Checks must be postmarked by Friday, Jan. 31, 2020, or penalty and interest will occur.

If you turned 65 years old as of January 1, 2020, then you need to sign up for the " 65 and older" Homestead Exemption. This is a permanent exemption so if you already have signed up for it, you don't have to re-apply. ****
If you have purchased a home since you signed up for the Homestead Exemption, you need to re-apply for this exemption.

Agricultural use exemptions are available for all who have purchased agricultural property. If you purchased ag property during the past year, you need to apply for this exemption.

## Texas Weekly Fuel Update and Outlook

Texas gas prices have fallen .0 cents in the past week, averaging $\$ 2.23$ per gallon, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 13,114 stations. cents per gallon higher than cents per gallon higher than cents per gallon higher than a year ago.
According to GasBuddy price reports, the cheapest station in Texas is priced at $\$ 1.99$ while the most expensive is $\$ 3.59$ per gallon. The cheapest price in the entire country stands at $\$ 1.89$ while the most expensive is $\$ 5.74$ per gallon. The national average price of gasoline has fallen 2.0 cents per gallon in the gallon. The national average is down 0.8 cents per gallon from a month ago and stands 30.4 cents per gallon higher than a year ago. "With oil prices sagging lately, the door has been opened for a notable decline in U.S. gasoline prices, and that's exactly what has happened, with more declines likely coming ahead of us before the fun is over," said Patrick DeHaan, head of petro-

I am trying, once again, to read through the Bible in a year. One of my favorites is the i Worship Daily Devotional Bible. You read several chapters of Scripture; then you read a devotional. One day the Scriptures were Genesis 21:1-23:20. These verses relate God telling Abraham to sacrifice his beloved son Isaac. the was 100 years old for the birth of his son that God had been promising and now God wanted Abraham to sacrifice him. It is not something we would ever picture God doing. Can you put ourself in Abraham's place and try to imagine what he must have been going through?
"This scene shocks us with its blunt and sobering truth: God will have no rivals. He must possess our souls, and He will ruthlessly take us to places where He can unveil what we value most. If the great treasure of our hearts is not Himself, then God will demonstrate that He is all we need by making sure that He is all we have.
"Ironically, it is in these darkest moments-if we are at all per-ceptive--that we discover that He is what we hunger for most and that nothing else can ever truly satisfy. Then we can sing Thy royal throne.'
"What will it mean for you to make your heart God's royal throne? Take time to assess any activities or even relationships throne? Take time to assess any activities or even relationships
that may threaten to replace God as the top priority in your life. Offer these to God as an act of obedient sacrifice",
In Abraham's situation, God was ALL he had, ALL he could depend on, and sure enough, God used a ram whose horns were caught in a bush as the substitute sacrifice for Isaac. In our lives, during the good seasons, during the difficult seasons, God is ALL we have, He is ALL we can depend on. However, we won't know that unless He is our number one priority. As we pray, I hope we will pray the prayer at the conclusion of the devotional: "Make me willing, O great King of my soul, to turn my back on anything and everything that threatens to displace you from the throne of my life.

## Psalm 149-Surprising Praise

"Praise the Lord!" is the opening and closing phrase in Psalm 149, which is how most English Bible versions translate the He149, which is how most English Bible versions translate the He brew phrase "Hallelujah." There truly is so much to praise the
Lord for, and there are many ways that we are able to give God praise. This Psalm affirms the scriptural validity of praising God through songs, new songs, dancing, music, in the midst of a congregation, and through personal praise. These ideas are not new to Psalm 149, nor are they surprising to one familia with the Psalms, but what does come across as surprising is the final three verses
The first of these final three verses says "Let the high praises of God be in their throats and two-edged swords in their hands and from there the focus is on God's vengeance and judgments on His enemies. Modern sensitivities lead us to step back a is says about God's character leads to further praise Namely, God is just and is the final judge. One can praise God that the wicked will be held accountable by God for their sin, and that in the end, God will reign. ## Governor declaration

declaration
AUSTIN - Gov. Greg Abbott on Jan. 13 asked for a presidential disaster declaration for three counties that sustained widespread damage attributed to severe thunderstorm traight-line winds, hail and tornadoes. The stormy weather on Oct. 20-21 hit Camquest includes public assistance and hazard mitigation.
"The State of Texas is committed to ensuring the people of Cameron, Dallas and Erath counties have the resources they need to continue rebuilding the public infrastructure," Abbott aid. "With the help of our federal partners, hese communities can rebuild quickly and gain access to important recovery resources. I ask that the president swiftly grant this request in order to expedite valuable support to these ounties."
If Abbott's request is granted, local jurisdic tions will be eligible for federal reimburse
ment for the cost of disaster-related debris ment for the cost of disaster-related debris and property and permanent repair work to damaged or destroyed infrastructure such as roads, bridges, water treatment facilities, parks and publicly owned property.

Proclamation extended
Gov. Abbott on Jan. 14 extended the disaster proclamation he originally signed on Aug. 23, 2017, and amended several times thereafter, pertaining to 60 counties affected by Hurricane Harvey.
Texas law authorizes the use of all available esources of state government and of politica cope with the disaster

## Miller hails trade deal

When President Donald Trump signed the "Phase One" trade agreement with China on Jan. 15, Texas Agriculture Commissioner Sid Miller called it "huge, Texas-sized news."
the agreement calls for China to increase it purchase of U.S.-produced goods by $\$ 200$ bil-
lion, including the import of agricultural products by $\$ 40$ billion to $\$ 50$ billion over the next vo years.
U.S. negotiators agreed to cut tariffs in half on goods from China, from $15 \%$ down to $7.5 \%$.

Texas Attorney General Paxton on Jan. 14 joined the attorneys general of 23 states in an agreement with PayPal Charitable Fund Inc., he charitable arm of PayPal.
In the agreement, the states seek to ensure sures on where their money goes when mak-
ing charitable contributions through the company's online payment platform.
Previously, the platform aggregated and distributed funds to the donors' chosen charities without collecting fees; however, charities that
maintained a PayPal account received conmaintained a PayPal account received con-

"The agreement reached today marks recognition of the responsibilities charitable funds have to donors, and we are grateful for the new PayPal Charitable Fund provisions that will better inform all who choose to give to charity through the online platform.'
Agency set record again
During calendar year 2019 the Texas Railroad Commission processed a record 11,654 new drilling permits.
The Lone Star State's oil and gas industry regulating agency announced its staff also set a record in taking just two days on average to process standard drilling permits, one day below the Legislative requirement.
Also, according to a Jan. 13 news release, the agency processed permits at this faster-thanrequired rate for two years in a row, beginning in calendar year 2018.
"The Railroad Commission's technological solutions enable operators to quickly apply for
and receive drilling permits," said Wei Wang and receive drilling permits," said Wei Wang, executive director of the agency. Nearly perators apply for drilling permits percent of operators apply for driling permits online. This allows our staff to thoroughly and
quickly review each application to ensure operators meet all drilling permit requirements." Texas leads the nation in oil and gas production, with the Permian Basin in West Texas ranking as the nation's top energy production region. In the last 12 months Texas operators reported 1.438 billion barrels of oil produced and almost 10 trillion cubic feet of gas.
The U.S. Geological Survey estimates the Permian Basin contains 66 billion barrels of
oil, nearly 300 trillion cubic feet of natural gas oil, nearly 300 trillion cubic feet of natural gas
and 21 billion barrels of natural gas liquids in and 21 billion barrels of natural gas liquids in the Midland and Delaware Basins.
Texas will continue to be the nation's leader in energy production," Wang said. "The Rail-
road Commission's efficient, timely permit reroad Commissions efficient, timely permit re-
view processes are essential to the continued view processes are essential to the continued
development of the state's energy resources and ultimately support Texas' economic prosperity."

Biscuits were considered a delicacy up until the Civil War and were often served only on Sundays. In 1883 White Lily flour became available and homemade biscuits be gan to be served all days of the week.
Biscuits and gravy were known as a meal of the poor because it was a quick and

Ingredients
2 cups flour, lightly packed
2 teaspoons baking powder
$1 / 2$ tol teaspoon baking soda
1 teaspoon salt
1 cup buttermilk
Mix dry ingredients, then blend in shortening until shortening is in tiny pieces. Stir in buttermilk until just blended, don't overmix.

Turn out on floured waxed paper. Pat lightly into oval shape about 1 inch high. Cut with biscuit cutter and place in 12 " $\times 15$ " pan that has 2 tablespoons oil in it.

## Bacon

Bacon can be prepared in a variety of ways. You can buy it pre-cooked and just warm it in the microwave. You can also cook it in a pan and use the grease left in place of the butter for making the gravy. I like to cook the bacon in a microwave using a tray that catches the grease. I usually cook six slices at a time. I will cook them on high for two minutes, turn them over, and cook them for two more minutes. Then I cook them in 30 second increments until I get the desired crispness. I like to crunch the bacon in pieces and layer it on top of the gravy and add pepper.
