Securing And Housing Of Migrant Labor Subject Of Serious Study

| The problem of securing and housing immigrant labor for Bailey county cotton growers and producers of other agricultural products is the subject of serious study by Muleshoe Chamber of Commerce workers. <br> Early returns of the county wide survey indicate that the ul timate solution of the problem can only be the result of exten sive research, study and consultation. <br> A tabulation of figures from the poll currently underway indicates that there is a definite need for seasonal labor especially during the months of July, Aug. ust, October and November. Puring those months it appears that the average cotton grower could were available this year. Of the 52 replies received to date, 50 per cent indicated that they needed more help for ching cotton and 40 per cent stated that they could not furnish housing for 250 needed workers. <br> lem thesents a serious prob. John MacFarland chairman of the Agricultural division of the chamber of commerce. "We have already made one trip to inspect labor camps in Hereford and Dimmitt, we shall continue to interview and question employ. ers and consult with officials of ties and the state and national government." <br> Methods for supplying housing for the seasonal workers is of paramount concern with religious and recreational facilities problem of providing additional employment during the intervening months between chopping time and picking time, it was pointed out. <br> One chamber of commerce spokesman stressed the fact that $\qquad$ | coincided closely with the season in surrounding counties, thus the competition for labor was keen during the months of greatest demana.
