





MORE PAY FOR NORTH DAKGTA EDUCATORS

FARGO, N. D., March 20 .- Every professor, instructor and teacher ni the North Dakota agricultural college; all boys and girls club leaders, and all county agents in the state will hereafter receive higher salaries, more nearly commensurate with the importance of their work, and the present day cost of living.

The state board of administration, after conferring with Dr. E. F. Ladd, president of the agricultural college, the deans, the representatives of the teachers' union, has announced a new schedule, effective and retroactive to January 1. A definite twelve months schedule was adopted.

Where the employment is for 12 months, the entire year, there will be 12 monthly payments totaling the full year's salary. Where the ployment is for nine months, the total salary will be one-twelfth less ments will be made in nine monthly installments.

Here are the new rates of pay Deans and heads of schools, \$3000 to \$4000; professors and heads of de partments, \$2500 to \$5000; associate professors, \$2000 to \$3000; assistant professors, \$2000 to \$2500; regular instructors of two years' course, \$1500 to \$2000.

Employes of the experiment stations will receive the same pay as teachers in the college when they de the same work. Project leaders it the extension division will be ranked as professors. 
