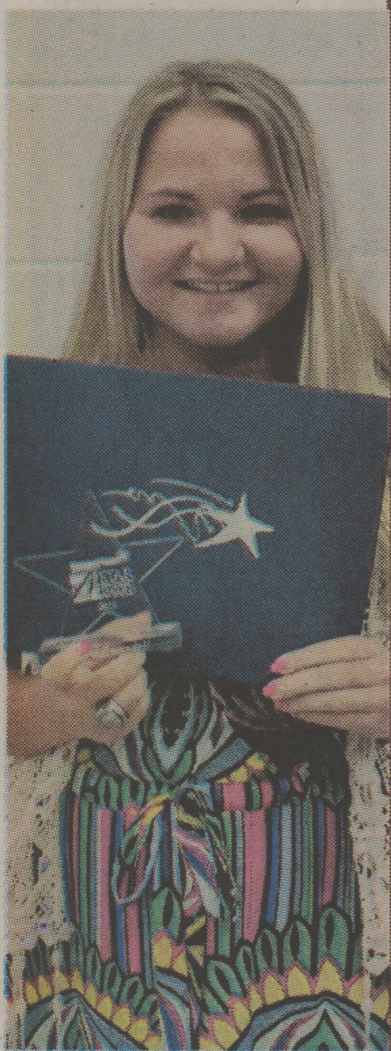

## Tennis Team Brings Back the Silver and Bronze Medals

The Sonora tennis team took the mixed double's team of Tanner Esparza and Tyler Hampton and the girls' double's team of Gracie Dozier and Sky Jennings to the State Tournament in College Station. The tournament was set to take place on Tuesday and Wednesday, May 12-13, but an extra day was added due to weather delays. By the end of the long tournament, all four of the Sonora players brought home medals.

The girls' double's team of Gracie Dozier and Sky Jennings were originally set to play their first round match at 12:00 on Tuesday. Due to the rain delays, the girls did not take the court for their first round until after 1:00 A.M. Their first round match was against Lash and Hassin from Lago Vista. This team finished second in state the previous year and won their district and region by beating their teammates who were the defending state champions. Dozier and Jennings probably played their best match of the year. The girls continually used great passing shots and aggressive net play to secure a 6-3,1-6,6-4 hard fought victory over this very talented team. This match did not end till after 3:00 A.M. in the morning. The next morning the girls were supposed to be at the courts by 10:00 A.M. for their semifinal match. After more rain delays the girls walked on the court to face another talented team Sutton and Barham from White Oak. The girls were down a break at 2-3 when the rains came. This delay actually helped as the tournament was canceled for the day and gave the girls some much needed rest. The next morning the girls took the court and defeated the White Oak team 7-5,6-1, putting them in the finals. In the finals, Sky and Gracie faced the defending state champs of Mumford and Wheeler from Lago Vista. The girls could never get on track against this team and fell in the finals 6-2,6-1. The girls did a great job and were the State Silver Medalists!

The mixed double's team of Tyler Hampton and Tanner Esparza were there at 3:00 A.M. supporting their teammates and thinking they were about to play when UIL announced that they would wait until tomorrow to play their first round. They had barely started their first round match against King and Blanchard from Rockdale when the rain came. Because they were already behind one round, the decision was made to send 3A mixed doubles teams to Bryan to play on indoor courts. Esparza and Hampton made short work of the team from Rockdale 6-2,6-1. The next day Esparza and Hampton played the solid team from Brock of Moon and Nichols. They played well, but lost 6-4,6-2. Tyler and Tanner won the Bronze medals!

What a great ending to a great season bringing home 4 state medals. The team would like to thank Mr. Hartmán, Coach Sine, parents and friends who made the long drive and long days and nights to support these athletes.

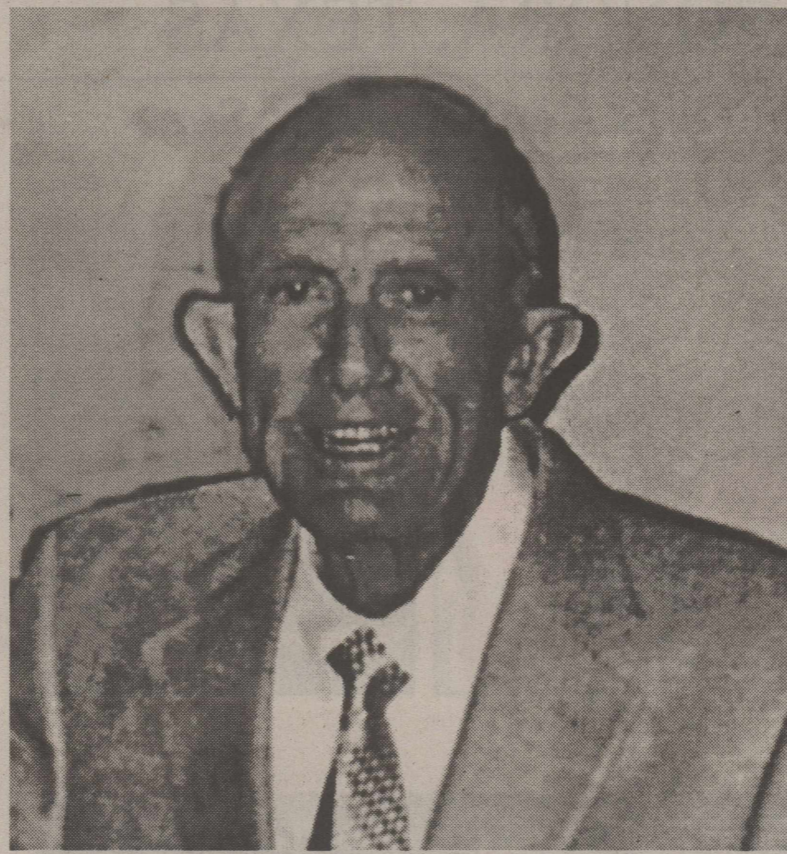

**Obituary**



Lawrence Jerald Finklea, 85, of Sonora, passed at home on May 18, 2015. Lawrence was predeceased this past August by his devoted wife of sixty-two years, Jodie Moore Finklea. Born September 13, 1929, at West Columbia, Texas, Lawrence was the son of Ralph and La Nell McShan Finklea. His father was a highly respected oil drilling supervisor for Humble Oil Company, and throughout his youth the family adjusted to frequent moves to many locations in South Texas, including the King Ranch. His final high school years were spent at Texas Military Institute in San Antonio, where he established lifelong friendships before graduating in 1947. Lawrence enrolled at The University of Texas in Austin, where he met his future wife, Jodie Moore, from Sonora, and received his BS in geology.

After earning an army commission through the ROTC at UT, Lawrence served two years during the Korean conflict. He graduated from Deck Officers School at Fort Eustace, Virginia and was stationed in Thule, Greenland. Lawrence and Jodie married on August 14, 1952 at the historic Burton Parish Episcopal Church in Colonial Williamsburg, Virginia. Lawrence was honorably discharged as a 1st Lt in the spring of 1954.

In the summer of 1954 Jodie and Lawrence accepted a ranch pasturing opportunity from W.L. Miers. Their decision led to a long and productive life of ranching in Sutton and Edwards counties. The couple also shared a passion for breeding and racing quarter horses, highlighted by many trips to Ruidoso Downs, NM.

Those left to honor and cherish his memory include his two sons, Bill and Larry; his daughter Marsha Cardwell; his two grandchildren, Margo and McCurdy Cardwell; his half sister-in-law, Angie Wright; nieces Deanna Wright Tovar and April Finklea Beckerly; nephews Peter Finklea and Keith Wright; and many friends.

The family would like to thank Maggie Gutierrez, Yolanda Duran and Miguel DeHoyas for their unwavering passion and dedication.

A memorial service will be held at 11 a.m. Thursday, May 21, 2015, at St. John's Episcopal Church in Sonora, Texas, followed by interment in Sonora Cemetery.



## Crockett County Ag Producers Workshop slated for May 21 in Ozona

OZONA – The Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service will conduct the Crockett County Ag Producers Workshop from 9 a.m.-2:30 p.m. May 21 at the Crockett County Convention Center in Ozona.

“This will be a very ranch-focused workshop,” said Aaron Renfroe, AgriLife Extension agent in Crockett County. “Our first talk will be on range herbicides, and then we’ll switch gears for the remainder of the day to focus on wildlife management, specifically predators and predation. Our keynote speaker on that topic will be Michael Bodenchuk, Texas Wildlife Services director at San Antonio.”

Registration is \$15 due upon arrival and includes lunch.

Three Texas Department of Agriculture continuing education units, two general and one integrated pest management, will be offered.

Registration with coffee and doughnuts starts at 9 a.m. followed by the program at 9:30 a.m.

Speakers and their topics will include:

- Ralph Porter, Dow AgroSciences LLC, senior sales representative of Abilene, Fence Line Brush Control and General Range Chemical Update.
- Bodenchuk, Predator Management; Control Methods
- M44, 1080 Collars, Traps and other Methods; Feral Hog

Control Update; Guard Animal Pros and Cons.

After lunch, Lance Criswell, Crockett County trapper, will speak on identifying predator damage and give an update on the current predator situation in Crockett County.

The workshop will conclude with Bodenchuk, Criswell and Jake Babb, another Crockett County trapper, conducting a demonstration on using traps and snares, while fielding questions on the various techniques.





This was an 8 week program for teams of up to 8 people and schools to see who can walk the most miles. In Sutton County, there were 8 teams that participated in the county challenge and the 5th grade class participated. The county teams that participated and the amount of miles walked per team were:
