## County Accepts Bid On New Teletype System

Lynn County commissioners in a called meeting last Thursday accepted a bid from IBM for a new teletype system to be installed in the sheriff's office. The equipment will be purchased for \$11,068 and is to be installed by May 31.

Judge J.F. Brandon explained that the current teletype system is outdated and, in fact, the company making the equipment will be out of business after June 1, with no service agreement possible. Also, he said, the current equipment would not work anyway with a statewide system which is scheduled to be changed at the end of this year.

In a regular meeting of the commissioners Monday, the group approved \$100 expenses

for hosting a meeting of county and district clerks on April 22, paid annual dues of \$50 to the Texas Good Roads Assn., and approved publication of a condensed audit report on county finances.

District Judge George Hansard appeared before the commissioners to discuss the possibility of having the juvenile officer for the county operate from the same office as the adult probation officer, in the courthouse.

Payment of attorney fees of \$604 for a firm which has been working on consolidation of justice of the peace districts in the county was approved.

All commissioners and Judge Brandon were present Monday.

## Bobby Cox Wins Commissioner Runoff Election

Bobby Cox of O'Donnell received the most votes for the post of Lynn County Commissioner Precinct 3 in the Democratic primary runoff election Tuesday. Lynn County voters gave 312 votes to Cox, while the other candidate, John Chapa Jr. of Tahoka, received 152 votes.

Cox is assured the job of Commissioner, as there were no Republican candidates for the position.

There were no state elections requiring a runoff for the Democratic party.

For the Republicans, three statewide races were on the runoff ballot. Lynn County Republicans voted unanimously for Beau Boulter over Wes Gilbreath in the race for United States Senator. Only 18 voters marked ballots in the Republican primary runoffs, and Boulter received all 18 votes in that race.

In the bid for Railroad Commissioner, Ed Emmett received 13 votes, while P.S. Ervin received 5. Nathan Hecht received 14 votes in the runoff against Donald S. Block, 4 votes, for Justice, Supreme Court, Place 2.

## WOODWORK

THERE USED to be, printed on top of the front page flag of the Lynn County News a quotation attributed to Voltaire, saying something like "I may not agree with what you say, but I will defend to the death your right to say it."

Well, I wouldn't go quite that far, so I took it off, but the basic thought is a good one. Everyone has a right to express his/her opinion on almost any topic, just so they don't insist I listen every time they want to repeat it.

The same holds true for writers, so I am going to defend poor Sara McLaughlin, a much-maligned guest columnist for the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal. And then I am going to disagree with her.

Sara lives in Ralls and teaches English at Texas Tech. I don't know her, but we have some things in common. We both write columns in newspapers, and I once taught English at Wayland College, where I learned all them Plainview area kids to talk good.

The A-J recently initiated a page called "Viewpoint" and Sara often writes a guest column for the page. Several readers have written in taking issue with something she wrote. They didn't like her point of view, they didn't like her grammar, they didn't like her social and political comments. Most of them, I suspect, don't like anything except what they write themselves.

Like most folks, I consider a good writer someone who can express my own opinions better than I can do it myself. However, I like Sara McLaughlin's way of saying things, all spiced up with quotes and clever comments.

I didn't agree with the basic premise of her column on waitresses last Friday, April 8, and I'm sure she'll get some hate letters from waitresses/waiters on that one. But I still think she is a good writer. And

even when her opinion is opposite to mine, I will defend (but not to the death; that's ridiculous) her right to write whatever she wants to.

What she said, in essence, was that she doesn't like waiters who bug you all the time with special goodies and offers to help and who are bubbling over with enthusiasm and who won't let you relax and enjoy an uninterrupted dinner.

All of us, of course, have had those kind of waitpersons, and admittedly it can be a pain when they are too helpful. But this is just one extreme, and I run into many more waiters at the other extreme; that is, the kind who makes you wonder if you have suddenly developed invisibility.

I have to say that the majority of waiters and waitresses we come into contact with in eating places around the Lubbock area do a good job of providing just the right amount of attention. But too often we get someone who takes our order, delivers it to the table and is never seen or heard from again.

No matter how high you hold up the empty breadbasket, or how much you wave your arms or grab your throat and let your tongue loll out to indicate extreme dehydration, Miss Priss just goes right by with never a glance in your direction. Waiters sometimes play a game to see who can walk by your table the most times without looking your way.

I have sat at tables watching the dry plastic tea and water glasses crack open while the folks with me stare at their meat and wish they had some more bread.

So, Sara, I like your work (most of the time) and we columnist types need all the friends we can get. But I can put up with the too-helpful waiter if I have to. It beats having no waiter at all.

## Assaults Investigated In County

Lynn County deputies arrested two O'Donnell men on Saturday after an Allsup's employee in O'Donnell reported that gunshots had been fired outside of the store at approximately 10 p.m. Upon arrival, officers found no suspects at Allsup's but later arrested two men for aggravated assault at a local residence.

Freddy Salazar and Oscar DeLafuenta, both of O'Donnell, were charged with aggravated assault and taken to Lynn County Sheriff's Office and jailed.

Persons jailed during the past week included two for aggravated assault and one each for assault, driving while license suspended, DWI felony, speeding and failure to appear and one person for issuance of bad check.

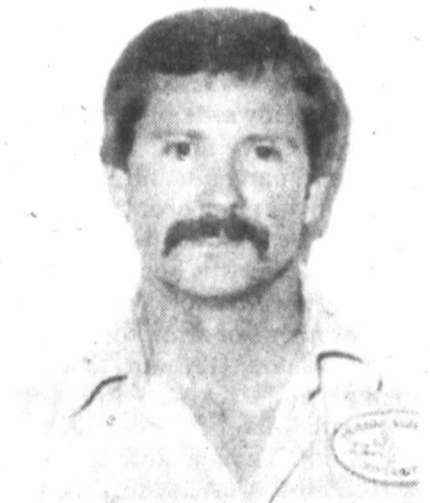
