## Sonora Hosts a Rancher Roundup

SONORA – The Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service will conduct the multi-county event, "Ranchers Roundup – Enhancing Range and Livestock Production," beginning at 8:30 a.m. at the Sutton County Civic Center in Sonora.

Participating counties include Sutton, Edwards, Schleicher and Irion.

Pascual Hernandez, AgriLife Extension agent in Sutton County, said timely rains have benefited the region's rangeland and provided much-needed optimism, but the much improved rangeland conditions also raises questions.

"Will the rains produce a flush of toxic plants?" Hernandez asked. "Should I buy cows or replacement heifers? How do I select cows that'll make money? And how can I best take advantage of the positive, but somewhat volatile sheep and goat market trends?"

"The annual Ranchers Roundup will address those questions and more. It's a time of cautious optimism that we hope our producers will be able to profit from wisely."

Topics and speakers will include:

– Beef Industry Update, Dr. Rick Machen, AgriLife Extension livestock specialist, Uvalde.

– Sheep and Goat Industry Outlook, Benny Cox, Producers Livestock Auction, San

Angelo.

– Reducing Livestock Losses to Toxic Plants, Dr. Morgan Russell, AgriLife Extension range specialist, San Angelo.

– Antibiotics and Hormones in Animal Production, Dr. Ron Gill, AgriLife Extension livestock specialist, College Station.

Three Texas Department of Agriculture continuing education units, one integrated pest management and 2 general, will be offered.

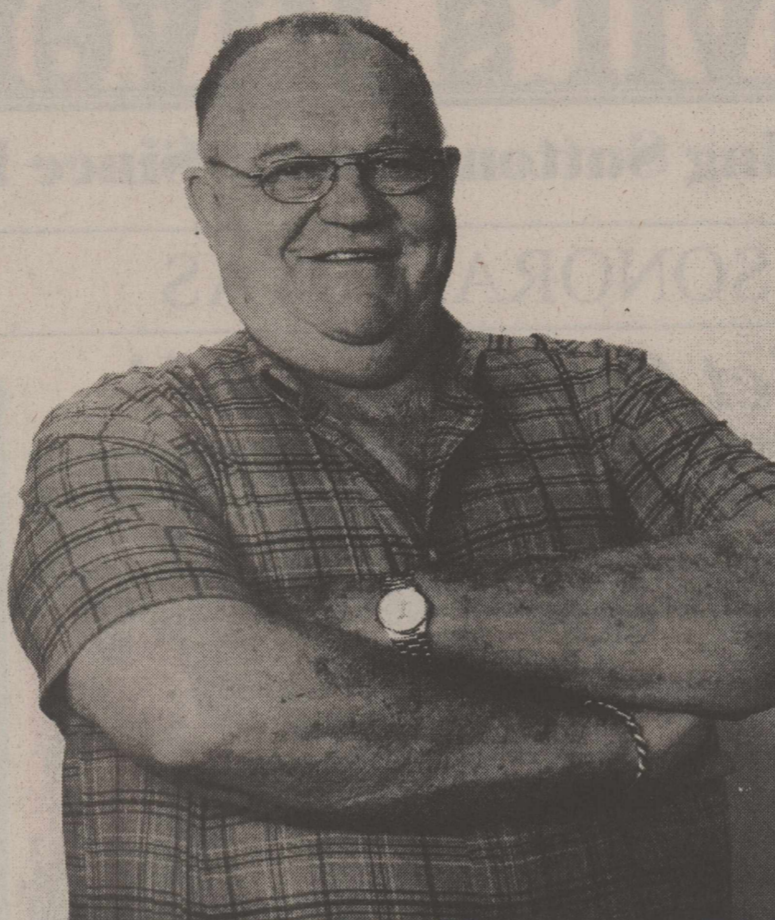

**Rodney Ayres Knight, Sonora**

He lived the life of a legend, the kind of life that books are made of and ONLY after making sure all that knew he had a story to tell, a chuckle, a good olf belly laugh or a great adventure, Rodney left this earth to be with our Lord and Savior. Rodney A. Knight was born in San Antonio, Texas, on April 4, 1945, to Robert and Betsy Knight. The oldest of three boys, Rod grew up in and around San Antonio. After graduating from Pleasanton High School in 1963, he attended Texas A & I, in Kingsville, for three years. He worked on the family dairy for a few years. On February 27th, 1971, he married the love of his life, Kathy. In December, of that same year, he started Game Warden Academy, in Austin. In May of 1972, after completion of the Academy, Rod received his orders and was stationed in Sutton County. He served Sutton County for 30 years, until his retirement in 2001. He told his grand kids that he was catching ibad guys. He loved Sonora and the people of Sutton County.

In 1992, he began a Hunter Education Camp for young hunters at the McPherson 4M Ranch. During the fifteen years of the camp, hundreds of boys and girls from all over the state attended Mr. Knight's camp. These camps were never advertised, but always filled up in advance and always had a waiting list. It wasn't just the lessons that drew the students to the course, but the special attention from the Game Wardens.

In 1998, Rod received the prestigious award of Shikar-Safariis Wildlife Officer of the Year. It was an occasion celebrated by the whole family.

In all of his travels, Rodney never met a stranger. If he didn't know anyone when he walked into a room, just give him five minutes and he would know half of their life stories. He was known and respected by many and loved by all. Rodney will be greatly missed.

Pappaw, as he was known by his grandchildren, touched more hearts and people's lives than most can imagine. From the iHey Boyi greetings, the crushing handshake that would drop you to your knees, or the stories heid share, you always knew it was Rod. He is leaving his children and grandchildren with wonderful memories of family camp outs, fishing and hunting trips and being the center of attention when they danced to the song, iShout!i He made life fun.

From card games to protecting wildlife, he always gave it his all. When it came to loving Kathy, he gave even more. They did everything together; cooking meals, gambling adventures with friends, fishing trips to the coast and setting up for craft shows.

On May 9th, 2015, with his wife, Kathy by his side, Rodney Ayres Knight was welcomed into Heaven by his father, Robert A. Knight; his brother, Volney S. Knight; and his cousin, Brooks W. Knight.

Rodney is survived by his wife Kathy, his mother, Betsy Knight, his brother Kurtney Knight and Fran, his daughter Edie Knight and Barry Mathieu, son Lonnie Knight and Honey, daughter Betsy Knight-Gonzales and Luie, son Joe Shannon and Tammy, daughter Debbie Norment and Darold; grandchildren - Emery and Sara Dunn; Madison and Garrett Knight; Drew and Taushlyn Riley; Bryce and Kodee Smith; Ryan, Matt and Kaycie Shannon; Hunter, Michelle and Kristen Norment; great-granddaughter n Dakota Tucker; along with numerous nieces, nephews, family and friends.

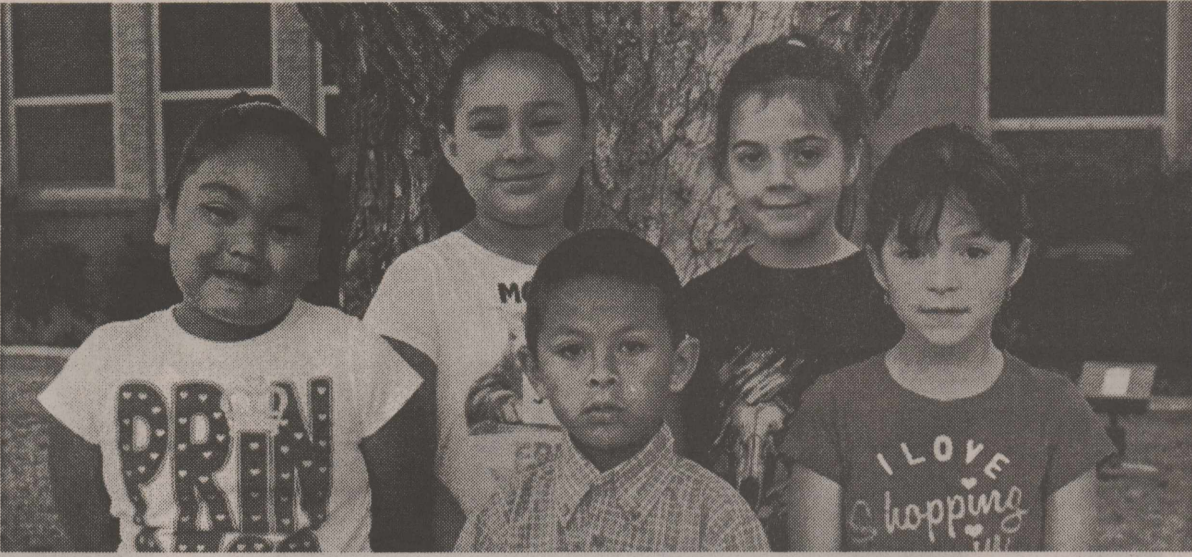

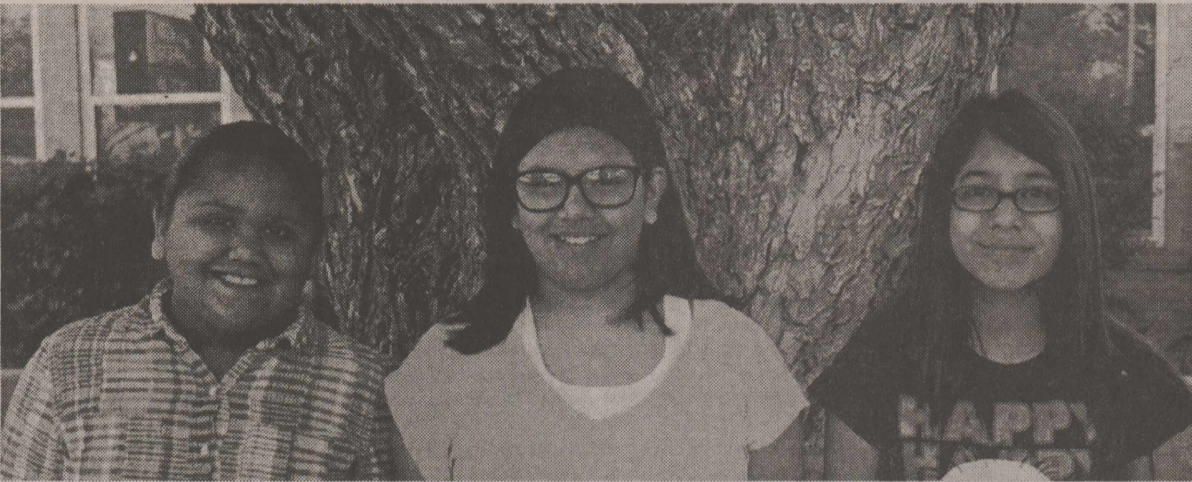

## It Matters What We Feed Them

use corn as the first ingredient, or within the list, simply because it is cheap and acts as a filler in the food formula. Here is an example. I love eating Asian food. It's one of my favorite things, but just a few hours later I feel hungry again. Has that ever happened to you? Guess what, that is what your dog is feeling when he eats a bunch of corn. Assuming your dog is healthy, if your dog seems to be starving all of the time you may want to consider looking at the list of ingredients and finding a better quality food to satisfy his hunger. You may be asking yourself, "How do I satisfy my dog's hunger, so he's not starving"? Protein! Protein, of any type, should be the number one ingredient. Dogs are not vegetarians and need to be fed meat. An example of protein is called meal, but don't let the word "meal" scare or mislead you. Chicken meal, meat meal, lamb meal, fish meal, etc., is still protein found in dog food. It is meat that has been processed and dehydrated to get more protein rather than water from it. As a general rule, always take a close look at the first five ingredients listed on the bag. Those are the key ingredients that make up your dog's food. The lower the ingredient is in the list the

less significance it makes in your dog's food. As a substitute for corn many food formulas will have brewer's rice, brown rice, white rice, oats, barley, potatoes, pumpkin or a combination of ingredients. As long as your dog does not have any allergies to those ingredients they are a better choice for you furry friend. Some formulas will have blueberries, raspberries, tomatoes and sweet potatoes. Dog food companies usually add vitamins and minerals to the formula and are listed at the bottom of the ingredient list. Dog food companies follow the Association of American Feed Control Officials (AAFCO) guidelines and standards. Many dogs do have allergies, or other medical conditions, which require specialized foods. My personal dogs are no exception. Due to an allergy of certain proteins, my pets get a salmon based dog food. Some dogs with allergies may need grain-free food. Always consult your veterinarian about your dog and its needs. You can find more information about your dog's food at [www.dogfoodadvisor.com](http://www.dogfoodadvisor.com) and many other websites through your search engine online.

What's in your dog's food? Have you ever read the label? Can you decipher the long list of ingredients and know your precious pooch is getting good food? Fifteen plus years ago the average dog owner was limited to the quality selection of dog food. Now, the savvy pet owner has a plethora of good quality food to give our loved four-legged pets. Grab your dog's food bag or food can and take a look at the list of ingredients. What is the first ingredient you see? Is it corn or corn meal? It is not uncommon for many dog food companies to
