
to pump the water for the city water A special revival campaign was system was less than was anticipated of water required for the use of the crease in the amount of power used. as the city grows, but the very substantial reduction in the rate will offset quite a considerable increase in the amount of power required. In other words, under the new rate, the City will be enabled to supply its citizens with a 25 or 30 per cent increase in the volume of water furnished without any increase in the expense to the City.

In this connection it should also be said that the Texas Utilities Company has practically rebuilt its lines in Tahoka within the past few months and is giving most excellent service. In fact, the service is all that could be desired. Largely as a result of this splendid service and partly as a result of the growth of the town, there were 124 additional connections made last year and there have been 17 additional ones thus far this year, according to W. S. Anglin, the local manager.
