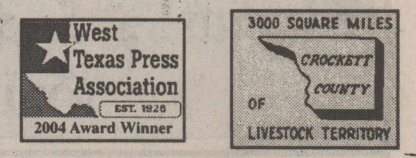

Where to build a pool?

Public meeting attendees agree on new facility, debate location

A new pool for Ozona was agreed upon during a July 21 public meeting, but where to build it caused the most discussion.

Around 45 people attended the meeting at the Crockett County Civic Center, which was called by the Crockett County Commissioner's Court due to the problems the county is having with the current pools.

Health issues such as bacteria due to poor circulation systems, the pumping of 3,400 gallons of water twice a day because of leaking pipes under the pools and gravel coming out of the filtering system prompted the decision that Ozona needs a new pool.

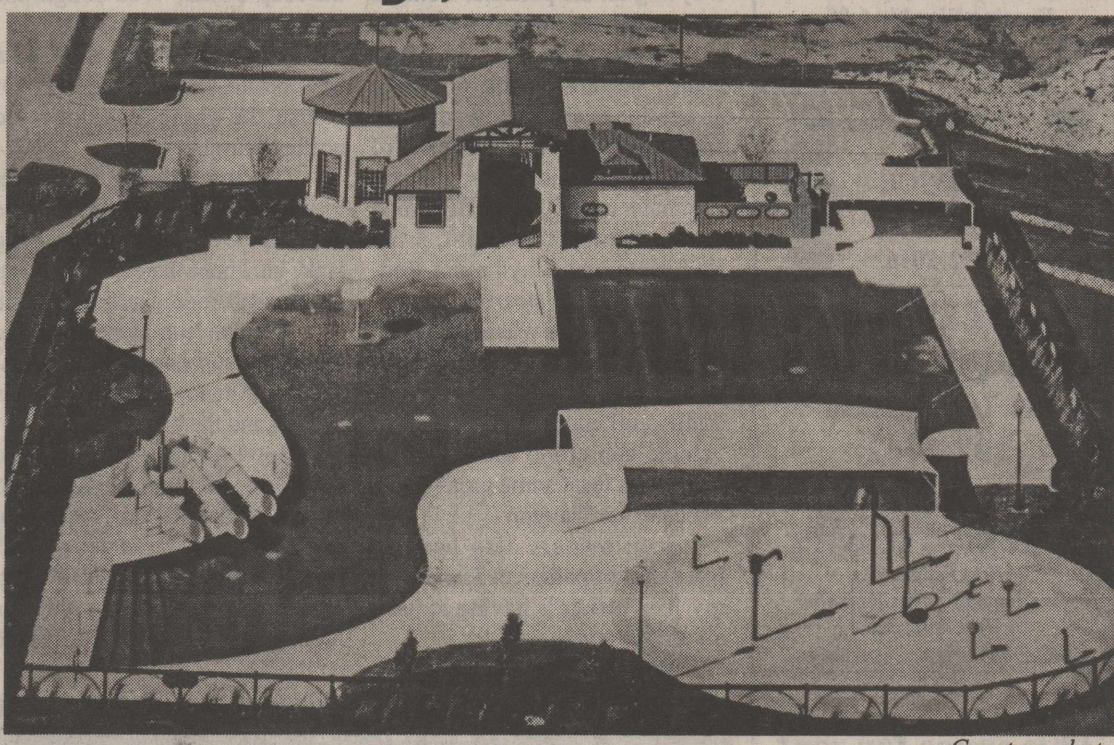
In order to restore the North and South Pools in just their existing state, the cost would be \$900,000, said Commissioner Randy Branch.

"Both pools are out of compliance with new regulations," said Elliott Barrera, who works for the road and maintenance department.

Road and Maintenance Superintendent Eddie Moore said the problems have been mounting over the past 14 months.

To build a new pool, it will take around seven to eight months, so time is critical if the community wants a pool by next summer, Moore said.

Along with the discussion, the county also presented some pictures of pool proposals. The one Moore suggested costs around \$830,000 and covers an area of around 2,500 homes.

"We're looking at the economics of it," said Commissioner Pleas Childress. "(The County) is looking at doing some of the work. Location is the biggest part of it."

One location that has been suggested is to move the softball fields across from the new Visitor Center by the rest of the baseball fields at the complex north of town.

Donella Lewis said she was concerned about the new pool being built by Interstate-10 due to safety reasons.

"It doesn't make sense to have our children by the interstate," Lewis said. "I don't feel

comfortable leaving my child at that location."

Sylvia DeHoyos said that the location would benefit both the town and the new Visitor Center by allowing people a chance to stop and rest in Ozona.

She also said that the South Pool has been in that area for years and that the pool is fenced in.

"We don't let anybody who looks suspicious in," said Anthony Vasquez, manager of the South Pool.

"We have an opportunity to sell Ozona," said Laurie Hale. "Most towns around us have upgraded their pools. When people cross the interstate and they see

this wonderful pool, they might stop and come in."

Other locations suggested were by the Crockett County Senior Center and by the Fair Park Convention Center and Rodeo Arena.

Moore said that a problem with area by the senior center is that it is prone to flooding.

Shanon Biggerstaff, Chamber of Commerce Executive Director, said that the county could look at building a recreational complex facility where the pool could be used for exercise, rehab and swimming.

By doing this, Biggerstaff said the county could apply for

grant money and use that as a reimbursement to pay for the facility.

In order to have the facility opened by next summer, applying for grant money and receiving it is unlikely meaning the pool will have to be built with county money, Moore said.

"You need to look 10, 20, 30 years down the road," Biggerstaff said.

"My main goal is that if people are willing to pay tax money for a new pool," added Commissioner Frank Tambunga.

North Pool Manager Rita Rios said that she would like to see the new pool where the softball fields are and possibly use the Thunderbird Transportation to bus children to and from the pool.

"It's not a this side or that side issue. I would like to see the incorporation of both sides coming together," she said. "Once the new pool is built we can set up new rules. We as a community need to use what is here."

"We need to be united as a community," added Stella Fierro.

County Judge Johnny Jones said the discussion was good and that the commissioners would be talking to people some more in the community.

Discussion on the new pool will also be on the agenda for the Aug. 8 commissioner's meeting. The public is welcomed to attend and comment on the issue.

"We're in the process of building our budget for next year and this is going to be a big part of it," he said. "We're all pretty well in agreement we need to do something."

The Ozona Stockman won several awards this past weekend at the West Texas Press Association 75th annual Convention in San Angelo. Ad Director Susan Calloway

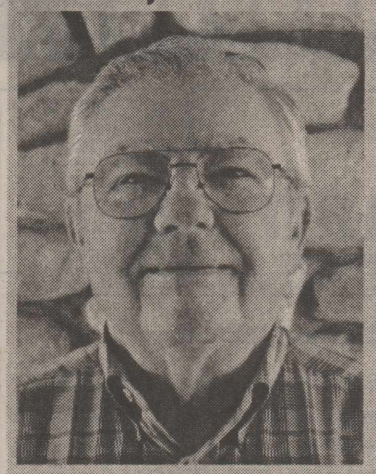
won first place in the advertising division.

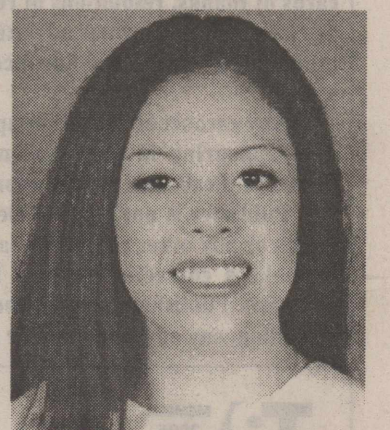

Charro coming to Ozona

"Charro," meaning "cowboy," is a prestigious title well earned in Mexico.

"Children begin their training as early as 5-6 years old," said Ruben Cruz, local host of the upcoming Texas Junior Bull Riding event coming to Ozona Aug. 13. "Next door to my home in Acuna, Mexico is the Lienzo Charro el Potrero rodeo arena. My grandpa started the arena, and as a kid, this is where my friends and I went for entertainment."

Jose Angel Barrera Jr., 14, is an all-around "Charro" and will be coming to Ozona to entertain the crowd. Jose is from Acuna and is just one of the many children who train at the Lienzo Charro el Potrero to develop his skills to compete in a Charriada (Mexican rodeo).

His abilities include a variety of rodeo activities from performing rope tricks, to riding bulls and team roping.

"Jose is learning to develop his talent to compete in the National Championship where his uncles, dad and mom (Escaramusa Charra) held winning titles," said Ruben Cruz Sr., Jose's uncle who lives in Ozona.

Jose has competed in many a Charriada in Saltillo, Monterrey, Acuna and Piedra Negras.

His skill with a rope earns him an invitation every year

from the Del Rio City Council to participate in the Cinco de Mayo as a specialty act.

"To wear the suit of a Charro is a great honor, signifying an individual's skill, talent and accomplishments. Individuals who wear this suit are also rewarded with many privileges within their community and in Mexico," Cruz said.

Ozona will be hosting the junior bull riding event on Aug. 13 with riders ranging from 4-19 years-old.

The event will be from 4-8

p.m. at the Rodeo Arena. There will be six riding classes; mutton, calf, steer, senior steer, junior bulls and senior bull riding. Kids can sign up to ride a bull.

In addition to Jose's rope trick demonstration, John Rodriguez Jr., 9, and Christopher Rodriguez, 13, will show off their dirt bike riding skills as they kick off the event by posting the colors. The two boys are cousins and both compete in motor cross racing.

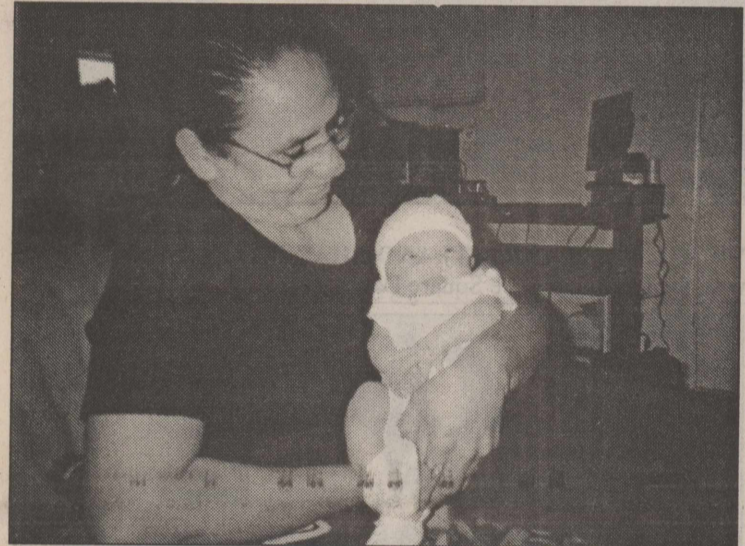

First Baptist Church to host community-wide lunch honoring the Burlesons

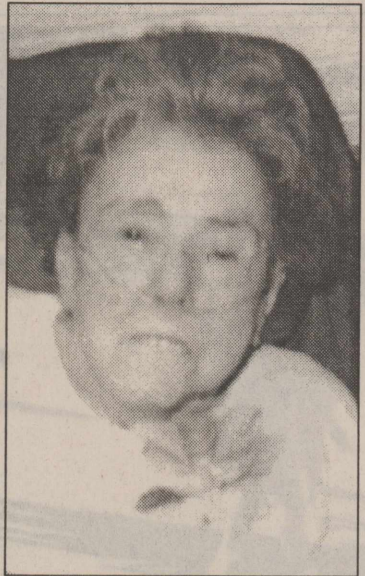
The First Baptist Church of Ozona will be hosting a going away lunch for Stan and Angie Burleson on Aug. 7.

Is the drought over?

Trees need water during those hot days and dry weather. It is very important to provide trees with the moisture they need to remain healthy. Providing one inch of water every week or every other week is good for mature trees. If homeowners are watering their lawn, their trees are probably getting enough water; however, to make sure, measure it. Place an empty tuna can on your lawn and turn on the sprinkler system. However long it takes to fill that can with one inch of water is how long you should water. Increase watering frequency with the extremely hot and dry days.

Nitrates and Prussic Acid: Dry weather increases the chance for nitrates and prussic acid in forages, especially sorghums, sudan johnson grass, etc. Though similar in some ways these two compounds have some important differences. Under drought conditions, nitrates may be highly concentrated in the water that plants take up, plants discontinue growth, and nitrates accumulate. Animals may not be able to con-

vert all the excess nitrate to protein, nitrate levels build up and animals die from lack of oxygen.

One or two good years have dropped the word "drought" from many of our vocabularies. But is the drought really over?

Most of Texas and Crockett County have been blessed with ample rains for the past 20 months. But the question remains, is the drought really over and how does the current situation rank with the 1950's drought? It's a little too early to tell. One good year or even two, does not necessarily break a drought. Records show the 1950's drought in Texas started in the southern Hill Country and San Antonio area as early as 1948, and didn't end until the fall of 1957. Even during the 1950s drought there were periods of almost normal rainfall similar to what Texans are enjoying now.

Some of our key lakes in the western half of Texas are pretty full now and in good shape. Others have recovered to varying degrees, but still are a long way from being full. We've

had a lot of rain in far West Texas, so why aren't the lakes out there running over? It seems strange their are none, until you realize all their watersheds are still in a long-term drought condition.

Progress has been made, but water-catching native grasses and forms are greatly reduced in many areas of rangeland. Aquifers and shallow groundwater areas have really suffered during recent dry years and it will take several good years of rainfall before springs will recharge and flow consistently.

Recovering from a long standing drought takes time, patience and smart management by the land manager. Ranchers should consider holding off restocking drought-damaged ranges until pastures re-vegetate with good quality forage plants. The better condition a rancher's rangelands are, the more profitable their ranching enterprises will be and the more effective their watersheds.

Drought or not, water conservation is the name of the game.

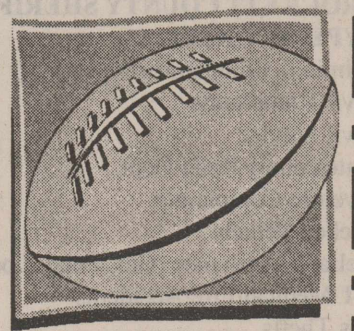

Governor tosses undercooked tax, school bills back in oven

AUSTIN — From the start of the governor's first called session that ended July 20 Capitol watchers did not assign much hope to interwoven legislation meant to overhaul the state's taxing system and devise fairer funding for Texas schools. With tax reform already snuffed in the House, Sen. John Whitmire of Houston deflated the school finance bill by running out the clock with an hour-long filibuster. Whitmire contended that no bill is better than a bad bill, and the Senate could do much better if given more time. More time indeed... Hours before the deadline, however, Gov. Rick Perry saw the bills would fail, so he shocked them back to life with his trusty defibrillator - a proclamation ordering lawmakers to stay in Austin for another called session.

Fenton elected third vice president of state association

Crockett County Sheriff Shane Fenton was elected third vice president of the Sheriffs' Association of Texas at the 127th annual Training Conference. Other officers from Crockett County that attended the conference were Captain Fred Fierro, Constable Bear Borrego and Assistant Chief Jailer Petra Hernandez. The annual four-day conference was in Houston and started on July 17. The conference included training sessions, demonstrations of latest technology and equipment available for law enforcement. The conference had more than 1,200 participants and 200 exhibits. The Sheriff's Association of Texas was founded in 1878 when the annual training conference began. Sheriff Fenton, who has been sheriff of Crockett County since 1997, has distinguished himself as a leader in the state-wide organization that provides training and legislative support for law enforcement in Texas. The Association serves as a liaison with federal, state, county and municipal agencies and associations. The Association's goal is to provide more efficient services to the citizens of Texas.

Remember, in 2003 Perry called four 30-day special sessions following the regular session of the 78th Texas Legislature to redraw congressional districts. So, a few hours after the first called session ended, lawmakers found themselves back at their desks, looking at the same stack of bills and hearing words of encouragement from House Speaker Tom Craddick and Lt. Gov. David Dewhurst, who gave a joint press conference. And despite footwork already done on school finance and property tax reform during the first called session, thorny

disagreements over teacher pay and the amount of funding that actually benefits children in the classroom haven't vanished. Final passage could take more time to resolve than the two weeks Craddick and Dewhurst hinted at in their press conference. State Rep. Frank Corte, R-San Antonio, refilled his linked bills, House Bill 12 and House Joint Resolution 11 to provide private property owners protection from losing their homes as a result of eminent domain. Pay hike more than likely Senate Bill 2, the school finance bill, zoomed through the Senate Education committee and was eligible for consideration on the Senate floor Monday, July 25. But the only item in the call that truly seems to be on the fast-track is the judicial pay increase - because legislators' pay is tied to judges' pay. If one goes up, the other goes up. This pay hike got everything but the governor's signature in the first called session after the measure passed quietly on voice votes. Of course, Texans can always call their representatives and ask them if they voted for or against their own pay raise, but without a law requiring recorded votes, proof of aye and nay votes is nonexistent.

Other Highlights First Lady Anita Perry and Secretary of State Roger Williams are traveling to Tokyo to meet with business leaders there in hopes of facilitating commerce with Japan. Texas' unemployment rate dropped four-tenths of a percent to 5.1 percent in June, making it the 10th consecutive month of job growth, the Texas Workforce Commission reported. A new law effective Sept. 1 requires children attending child-care centers and enrolled in early childhood programs to be vaccinated against invasive pneumococcal and hepatitis A diseases. Agriculture Commissioner Susan Combs said her agency will return \$2 million to the state's general revenue fund for the 2004-05 biennium. The returned money comes from integrating computer systems and cutting 20 full-time positions in 2006-07.

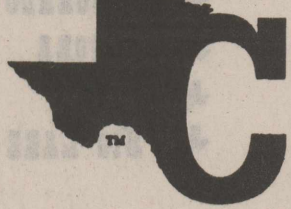

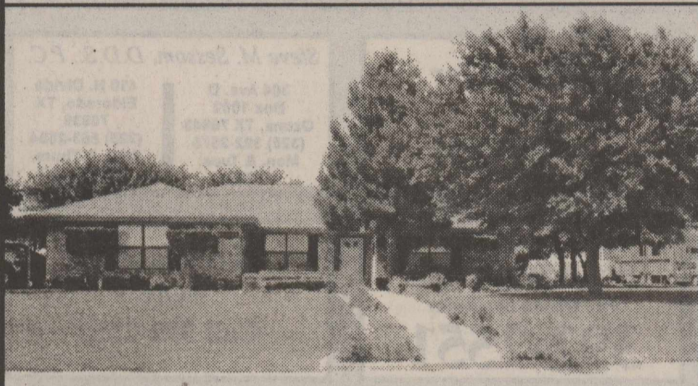

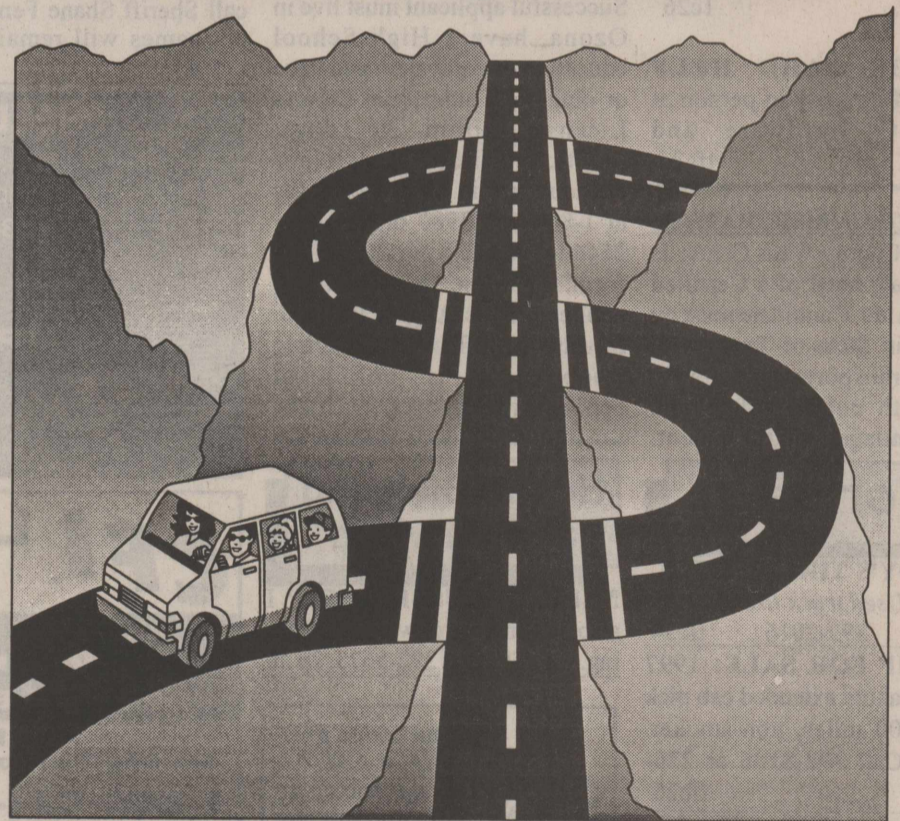
