You may not think \$104,000 is very much in the scheme of running a hospital but it has enabled us to make some significant upgrades and increased our ability to provide continued excellent care to our patients. Just a brief review of the last 4 years show

that in:
2007 - We upgraded the oxygen and suction fittings throughout the entire hospital.
2008 - With auction funds along with a matching grant, we purchased a new ambulance
2009 - We acquired new computer servers and workstations to enabled us to move toward the mandated Electronic Medical Record (EMR).
2010 - We purchased a much needed upgraded X-ray scanner which produces filmless, high resolution images in half the time of producing images on film.

As you can see LCHD has tried to use your support of the auction towards important and useful updates.
