## **State lets** contract for local bridges

More than half a million dollars of bridge improvements will be made in the City of Clarendon following action taken by the Texas Transportation Commission last week. State officials authorized \$553,081 to construct a new bridge on Seventh Street at City Park and repair the bridge on Rosenfield Street. Gilvin-Terrill, LTD of Amarillo was awarded these projects for approaches and bridge work. "Safety is the top priority at TxDOT and the basis for planning, building, and maintaining our transportation systems," said Marty Smith, Childress District Engineer. "Keeping travelers moving safely and efficiently will continue to be an ongoing priority in Texas." The Seventh Street bridge was closed in 2008 after Texas Department of Transportation officials determined it was unsafe for travel. The pony truss bridge was built in 1908, and TxDOT says it will leave the historic bridge in place but closed to traffic, and the new bridge will be constructed adjacent to the old one on the south side. The Rosenfield bridge is a 1940 Warren truss bridge and has remained open. TxDOT says that bridge will be rebuilt and keep its original appearance. "In a state as vast as Texas, it's imperative to not only have reliable roadways connecting our rural and urban citizens, but also to be diligent in designing and maintaining them with safety in mind," said Texas Transportation Commissioner Fred Underwood.

elected president. Perry then won three full four-year terms of his own and put his indelible brand of conservatism on the state and on the Republican





Your humble editor first met Perry while he was serving editor's as Agriculture Commissioner in the 1990s, and the West Texas former Democrat



appeared harmless enough at the time. But Perry's politics seemed to harden after he became Lieutenant Governor in 1999 and then took ownership of the Governor's Mansion.

Since the time after Reconstruction, Texas has had a constitutionally weak governor with the office holding very little power other than a bully pulpit and an occasional appointment of some state official. But Perry came into office at a time when the governor's term was increased from two years to four years, and with three elections under his belt, Gov. "Good Hair" had the chance to appoint any positions that could be appointed, putting his people on every board and commission in the state and exercising greater than usual influence over the legislative process.

Throughout the last 13 years, Perry Republicans have led the state further and further to the right, which has not always been a good thing, and we can look to the state of our education system as just one example of conservatism gone too far.

Republicans have demanded accountability from and imposed "standards" on public schools and put in place testing that causes elementary students to have anxiety attacks and basically destroyed the classical education system that most of us grew up in. My mother, who spent 37 years of her life teaching, would have been miserable in the current education system, which does not demand student discipline but does demand that all students meet goals set by a group of pinheads in Austin instead of what their teachers and local authorities believe they need to know.

This last Legislature, with Perry's blessing, reduced the number of end-of-course exams. But what needs to happen is the elimination of state testing altogether and let schools get back to the business of educating. Pursuing a political and social agenda is not a good formula for educating kids. Perry Republicans have also developed austere budgets in order to cut taxes or avoid tax increases. Those are both admirable objectives; but after you cut something to the bone for two or three legislative sessions, you're pretty soon cutting into the marrow or even amputating entire limbs. This state has an obligation to educate its people. Our survival as a free republic depends on an educated citizenry, but two years ago Perry Republicans went "Jack the Ripper" on the education system and stripped \$5 billion from public schools. Some funds were restored this spring, but it still wasn't enough to keep many school districts - like Clarendon - from having to approve higher local taxes to deal with the cuts. And the public schools' woes are nothing new to the higher education system, which has been subjected to Republican assaults on funding for several years. Clarendon College along with other colleges and universities have been forced to pass the costs of education on to their students in the forms of higher fees and tuition rates. As a state, we benefit from an educated workforce that results from having affordable higher education opportunities. Unfortunately, Perry Republicans believe that the only one who benefits from your college degree is you and you should therefore be glad to mortgage your future with student loans in exchange for a diploma. Perry Republicans also have little use for culture or the arts, and the budget hawks often turn their talons to these programs. Where Gov. Bush launched the Texas Courthouse Preservation Program - which restored the Donley County Courthouse, the current crop of Republicans a few years ago discussed defunding the Texas Historical Commission.

How about Asia? Is there anything happening in Asia that affects us? Very little, except the price for gasoline, affects life here. If Arabs are fighting each other in Egypt, and there appears to be a slight chance that the Suez Canal could be closed – resulting in four percent of the oil supply to be constricted a bit, prices will increase here. How can the possible constriction of only four percent of the world's

Now, Central and South America could present some problems for us in the future. Mexico represents the biggest threat to life in this part of Texas. Illegal immigration continues to be a problem, except for our farmers and ranchers, who need good cheap labor. Agriculture still needs illegal immigrants to enhance production. Even though technological advances have allowed our farmers to produce more with less labor, illegals are still needed to maximize their return. At least, that's what a few of our locals farmers claim.

As importantly, the drug cartels of northern Mexico are rapidly becoming a threat to our security. They have already begun operations in Texas and the Southwest, and now have a physical presence in Texas. Truth be known, the

can all keep him in our prayers and hope that he heals quickly and completely.

In short, Donley County is a great place to live. Sure, we have our problems. Even so, we normally don't sort out our problems with firearms and deadly violence. Excepting the occasional fist fight, involving our young bucks, life here is peaceful and relaxed. Sheriff Blackburn and his deputies pretty much keep a lid on any nefarious behavior that could result in disharmony and discord amongst citizens.

Life here is good. We generally care for each other, and do what we can to help to those who need a helping hand every once in a while. Our children are taught to have a basic respect for other people, our town, our great state of Texas, and our country. We generally take that respect others, God, and country to the grave.

Life, right now, in Donley County is "the good old days" that people often speak of. Enjoy it and be thankful for it.

### **Promoting healthy Texas children**

Despite the current dissension in Austin, it may come as a surprise to know that our the Texas legislature has found consensus in supporting a growing number of low-income new parents and their newborns: In the recently completed regular legislative session, our elected officials unanimously agreed to expand investment in in a novel, yet common sense concept that is has garnered national and international support, but received much less public attention than some of the more contentious issues making recent Texas headlines. The concept is voluntary home visitation, a cost-effective strategy, that offers professional help to those needing extra support to be successful parents in the beginning of their children's lives. And because of this smart policy just enacted, we aren't just investing, but ensuring that we are investing wisely. We are building the accountability structure to make sure taxpayers and participating families are getting real returns from these programs.

positive outcomes of this work. Studies have found that pregnant mothers who participated in one home visiting program had 48 percent fewer lowbirth-weight babies. This is important because low-birth-weight babies have trouble eating, staying warm and fighting infections, and may develop learning disabilities. By avoiding this, the program can reduce medical and education problems, saving the families, taxpayers, and the medical system significant long-term costs. Children who participated in a home visiting program were better prepared to learn when they entered school and half as likely to repeat First Grade as children in a control group. One program's longitudinal study showed that the children of parents who received home visiting were significantly less likely to be abused and neglected. When properly administered and monitored, home visiting can save public funds by producing healthier families and children, can help children do better in school and avoid repeating grades, and will result in fewer children ending up in the costly child welfare, mental health, and juvenile corrections systems. What's more, the "magic" of these programs is that they have a two-generation impact. It isn't just that children do better; parents also learn to become more responsible for their own health, education, and self-reliance. Better parents help raise more successful children.

controversy, we need to remember areas where Texans can all agree-about caring for our children and families.

That's why 181 Texas legislators - every single member of the Senate and House, as well as our Governor - unanimously supported the original Nurse-Family Partnership home visiting legislation and funding in 2007 and renewed funding every biennium since. A bipartisan plan to expand and strengthen home visiting outcomes in Texas this past Session was again championed by the Legislative leadership and members of every stripe and ideology.

Yet, even with the new funds allotted this past session, Texas will only be reaching 10.5% of the estimated 212,000 highest-need families that currently qualify and could benefit from the program: Those are the number of Texas families with children aged 6 and under earning less than \$11,525 per year. Clearly, more funding is sorely needed. Texans should focus on areas where we agree and that need all of our collective support. We need to raise our voices louder on this bipartisan issue and request our elected officials expand voluntary programs that reach out to those new mothers, newborns and families in most need. Supporting home visiting programs - and providing new Texas babies a right start to life - is one public policy investment upon which we can all agree.

Let's hope Perry's successors will govern with an attitude of what is best for Texas and not just pursue a political ideology and social agenda at the expense of our state's future.



### Value of Drug Taken Before Heart Surgery

The results of a recent French study indicates that people diagnosed with depression who take an antidepressant two to three weeks before open heart surgery and continue to take it for six months experienced reduced pain and increased mental health. Three hundred and sixty one individuals participated in the study, suffered from the heart condition called stable angina and were scheduled for open heart surgery (coronary artery bypass graft). In this study, researchers provided the antidepressant escitalopram 10 milligrams to 182 people and a placebo to 179 people. In the analysis, it was determined that those talking escitalopram had lower pain and depression scores. Escitalo-pram may not affect pain or depression in those who were not depressed prior to surgery. Researchers associated with the study feel that those who were already taking antidepressants may have less pain and improved mental recovery following surgery.



### **Clarendon Church of Christ** WHERE ARE THE PARENTS?

We've watched a tragedy unfold in the Trayvon Martin and George Zimmerman saga. The media, I believe, made it into something it never was and that was a race story. Whatever happened that night, a jury has spoken. The evidence that I saw never proved what the media said. Still, we will never know exactly what happened and the nation shouldn't be dividing up over this incident/tragedy.

What should become part of the discussion is: "Where were the parents?" It wasn't late at the time Trayvon was out. It was after 7 p.m. He had bought some candy and a drink. We know these things but one thing not reported by many news organizations was that there was marijuana in his system. How long had this young man/kid been smoking dope? Who did he hang around to get it? I'm not saying the dope caused everything, but you can't say it didn't make any contribution. As a parent, I try my best to know who my child's friends are. My wife and I are very protective and try to make sure he is in a safe environment. Our faith and church going are all part of the rounding out of our children's character. My children make mistakes like everyone, but they don't come home high or stay in that kind of company. These 2 parents are experiencing grief that I can't fathom. I never want to know what they've went through. At some point, they are going to have to accept some responsibility in what happened. If you watched and listened, Trayvon was involved in other disturbing things in his life that may have had no bearing on what happened with Mr. Zimmerman. Yet, it makes a lot of us parents wonder, how involved were Travon's parents in his life? I would like to know if they were religious and if they shared it with their son. Pr 22:6 "Train up a child in the way he should go, And when he is old he will not depart from it." That doesn't always hold true, but often it does. Matthew 7:21 is the Golden Rule. Basically it tells us to treat others as you want to be treated. I would say that God's way is not only best but if lived, what happened that night would have never happened. I don't know how much George Zimmerman contributed to the beginning of the violence. A young person is dead and there are 2 parents who are suffering and probably wondering what they could have done differently. I hope that all of us might take this tragedy and make some use of it by watching our kids a little closer. Maybe we should look inside ourselves and ask if we are being good parents. Are our children hanging around other good kids? Are our children involved in drugs or anything else that causes harm? No matter what happened on that fateful night, there were duties that should have been performed for Trayvon by parents. Let's be good parents that we hopefully won't have to face this terrible ordeal.
