During the week the House passed and I voted for another bill to try to overcome the disruptive effects of the Supreme Cour $i$ de－ affirmatively re－establish the rule of reason in regard to holding a suspect who has been arested in connection with an alieged crime． In the Mallory case the Court had thrown out a confession obtained from a defendant because he had been held from about $2: 30$ A．M． until morning hours without char－ ges．It seems that the present Court is determined to make it impossible to prevent or to pun－ ish crime in this country．Their latest decision is to the effect that it is perfectly legal to approve acts of immorality，even though they be a violation of State law．
