

The amount that it will be necessary to put aside each year for this purpose will be \$933, this makes a total of \$5,033 that a county will have to raise each year to take care of this bond issue. This amount will not be as much as it would be necessary to raise by high tax, 35 to 50 cents, which some counties have levied in providing the money for road construction.

Suppose the assessed property valuation is \$8,000,000, a tax of 15 cents on the \$100 would yield \$12,000 annually, which would be sufficient to pay the interest on the bonds, create a sinking fund, and leave enough, \$6,500, to keep in repair the balance of the roads in the county that are not being permanently improved.






