services produced in one year in the United States) increases. During the Reagan administration, GNP increased nearly 80 per cent. That meant hundreds of billions more tax dollars annually, even though the federal government received a smaller percentage of the total pie due to lower tax rates.

Since then, the economy has slowed, as has GNP and, ultimately, tax revenues. Still, the bills from Congress' overgenerous spending binges keep coming. Unfortunately, the solution for this has been more taxes for the 11 million hard-working Americans who already pay nearly 95 per cent of the income taxes collected.

Those earning \$58,000 or more paid an average federal tax of \$21,473 in 1988, and those earning above \$73,000 paid an average of \$34,788. Add to that state tax, property tax, sales tax and a host of hidden taxes, and the working "rich" have precious little left to invest for retirement, children's educations, health and insurance protection and other essentials that productive citizens must take care of for themselves.

Now, there's a message from the "rich" that merits a lot of repeating to Congress.
