Clovis Man Killed During Robbery

Ron Culbert, 23, employee of the Alsup 7-11 Grocery Store, located at 7th and Hondo in Clovis, was found dead in the back room of the building at approximately 11:45 p.m. (MST) Tuesday by officer Harry Mason who responded to the silent burglar alarm system from the business.

Culbert, apparently closing the store at the time he was shot, was hit in the chest by a blast from a shotgun and was dead when officers arrived. An autopsy was performed Wednesday morning, according to District

Attorney Morris Stagner. The sum of \$868.83 was taken in the holdup. Road blocks were set up in the surrounding area and one person was stopped near Friona with a shotgun in the car. However, the suspect was absolved of any guilt of the crime.

No arrests have been made at this time, Stagner said.

Investigation is continuing into the shooting and robbery.
