### Fire Destroys House Here Tuesday Night

A house under construction in the 1800 block of West Avenue G was destroyed by fire around 7 p.m. Tuesday night. Flames were visible from all over town when the house was burning. Fire Chief Earl Ladd said that by the time the fire report was turned in and the trucks and equipment arrived on the scene, the house was completely consumed by the fire.

Chief Ladd reported that the fire department worked smoothly getting the fire under control and also taking preventive measures to save the house next door to the burning house.

The house was under construction at the time of the fire. Contractor was Sy Stockard and the home was owned by T. L. Kent of the Oklahoma Lane Community. The house was declared a total loss due to the flames, Chief Ladd reported Wednesday

### Over 20,000 Bales Ginned In County

The area cotton harvest got back into full swing this week with warm sunny weather aiding local farmers.

According to a bale count, well over 20,000 bales have already been ginned in Bailey County.

At the rate the harvest is going now, it should be just about finished by the first of the year, if the weather holds out and the area doesn't receive any more moisture.

The South Plains cotton harvest passed the 500,000 bale mark during the past week, according to W.K. Palmer, in charge of the U.S.D.A. Cotton Classing Office in Lubbock.

Sample receipts at the four South Plains classing offices had reached a seasonal high of approximately 50,000 daily when the unfavorable weather conditions interrupted the harvest.

The U.S.D.A. cotton classing offices at Lubbock, Brownfield, Lamesa and Levelland classed samples from 187,000 bales the total classed this season to 564,000.

Estimates indicate that approximately one-third of this season's crop is now out of the fields.

At this date last year only 168,000 samples of the 1971 crop had been classed.

Grades were about the same as during the previous week. Strict Low Middling (41) and Low Middling (51) were the predominant grades at Lubbock, making up 21 per cent each. Strict Low Middling Light Spotted (42) made up 15 per cent and Strict Low Middling Spotted (43) made up 11 per cent.

Average staple length remained about the same. Staples continued to be predominantly 30 to 33. Twenty percent had a staple length of 30, 27 percent staple length of 31, 26 percent was 32 and 15 percent was 33.

Micronaire readings were considerably lower. Only twenty-four percent of all cotton classed at Lubbock during the week had micronaire readings in the premium range of 3.5 through 4.9, 16 percent "miked" 3.3 through 3.4, 35 percent was 3.0 through 3.2, 21 percent 2.7 through 2.9 and 4 percent was 2.6 and below.

The Agricultural Marketing Service of the U.S.D.A. reported brisk trading on the Lubbock market during the week. Prices were \$5.00 per bale higher on all qualities. Prices ranged from \$2.50 per bale over the loan for cotton with micronaire of 2.9 and cotton with micronaire of 2.9 and lower to \$35.00 per bale

### Council To Accept Bids On Park Equipment

The Muleshoe City Council met Tuesday morning, December 19, at 8:30 a.m. in the council chambers of the city hall. All councilmen were present for the meeting.

The council accepted bids for playground equipment for the new city park and also authorized accepting bids for the tennis courts that will be located at the new city park.

Street drainage and paving was also discussed with the city engineer Bill McMorris.

A rate increase from the General Telephone Company was also discussed. Councilman Lyndal Murray stated that he was not in favor of approving a rate increase until service, particularly on long distance calls, was improved.

The council decided that the General Telephone Company should be informed that the council wants a rate study performed at a cost of \$500 and should be done at the telephone company's expense.

Jeff Peeler of Southwestern Public Service Company was

present in regard to their rate increase to the city services. The council voted to go along with the fuel cost increase but not with the minimum cost and the 15 per cent rate increase. This increase will apply only to the city services.

## 1973 Feed Grain Program Announced

The United States Department of Agriculture announced its 1973 feed grain program provisions on December 11, 1972. Farmers are given the two choices as follows:

**CHOICE NUMBER ONE:** Farmer must set aside acreage of average or better land equal to 30 percent of his base allotment. First, payments will be 33 cents per bushel times the farm's projected yield on first half of base acres.

Second, a supplemental payment will be made in case the average market price to farmers plus payment on first half of base does not equal 70 per cent of grain sorghum parity as figured on October 1, 1973.

**CHOICE NUMBER TWO:** Farmer must set aside 15 per cent of his base allotment and restrict planting to his 1972 acreage or less.

First, payments will be 23 cents per bushel time projected yield on first half of base allotment.

Second, there will be no guaranteed income provision beyond the loan and payment.

### Telephone Company Extending Facilities

General Telephone Company District Manager Rad Richardson reported to the journal that the company is making general improvements on the telephone lines in Muleshoe.

The basic job is to rehabilitate and extend the facilities through out the city.

The major part of the work is now being done on the west side of town. After the first of the year the work will move back east and north toward the airport.

Richardson reported that the company is working on the cables to add to the facilities here and to keep up with the expanding city. The work is quite extensive and is being done partly to extend service to the new mobile home park and the new housing development on Eight Street.

AUSTIN--Colonel Wilson E. Speir, director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, today asked motorists and pedestrians to help prevent an estimated 87 traffic deaths in Texas through the Christmas and New Year holiday periods.

Speir said the DPS has estimated 46 traffic fatalities will occur during the Christmas period which runs from 6 p.m. Friday, December 22 to midnight Monday, December 25. The estimate of New Year deaths is 41 between 6 p.m. Friday, December 29 and midnight Monday, January 1.

## Clayton Resigns Post With Water Promotion Organization

Lubbock-- State Rep. Bill Clayton, executive director of Water, Inc., since early 1969 has resigned the post with the regional water development promotion organization effective Dec. 31. His letter of resignation was handed to members of the Water, Inc., executive committee and board of directors at a meeting in Lubbock recently.

"It is with regrets that we accept Mr. Clayton's resignation," Gaston Wells of Dumas, president of Water,

Inc., said. "He is a recognized leader, both statewide and nationally, in the field of water resource development and through his leadership, Water, Inc., has become a respected and effective influence. His efforts in our behalf have been instrumental in moving us toward our ultimate goal--adequate future water for all. Wells every success in his new pursuits."

Clayton, who resides at Springlake in Lamb county where he has extensive farming interests, has served in the Texas House of Representatives since 1962. In his letter of resignation he said that "there are other areas of endeavor he must now attempt," but declined to enumerate his future plans at this time other than to say that they are in the political realm.

During his tenure at the executive post of the regional water promotional organization, Clayton, who has been reconciled into a united effort for a water development program to assure future water for all of West Texas and Eastern New Mexico, membership in the non-profit corporation has almost doubled and the operating budget has more than doubled, Clayton predicted Water, Inc., would continue to grow as it looks to what he called "the challenge ahead."

Clayton has been a leading exponent of sensible and systematic development of water resources. He has either sponsored or co-sponsored evidence before the Texas Legislature during the 1960s and 1970s during his ten years in the House of Representatives. Among these are measures leading to a comprehensive water development program to assure adequate future water supplies for Texas citizens, and the Texas

Water Code, a massive recodification of the state's water laws into a single act. He has served on virtually all legislative water study committees during his tenure. Currently Clayton serves as chairman of the Interstate Conference on Water Problems, a national organization made up of elected and appointed water officials from the various states. He is a member of the Board of Directors of the Texas Water Conservation Association and the West Texas Advisory Committee to the Texas Water Development Board.

### City Employee Awarded Certificate

The official State Health Department's certificate of competency for ecology workers has been awarded to Arthur D. Wheat of 914 West Ave. D., Muleshoe, Texas. Wheat works for the City Of Muleshoe. As an ecology worker, he has been taught effective ways for producing safe drinking water and treatments to make wastewater into clean streams for public use.

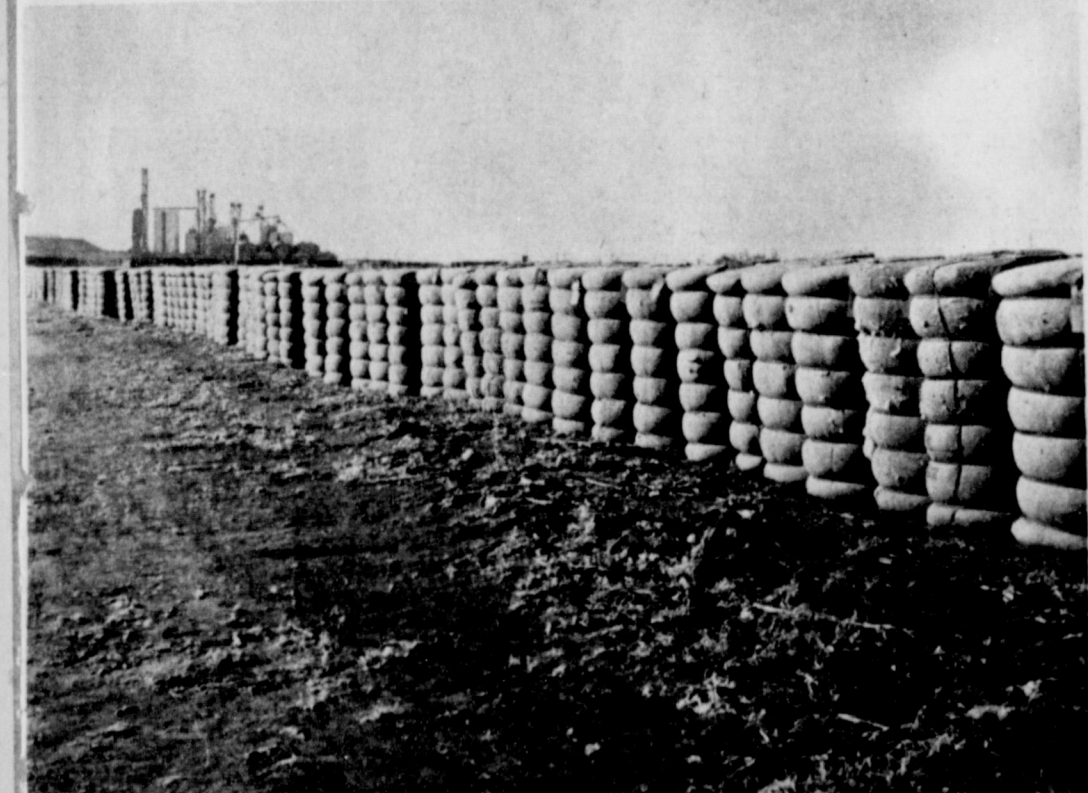
This training from the Texas Water Utilities Association, the largest water and wastewater training school in the United States, has produced clean streams and better operated water facilities than any other section of the country.

To receive the certificate, he has completed both a formal and a specialized education, accumulated a prescribed amount of actual work experience, and passed the examination given by the State Health Department.



## Nutty Days Are Here Again

COLLEGE STATION -- Pecans are a favorite holiday food -- and a popular "any-other-time" food as well.

Judy Ann Grubbs, foods and nutrition specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University, detailed some facts and preparation methods on the nutritious and versatile nut.

"They have a place in any well-planned diet. Versatility is evident since pecans can be used in main dishes, breads, cakes, cookies, desserts, salads and candies."

"Most of the shelled pecan meats available in grocery stores come from native varieties," she explained. "Generally, two and one-half pounds of native pecans in the shell will yield one full pound of meats--or about four cups--when shelled out.

"Two pounds of the improved varieties, on the other hand, will yield at least one pound shelled meats. Improved varieties are well suited for gift packages."

"However, unless canned or frozen properly, pecans can become rancid after being stored for several months," Miss Grubbs reported.

Shelled pecans can be kept in a refrigerated, covered container for up to six months. Unshelled ones can be kept fresh for about a year if stored at 32-38 degrees F.

"Pecans offer easy-to-prepare, tasty treats. Whether sa-

ltd, sugared or spiced--they are excellent for family fun or youth get-togethers," she said, outlining several ways to prepare them.

For salted pecans, first melt two tablespoons of butter, margarine or salad oil in a heavy skillet over low heat. Then add one cup shelled pecans and stir until hot.

Drain them on absorbent paper, and sprinkle lightly with salt while still warm.

To prepare sugared pecans, boil one cup sugar, one-fourth cup water and one teaspoon light corn syrup together until the long thread stage is reached. A candy thermometer will register 230-234 degrees F. at this stage.

Next, add one teaspoon of vanilla and cool until lukewarm, then beat the mixture until it becomes creamy. Add 1 1/2 cups pecan halves and stir until they are well coated. Pour the mixture onto waxed paper and separate the pecans. Store in tightly covered containers.

"Spiced pecans are a really special treat," Miss Grubbs added.

For these, boil two cups suet-tablespoons corn syrup together until it reaches the soft ball stage, or 238 degrees F.

Remove pan from fire and place in a pan of cold water until the mixture is lukewarm.

beat until mixture becomes creamy. Add one teaspoon each of allspice, cloves, and ginger, plus two teaspoons of cinnamon. Heat in a double boiler until the right consistency to coat pecans. Using a hat pin, sharp wire or toothpick, dip each pecan separately and place on a buttered tin.
