ATTITUDE OF BAILEY.

The Houston Post probably has the situation sized up correctly when it says that Senator Bailey has pointed out no specific objection to the Federal Reserve system "and probably he has no serious objection to it save that it is one of the achievements of the Wilson administration."

In his speech in Wichita Falls the other day, so anxious was he to see that the democratic administration got no great credit for the act, he undertook to credit the genesis of the Federal Reserve system to his long-time republican friend, the late Senator Aldrich of Rhode Island, although the Aldrich banking act's result if not its purpose would have been to centralise all banking power, while the biggest benefit of the present Federal Reserve system is the decentralization of banking power and its distribution among all the different parts of the country.

And the Houston paper is correct again when it says it may be that the Federal Reserve system "is not the best banking system that it is possible for the human mind to conceive, but it is the best that has ever been conceived as tested by the severest crisis to which civilization has ever been subjected," and it points out, in support of that statement, that while metallic money has been at a premium in practically all the other belligerent countries, paper money and metal money in the United States have been and are on absolute parity.

It sounds strange, not to say shocking, to hear any American speak derisively of the President of the United States, as did Mr. Bailey in his scornful appellation of "professor," and it is all the more unbecoming from a man who from experience and knowledge should have some appreciation of the niceties that are expected from decorous citizens of sophistication.

The fact is, Mr. Bailey is so obsessed with his hatred of President Wilson that he is unfair to himself as well as to the President in his unreasoning and unreasonable denunciation of everything that President Wilson has done or had anything to do with. In all of the years of the Wilson administration, there has just been one action of which Mr. Bailey has publicly and wholly approved, and that was his veto of the war-time prohibition enforcement act!

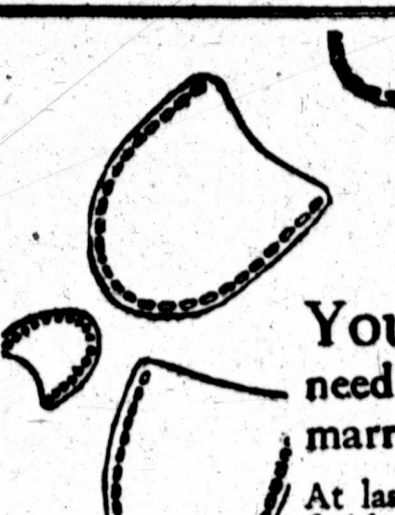

**BUSINESS COUNCIL
ADOPTS REPORT ON
LIGHTING STREETS**

No definite limits have been set on the area to be covered by the improvement. It is understood that the system will be extended on each street as far as the property owners will sign up for the improvement.

TOLEDO, O., April 3.—With street car service again in complete suspension here because of the council's refusal to approve an increase in fare, no move was in prospect early today for a settlement.

The street car men's union, which called a strike last night because of wage increase is refused by the company without the higher fare, showed no inclination to conciliate, and members of the council expressed the opinion that it would be a fight to the finish. Observers are predicting a long suspension of trolley service.

Doherty, head of the Toledo Railways and Light company took the cars out of the state for a month because the people voted for a custer ordinance.
