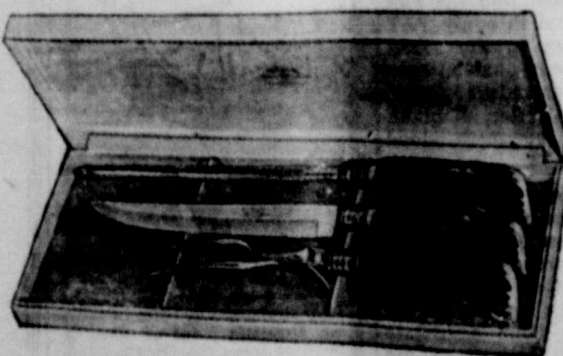

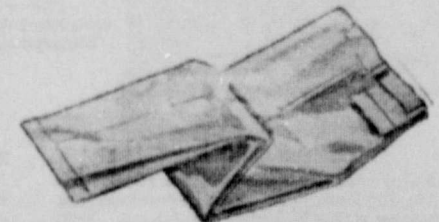

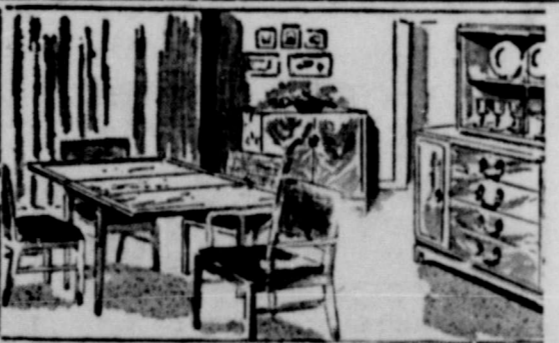

## Four Die As Airliner Crashes Six Miles Northwest Of Spur

**BIG PASSENGER PLANE CRASHES 6 MILES OUT**

One of the most tragic events in the history of West Texas occurred Saturday afternoon when a big trimotored plane fell to the ground in a mass of flames six miles northwest of town and the passengers burned to death. The plane had taken off from San Antonio and was routed to Amarillo, Denver and Tulsa. The plane was flying low as it passed over Spur and was making very slow speed. Farmers in the community where the crash came, stated they could see flames emitting from the ship a mile or more before it fell.

The gasoline container finally exploded and the ship went to the ground in a crash, broken and completely covered in flames. The gas tank was blown from the plane while in mid-air and landed a few feet in front of where the plane came down.

In the plane were H. N. Ballard, owner of the ship and president of the Sunbeam Air Transport Company of San Antonio. Mr. Ballard was a man of means having accumulated several millions in property in various states. He had headquarters in both San Antonio and Denver where his business interests demanded much of

his attention. Other of the occupancy were: Matthew Watson, of Austin, who was the pilot and much experienced in the work; Willis Washburn of San Antonio; a Filipino cook and James O'Banion, negro of Denver. The bodies of all the occupants were burned beyond recognition. Had it not been for quick work rendered by a crew of men in the employ of the West Texas Utilities Company here, the bodies would have been completely cremated in the seething flames.

The plane was a 14-passenger and had been manufactured by the Ford Motor Company at Detroit. It was the first of its type to be wrecked and so strong had confidence been placed in this type that it was thought a wreck was impossible. However, a diary was said to report that engine trouble had been encountered the past twenty five or thirty miles. This probably created a loose con-

nection in the gas line and caused a leak which created the conflagration. It is the opinion of the Inspector Hazen, of Dallas, who is with the Federal Department and came and inspected the wreck, that all had succumbed before the plane struck the ground. All of the fatalities were young men, ranging in age from thirty four years down. Mr. Ballard was thirty two.

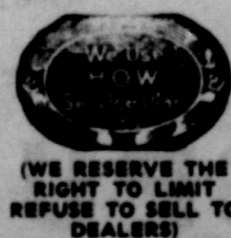
