the market or special appraised value placed on your property
the unequal appraisal of your property
the inclusion of your property on the appraisal roll
exemptions that may apply to you;
the taxable status of your property;
which local governments should be taxing your property,
the ownership of property
the change of use of and receiving special appraisal;
any action taken by the appraisal district that applies to and
adversely affects you.
Informal Review: Your Appraisal District staff urges you to review the value records of your property. The Appraisal Review Board hearings are set or Jully, 2012, at the Donley County Appr.
Some protests result from errors or misconceptions which we are pleased to correct.
Review by the Appraisal Review Board: If you can't resolve your problem informally with the county
aporaisal district (CAD) staff you may have your case heard by the apraisal review bard appraisal district (CAD) staft, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board. The appraisal
review booard (ARB) is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals and other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the appraisal district to make the necessary changes to solve
problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice a protest) before the deadine probems. If you tile a written request tor an ARB hearing (called a notice a protest) before the deadline,
the ARB will set your case for a hearing. Youlll receive written notification of the time, date, and place of the hearing. If necessaray, you may request a hearing in the evening or on a a aturrday or Sunday. Prior to your
