

sale of the county's 1968 crop wool support price will be flocks of sheep and goats ceived by the grower, less owned by ranch operators of marketing expense, and the mohair incentive pay will be Notification of the 1968 based on a 71.2 percent support level, Cliff Elder, ASCS office manager announced. Producers will receive \$1.06 per hundred pounds live weight on unshorn lambs sold last year.

The wool incentive pay level was but a fraction of a percentage point below last year's figure of 65.8, indicating an almost level nationwide price for wool last year with the year before. Mohair, on the other hand, showed an improved price return to the grower, the 1968 incentive figure dropping from the previous year's 86.8 percent to 71.2 for the 1968 marketing year.
