

There is a man in London whose specialty it is to purchase showy costumes and discarded military and official uniforms for disposal in the orient and in Africa.

It is said that even the retiring lord mayors of London have become, almost by official tradition, this man's customers and that the cocked hat, gold laced coat and knee breeches that have formed an inspiring feature of the famous pageants in the lord mayor's processions are as like as not the next year to delight the eyes of darkest Africa upon the proud person of some native.

Some amusing comments have been made by the Londoner who engages in this unique trade with reference to the eagerness with which the native in the interior of the dark continent takes over this discarded finery.
