Schildknecht.

Family Fellowship offered in Tahoka City Park Sunday

A community worship celebration will be held in the Tahoka City Park this Sunday, April 10, from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. "Food, Family, Fun, Fellowship, Music in the Name of Jesus" is the theme for the casual celebration to which all area citizens are invited. The park is located on N. 1st between Avenues J and K).

Several Tahoka churches, including Sweet Street Baptist, First Baptist, First Methodist, Pleasant Grove Baptist, and Gethsemane Baptist, are suspending their regular Sunday morning services in order to join together and invite the whole community to join them in the worship celebration.

Instead of a traditional morning worship service, the celebration will include a variety of live music by different groups, testimonies and gospel sharing, a prayer tent for one-on-one prayer opportunities, and lunch on the grounds will be provided. Volunteers will prepare and serve hamburgers and hot dogs for the free meal, and if wind conditions permit there will be a bounce-house for children. Attendees may want to bring lawn chairs or quilts for seating. Casual dress is suggested.

"Our intent of this event is to express unity in the Body of Christ and to show that while there are many congregations in town, there is one Church – of which Jesus Christ is the head!" said Billy Everett, pastor of First Methodist Church.

Sponsors say that the main purpose of this gathering is to reach out to every single person in Tahoka with the good news of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Sunday's event will be preceded on Saturday with an outreach by volunteers going door-to-door, to personally invite residents to Sunday's celebration and to offer to pray with them for any needs they may have.

Midland man goes to jail here for giving false name to police officers

A 21-year-old Midland man was jailed in Lynn County after he gave a false name during questioning in an incident on U.S. 87 in Tahoka Wednesday evening. Two Sheriff's Deputies and a Tahoka Police officer responded to a report that someone was being dragged across the road about a mile south of the US 87/Hwy 380 intersection in a fight involving a male and two females, at approximately 5 p.m.

When officers arrived, the male said that he had gotten his girlfriend's phone and was kidding when he told her he was going to throw it out the window and the two females started yelling at him, and that was when the phone accidentally fell out of his hand and they stopped to pick it up. He explained that they were just playing around and no one was fighting. When officers asked him for identification, he responded that he didn't have it with him, but wrote his name, date

of birth and age on a notepad when asked, crossing out a number when writing his age and correcting it. Officers noticed what appeared to be a wallet in the man's pants pocket and asked to see the ID in it, and the man told them that the wallet belonged to his brother. However, when officers questioned the two females as to the man's name, they both identified him as the same name that was in the wallet ID. The man's response was that he had "only been dating this girl for five months and didn't tell her his real name." Officers determined that the man had given false information by claiming to be his brother, and he was jailed on charges of failure to identify/ giving false information.

Tahoka Police responded to an accident on US 87 within the Tahoka city limits about 4:30 a.m. Tuesday, when a man traveling to Houston in a 2006 Mazda hit a dog crossing US

87 underneath the Hwy. 380 overpass. Zachary Thomas Adams, of Lubbock, told officers that four dogs were actually crossing the road, and he hit one of them, causing the airbag to deploy in his vehicle as well as significant damage to the front end of the vehicle. The dog was killed on impact, and the vehicle had to be towed.

Sheriff's Officers were investigating a report of a sexual assault of a 15-year-old female in the county on Sunday.

Lynn County Sheriff's Office communications center answered 368 calls during the month of March, including 139 for Lynn County, 138 for the City of Tahoka, 37 for Animal Control, 28 for EMS, 19 for City of O'Donnell, and 7 for Fire Depts.

Lynn County Jail held a total of 34 inmates last week, including 16 each for Lynn and Ector Counties, and 2 for Dawson.





OMETHING called "frizzled genes" keeps your hair neat, according to an Associated Press story last week. If you don't have frizzled genes, your hair can look frazzled, and it's all the fault of your parents, said the

Hair patterns, said the report, are controlled by the frizzled genes, and these are inherited, so your bad hair day could have its roots, so to speak, in your parents. If they didn't have that hair control gene, then your own hair may have a tendency to go every which way.





USDA invites applications to fund community projects

USDA Rural Development in Texas currently has over \$68 million in funding to be dispersed for community facility projects throughout Texas during the current fiscal year. Funding is authorized through the Department's Community Facilities Direct and Guaranteed Loan Program.

'We are pleased to announce available funding in the form of low interest Ioans, guaranteed Ioans, and grants used to develop or improve essential facilities and equipment in rural communities that have experienced a lack of capital during these challenging times," said Paco Valentin, Rural Development Texas State Director. "Funds to promote local and regional food systems, healthcare and education broadband protocol, renewable energy/energy efficiency, public safety and public service facilities are in much demand statewide."

USDA Rural Developments' community programs enhance the quality of life for rural Texans by providing funds to public bodies. community-based non-profit organizations and Federally-recognized Tribes for essential community facilities and services. Funds may be used for a wide range of various community projects. These include, but are not limited to, projects such as those which will enlarge, improve or construct schools, clinics, assisted living centers, publie buildings, and community centers. Funding can also be used to purchase public safety equipment such as ambulances, firefighting equipment, and other emergency required implements.

Community Programs can make and guarantee loans to develop essential community facilities in rural areas and towns of up to 20,000 in population. Loans and guarantees are available to publie entities such as municipalities, counties, and special-purpose districts, as well as to non-profit corporations and tribal governments. Community Programs can guarantee loans made and serviced by lenders such as banks, savings and loans, mortgage companies which

are part of bank holding companies, banks of the Farm Credit System, or insurance companies regulated by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners. Community Programs may guarantee up to 90% of any loss of interest or principal on the loan. Community Programs can also make direct loans to applicants who are unable to obtain commercial credit. In

some circumstances, grants may be awarded to smaller communities.

Applications are now being accepted to fund projects meeting the criteria for community facility loan, guaranteed loan, and grant programs, as outlined on http:// www.rd.usda.gov/programs-services/community-facilities-directloan-grant-program/tx.

Productivity Appraisal may lower the property taxes on your farm, ranch or timberland!

Texas law allows farmers, ranchers, wildlife managers and timber growers to pay property taxes based upon the productivity value of their land rather than on market value. This means qualified land is taxed based on its ability to produce crops, livestock or timber—not on its value on the real estate market. And it can mean substantial property tax

When is the application deadline?

If your land has never had a productivity appraisal or you are a new owner, you must apply to your local appraisal district before May 1 to take advantage of this benefit on your property taxes. You may get up to 60 extra days if you have a good reason and ask for it before May 1. If you miss this deadline, you may still be able to apply, but you will pay a penalty. Check with your appraisal district office.

Do you need to reapply annually?

If your land already receives agricultural or timber productivity appraisal, you normally don't need to reapply unless the chief appraiser requires you to do so. If a new application is required, the appraisal district will notify you by mail,
