



#### **Tips For** Gardeners From the **Ozona Garden Club** by **Mrs. Bailey Post** minoro

The old saying of "April Showers Bring May Flowers'' would be a welcome one for us right now. April is usually a month to enjoy the results of Autumn planning and preparation of the garden. The warm days have been enjoyable, but it has been too cold, especially at night, to plant tender bedding plants unless protected. Now that Easter is passed we should escape a damaging freeze.


The latter part of this month is the time to plant zinnias, caladiums, vinca, periwinkles and marigolds. Plant caladiums and elephant ears where they will not be exposed to hot afternoon sun. Remember they need watering almost everyday through the summer, especially those in pots.

April is a critical time for spraying to keep insects under control. Watch your roses for mildew, aphids and black spot. All purpose insecticides are very good preventatives, so use after rains if any come our way.

Anytime now, chrysanthemums may be divided for specimen plants or borders. Rework the bed where they are to be planted and separate into single plants. If too tall, cut back top to 6 or 8 inches in height. For the border, plant about 8 inches apart and for large flowered plants, space 15 inches at least. Discard the old root stem, using new side branches for better plants.

The popular annual Impatiens is the perfect choice for growing in beds or containers in shaded areas. Most selections are compact and bloom almost constantly from June to October. Flower colors range from white, pink, scarlet, salmon, and orange to many shades of purple.

## **Fertilize shade** trees properly

Shade trees seldom need to be fertilized more than once every three years except in extremely sandy soils or where poor lawn maintenance is followed, says Billy Reagor, county agent with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System.

Reagor says fertilizer recommendations are usually based on trunk diameter, making no allowances for confined root zones. This can result in overfertilization, damaging some trees.

The safest method of computing fertilizer amount is to determine the number of square feet in the tree's branch spread. Then apply two pounds of actual nitrogen for every 1,000 square feet of branch spread.

For example, a 36-foot branch spread covers about 1,000 square feet. 

## Time to gear up for spring gardening

It's time to gear up for that spring vegetable garden. Straightneck, Goldneck, Dix-And two major steps are getting the right varieties and planting at the right time

Proper planting time is important if maximum quality and production are expected, points out Billy Reagor, county agent with the **Texas Agricultural Extension** Service.

Since such warm-season crops as tomatoes, peppers, corn, eggplants, beans, squash, cucumbers, okra, watermelon, sweet potatoes, pumpkins and muskmelons (cantaloupes) are sensitive to cold temperatures and will be killed by even the lightest frost, gardeners must be aware of the average date of the last frost for their particular areas.

According to the National Weather Service, the average dates of last frosts for this region of Texas is March

When paying your Federal income tax, send either a personal check or money order, but never cash, the Internal Revenue Service warned. Using a check or money order is safer from two standpoints, the IRS explained. First, a check or money order is harder to steal; second, the cancelled check or money order will serve as a record that the payment was made.

The IRS also advised taxpayers to put their social security number on the check or money order directly below the signature. That way the taxpayer will be certain to get credit for the payment should the check or money order be detached from the return. The IRS noted that no

matter what type of check is used, the tax is not considered paid until the draft is honored by the bank on which it is drawn.

Disaster number toll free

Texas farmers and ranchers who want information about the disaster recovery loan program of the U.S. Small Business Administration now have a toll-free

number they may call, says Billy Reagor, county agent with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

SBA has already assisted more than 10,000 agricultural producers in Texas, and this toll-free number will make it easier for farmers throughout Texas to receive information about the SBA program.

Farmers who have questions about being eligible or how to apply for an agricultural disaster loan may receive a brief explanation by calling, 800-692-4296, tollfree, from anywhere within Texas. If a farmer has already applied to SBA for assistance, he may leave his name, address and phone number with the receptionist

and a loan officer familiar with the application will call back at once using another line rather than tying up the toll-free number for any length of time.

The agent suggests planting warm-season crops in late spring as they will produce more high-quality produce. During the hot summer such heat-tolerant crops as southern peas, okra, eggplant, sweet potatoes, squash and small-fruited tomatoes do best.

Reagor advises planting the best adapted varieties that are available as this can mean the difference between success and failure of the garden. Current vegetable variety recommendations by the Extension Service are as follows:


