The original emery is pounded up I have his picture inside.' and passed through wire sieves of different mesh. To make emery wheels, buff wheels or glazers, the emery powder is mixed with gum shellac, silicate of soda or vulcanized rubber.

A remarkable source of supply of impalpable emery flour is the air of the room in which emony is being broken and assorted. The room is closed, the inconceivably small particles of emery settle on surfaces, and this fine flour is collected in small quantities and is of great value in refined polishing.

Incidentally, this fact reveals the kind of materials that enter the lungs of the workers in factories. For centuries emery has been secured in India, Asia Minor and other oriental places, but sources have been discovered in Georgia and North Carolina.

The sparks thrown off by an emery wheel are incandescent particles of the metal worn away by friction. The quantity of heat is not great, for the hand can be held in a stream of the Aving, giowing particles without injury. The intensity of heat in each particle for an instant is great, but the masses of metal are so minute that heat sufficient to do much harm cannot develop .- New York American,



The boiler should hold about 120 gallone 1500 gallone of dip | can be made at once in it, enough to fill an ordinary vat, only that if seems to be impossible to get three gellone of tar into that quanity of water. In that case you can stir about two gallons of tar into the 100 to 120 gallons, put that into the vat, heat about 30 gallons of water or dip from the vat, until it is pretty hot, but not boiling, stir in the rest of the tar, and put into

For refilling the yat when it has been dipped low, I would suggest the following plan: Make up medicine for 500 gallons of dip using 100 gallons of water. Then for refilling the vat use one bucket of medicine to four buckets of water to make the dip.

The stockman should preserve this receipt for future reference as the beneficial result will be noticed this year by those who dip their cattle and will be followed by other stockmen the following Vear.
