The Tahoka Polar Express will arrive in town on Saturday, Dec. 8, to offer free rides for area citizens. Sponsored by the Tahoka Area Chamber of Commerce, the holiday event will be hosted at First Baptist Church of Tahoka's fellowship hall this year, with the train to travel through a portion of Tahoka north of the church. The train will board in the church parking lot on the west side of the church, but the fellowship

hall on the east side will be open for refreshments and fun holiday activities for children while they wait their turn to ride on the train.

Residents who live on the train route have been notified by fliers placed on their doors, asking them to have their Christmas

decorations turned on during the two-hour time period. Also, residents in the train route area are asked to not park their vehicles on the street if at all possible during this time period.

Need healthcare fast? LCHD offers Fast Track Clinic here Monday-Thursday as option to ER visits

here's a new option for healthcare at Lynn County Hospital District, which provides a lower-cost option than going to the Emergency Room (ER) for minor emergencies during the day, or for when someone cannot get in to see their primary care physician due to no appointments being available. It's called the Fast Track Clinic, and it is located in Suite C on the west end of Lynn County Hospital.

Family Nurse Practitioner Chelsea Acuna, APRN, MSN, FNP-C, a new medical staff member at the hospital, will see patients at the Fast Track Clinic. The clinic is open Monday through Thursday, from 7:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. It is not available during nighttime hours or Friday, Saturday or Sunday.

The Fast Track Clinic is similar to an ER, as there are no appointthe answer to a patient's urgent care nts necessary, simply walk-in needs when their primary care pro-

without calling ahead. However, the charges for services at the Fast Track Clinic are not billed as an ER visit, and in most casts the costs incurred by the patient will be significantly less than an ER visit. Also, if a patient's primary caregiver is unavailable for an appointment, they may come without calling ahead to the Fast Track Clinic. The clinic is

The Fast Track Clinic is appropriate for illnesses such as cold/flu symptoms, sore throats, ear aches, sinus infections, urinary tract infections, allergies, fever, mild vomiting/diarrhea, skin infections, rashes, sprains, minor cuts or other minor injuries.

The LCHD ER is still the best place to go for illnesses such as chest pains, difficulty breathing, obviously broken bones or large lacerations, or other major trauma.


New Home FFA Team does well at State Contest



Bobbye Ruth Draper Petty was born at Midway, just south of Tahoka in the farmhouse near the railroad tracks on September 29, 1936, to Howard & Ruth Vick Draper.

Not long after Bobbye enrolled at Abilene Christian College, a handsome young cowboy from San Angelo changed the course of her life and paved the way for her life's passion - the role of Christian wife, mother, grandmother and Godly servant.

Bobbye's cousin Mariana Long says, "One of my favorite stories was about a new preacher who was trying to visit all the "sick and afflicted." Every place he went, they would mention that Bobbye had just been there - usually with a loaf of fresh bread. "Is there more than one Bobbye Petty in Abilene? I cannot go anyplace where she has not already been there ahead of me!" It didn't

take long for him to know there was only one - but that she was using her ability and love for people to encourage those who needed encouraging. Bobbye was always an encourager with words, actions, food, and extra dollar or two, or just by being there!" Friend Jozell Brister says,

"A few months after my Mother's death, I was sitting in my office at ACU feeling very sad and depressed. I was still grieving for my Mother and nothing seemed to lift my spirits. Then I looked up and standing at my office door was Bobbye Petty. She came in and handed me a home-baked chocolate cream pie, my favorite. I asked her to sit down, and she did. We visited a bit, and then speaking about my Mother's struggle with cancer and her passing, Bobbye said, "I imagine that is all still pretty raw." That was just the right thing to say. It was still very raw, but Bobbye was the, only one to acknowledge that I might still be grieving. In her kind and gentle voice she let me know that she understood

what I was feeling. With the straightforward, no-nonsense way she had about her, she comforted me like no one else had been able to do. After Bobbye left my office that day, I realized that I was feeling better, actually, much better. Another time Bobbye came to my office and brought me a big bowl of watermelon. She was the friend I needed, and she lifted my spirits every time I saw her. There was a peace and calm about her that, I believe, came from God; and when she was with me, I felt her goodness and kindness. Then, for a time, the world looked and felt better."

Bobbye was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, James Alfred Petty, her brothers, Bill Draper, Bland Draper, Robert Draper and Johnny Draper, and her baby sister Margaret.




Christmas is a time of giving and helping others. What better time to help others less fortunate and in doing so clean your closets.






