Burglaries, Thefts Reported

Several burglaries and thefts kept the Tahoka Police Dept. busy this week. On Sunday, Michael DeLeon reported to police that someone had stolen two red 10-speed bicycles from his residence at South 1st and Ave. L. The bicycles had been chained to poles and the chains were reported missing also. Total value was set at \$200.

Karen McAden of Lubbock reported to police that persons unknown had slashed three tires on her 1988 GMC Jimmy while parked at 1900 Ave. K. Value of the tires was set at \$340.

Joe Young reported to police on Tuesday that someone had damaged the coin machine at the car wash located at 1917 N. 7th. Approximately \$20 worth of quarters were stolen and damage to the coin machine was estimated at \$1000.

Police officers searched for two suspects who had apparently tried to break in to the David Midkiff dentist office located at

1640 S. 1st during the early morning hours on Tuesday. Officers found that one window had been broken and one door had been jammed open, but no suspects were found as the investigation continues.

Signet Cablevision was reported burglarized on Tuesday as entry was gained through a back door. Reported damaged were two doors valued at \$50 each and reported stolen were small bills and change totaling \$20.

Lynn County officials investigated a burglary reported at the Rick Trammell residence located 6½ miles northeast of Wilson, reported by Jerry Swope of Wilson who told police he saw a man standing at the front door of the Trammell residence who suddenly ran to a green Isuzu pickup and drove off at a high rate of speed. Swope chased the vehicle but lost him in Slaton. It was later reported that the Trammell's workshop had been broken

into and reported missing was an air compressor and a welder along with several small items.

Lynn County officers arrested a Lubbock man during the past week for theft of irrigation pipe. The suspect was turned over to Lubbock County authorities facing charges of theft and carrying a prohibited weapon.

Persons jailed during the past week include one each for DWI, drag racing and fleeing, speeding and failure to appear, and one person for driving while license suspended.

Chapa, Cox In Runoff On Tuesday

Lynn County voters will have a chance to go to the Democratic and Republican primary runoff elections next Tuesday, with Democrats in County Commissioner Precinct 3 getting the chance to settle the runoff for commissioner between Bobby Cox of O'Donnell and John Chapa Jr. of Tahoka.

Voting boxes will be open Tuesday at O'Donnell, New Moore and Southwest Tahoka for the runoff, with the winner assured of getting the job, since there is no Republican candidate for the position now held by Bart Anderson of O'Donnell, who did not run.

No other Democratic voting boxes in the county will be operating, since there are no contested statewide elections requiring a runoff.

For the Republicans, there are three contested statewide races for nominations, including a race between Beau Boulter of Amarillo and Wes Gilbreath of Houston for the U.S. Senate race.

Republicans will vote at the Wharton building in Tahoka.

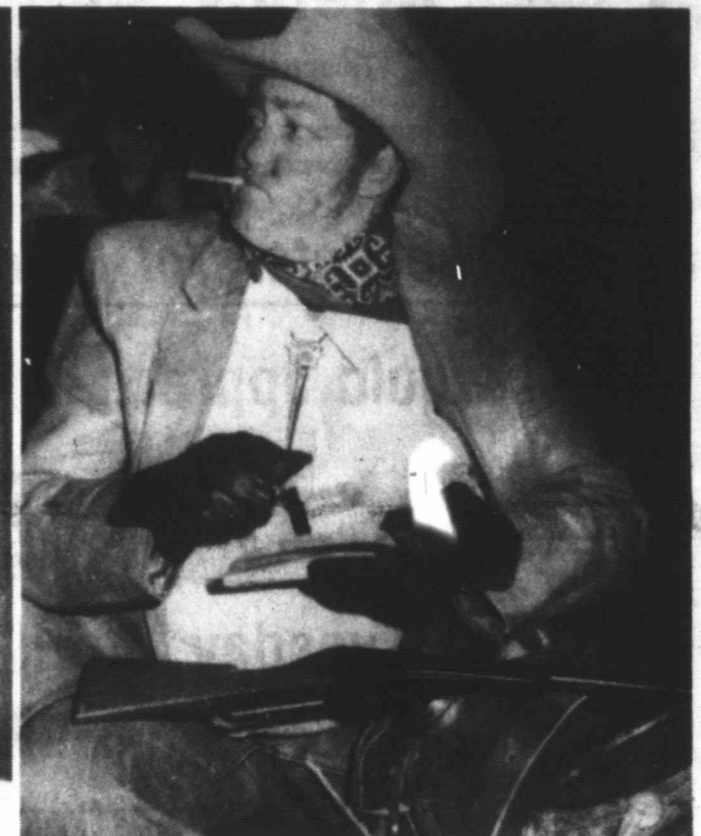
The accompanying rainfall, which was much needed, measured about an inch in most places around the City of Tahoka. The following morning hail still was on the yards and was piled up on the north side of

Fun/Food Fest Set Here May 7

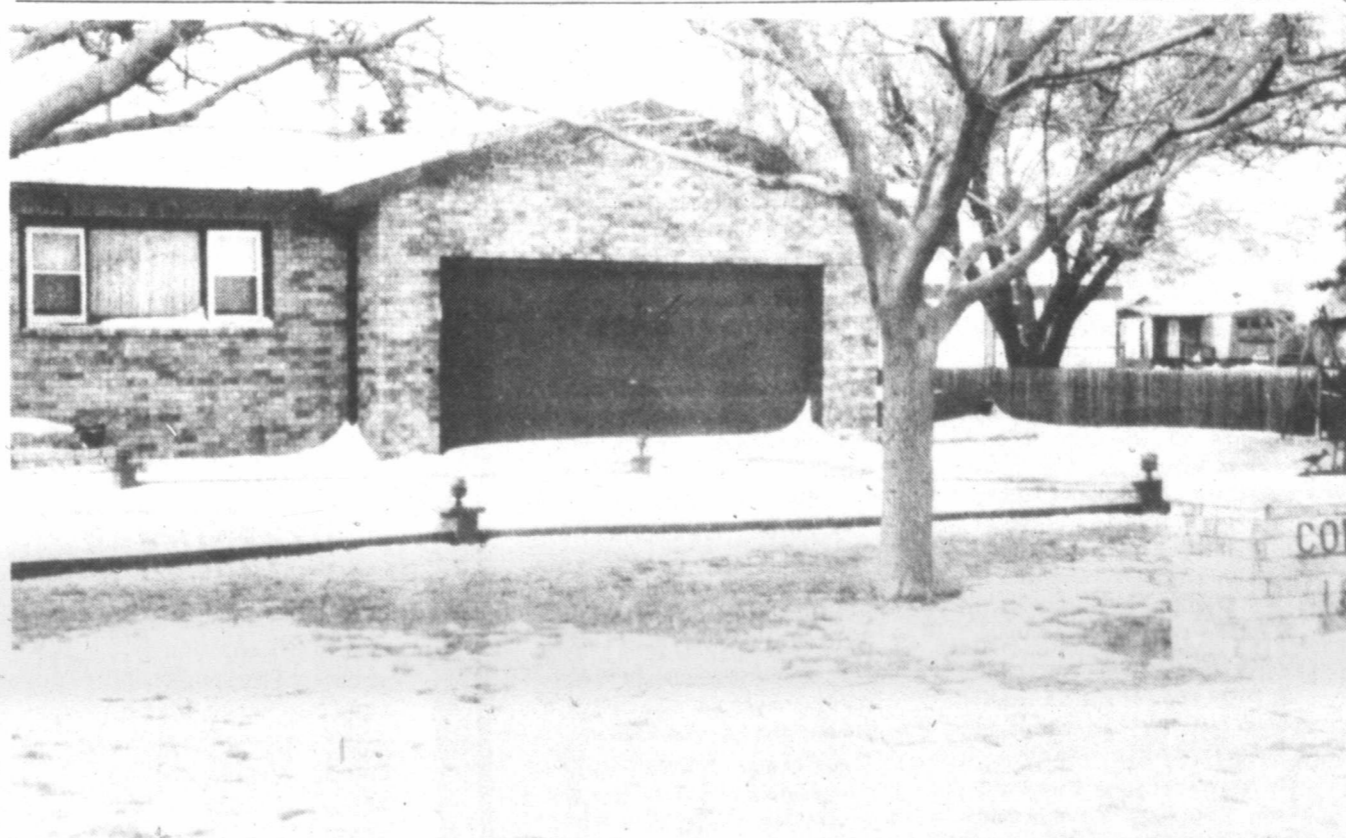

Tahoka Women Attend Child Care Providers Training

Child Care Providers in Lynn County who attended a professional conference in Lubbock last week say they have a new sense of importance for the service they provide working parents and several new ideas for making the days ahead more interesting for the children and themselves.

Linda Stephens and Janey McMillan, both of Tahoka, attended the day-long conference conducted by the District 2 Extension Home Economist of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

Existing family lifestyles and economic trends cause more than one of every three families with children under six to rely on child care outside the home, said Annis Brown, Lynn County Extension Home Economist.

In 1986, the Extension Service surveyed citizens in every county, and child care was a major concern all across the state, Miss Brown said.

Among child care providers, we found a need for new resources and ways to update themselves on such things as nutrition for children, safety, conflict management, creative play, licensing requirements, record keeping and improving their self esteem, Miss Brown noted.

The Lubbock conference, which drew more than 200 participants from a 20 county area, focused upon those needs. Instructors, in addition to the Extension agents, were from the Texas Department of Human Service, Lubbock City Health Department, Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center, South Plains Association for the Education of Young Children, and several experienced child care providers.

According to the American Cancer Society, one out of ten women in the United States will develop breast cancer sometime in her lifetime. It is currently estimated that over 37,000 women die each year as the result of breast cancer.

Ninety percent of breast cancers are diagnosed by women or their physicians finding a lump in the breast. Women who are diagnosed with a lump large enough to feel has a 50 percent five year survival rate. A woman who is diagnosed as having breast cancer by mammography, before a lump can be felt, has a 97% five year survival rate and a 90% 10-year survival rate.

A mammogram can detect a cancer this small, even before it can be felt.

Appointments can be made by calling 998-4533.

The American Cancer Society has established guidelines for mammography in asymptomatic women. (Women who have no symptoms of disease). Those guidelines have been adopted by the American Academy of Family Physicians, American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, and The American College of Radiology. Those guidelines are:

- I. 35-40 years of age - One baseline mammogram.
- II. 40-50 years of age - A mammogram every 1-2 years depending on breast type and risk factor.
- III. 50 years of age and over - An annual physical examination and annual mammogram.
- IV. Asymptomatic women under 50 years of age with significant high risk factors should be examined at appropriate intervals. These risk factors include previous breast cancer and family history of cancer.

V. A symptomatic woman should have a mammogram at any age when she experiences a mass, nipple discharge, skin changes or unexplained breast pain.

A screening mammogram is an x-ray of the breast using extremely low dosages of radiation (usually comparable to dental x-rays) and is designed to find very early cancers.

A female technologist who is highly trained in mammography will perform the examination.

The charge for the screening mammogram is \$50.00. The Unit accepts cash, check, Visa, MasterCard and American Express.

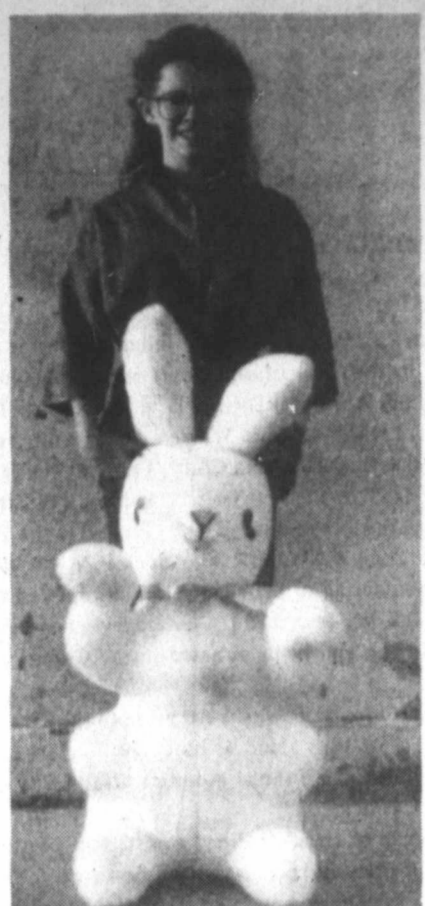

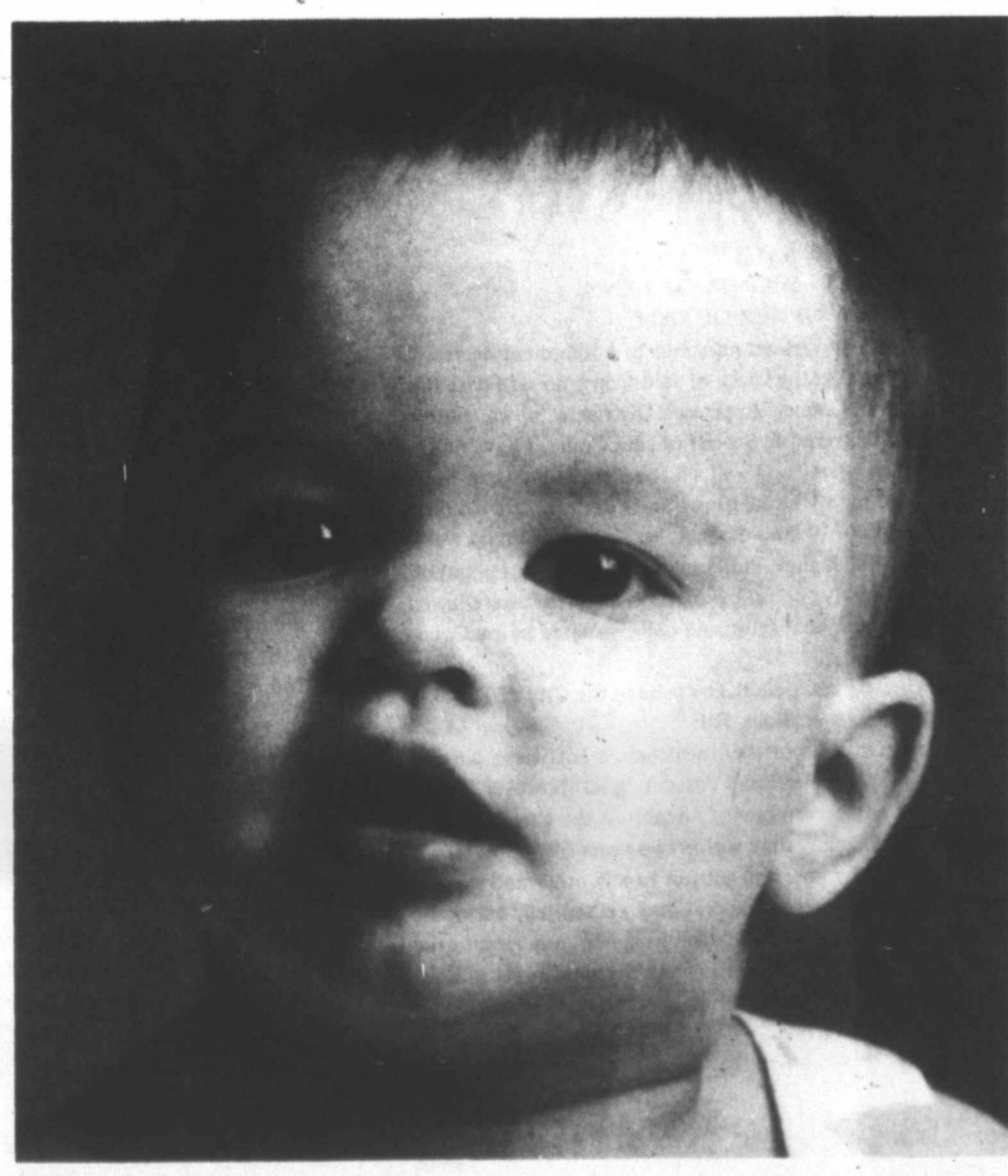

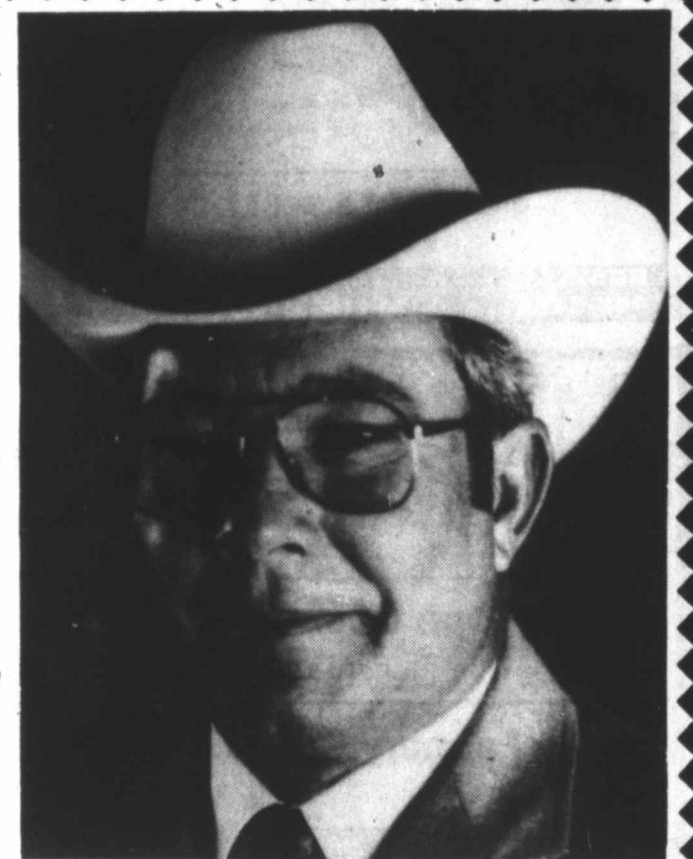
