## Seniors request increase for county ＇Meals on Wheels’

Managing Editor Bailey County＇s Commissioners Court took no action Monday on a request by representatives from the Oneita Wagnon Senior Center for additional funds to＂offset＂the cost of preparing food for the area ＂Meals on Wheels＂ program．
＂We＇re carrying part of it ourselves，＂Joe Sowder of he center＇s board said． Lavern Winn，the senior center＇s administrator，said he $\$ 4$ per meal the senior enter receives for Meals on Wheels is about $\$ 1.49$ short f paying the actual cost of the food
But while Winn said it costs $\$ 5.49$ per meal to prepare the meals for the ＂home－bound＂nutrition program，she received raised eyebrows and comments from court members when she said the meals served at the senior center cost less than \＄3 each．
＂It seems kind of high to me，＂Judge Sherri Harrison said，adding that the actual cost for the 45 ＂meals on wheels＂was higher because the county already supplied the beverages tha accompany the meals along with the paper products used to package the meals．

stubbed your toe in the was saying that the road stubbed your toe in the dark? When is the last time you looked at the prosperity of your neighbors or other family members and wondered why "they got the gold and you got the hole in the ground?"
When was the last time you faced a difficult time in your life knew this was the problem to end all problems? I'm talking about
that experience in your life that even Job couldn't have accepted.
One of my favorite regular "skits on the television show "Hee Haw" was the part where they sang about their troubles: "Gloom, dispair and agony on me. deep dark depression, excessive misery. If it weren't for bad luck, l'd have no luck at all. gloom, despair and agony on me!
Then they'd tell about somebody's lot in life. How poor Uncle Joe had broken his foot while coon hunting one night, and how bad he thought life was until he went home and went to bed only the bed old mim to do, only the bed collapsed
broke his other foot.
The truth is each of
The truth is each of us face such troubles at one time or another. As that discouragement is part of life, primarily because the lord of this world - the "god of this age" as Satan is referred to in 2 Corininthians 4:4 - is one of pain and strife.
