1973 Feed Grain Program Announced

The United States Department of Agriculture announced its 1973 feed grain program provisions on December 11, 1972, Farmers are given the two choices as follows:

CHOICE NUMBER ONE: Farher must set aside anacreage of average or better land equal to 30 percent of his pase allotment.

First, payments will be 33 cents per bushel times the farm's projected yield on first half of base acres.

Second, a supplemental payment payment will be made in ment will be made in case the average market price to farmers lus payment on first half of base does not equal 70 per cent of grain sorghum parity as figured on Octber 1, 1973.

CHOICE NUMBER TWO: Farmer must set aside 15 per cent of his base allotment and restrict planting to his 1972 acreage or less.

Clayton Resigns Post With Water Promotion Organization Inc., said. "He is a recogniz-

Clayton, executive director of Water, Inc., since early 1969 has resigned the post

with the regional water development promotion organization effective Dec. 31. His letter of resignation was handed to members of the Water, Inc., executive committee and board of directors at a meeting in Lubbock recently.

'It is with regrets that we accept Mr. Clayton's resignation,' Gaston Wells of of Dumas, president of Water, ed leader, both statewide and nationally, in the field of water resource development and through his leadership, Water. Inc., has become a respected and effective influence. His efforts in our behalf have been instrumental in moving us toward our ultimate goal -- adequate future water for all."Wells every sucess in his new pur-

Suns. Clayton, who resides at Springlake in Lamb county where he has extensive farming interests, has served in the Texas House of Representatives since 1962. In his letter of resignation he said that 'there are other areas of endeavor he must now attempt," but declined to enumerate his future plans at this time other than to say that they are in the political realm.

During his tenure at the executive post of the regional water promotional organization, confliction views within Water, Inc., have been reconciled into a united effort for a water development program to assure future water for all of West Texas and Eastern New Mexico, membership in the non-profit corporation has almost doubled and the operating budget has more than doubled. 

Nutty Days Are Here Again

COLLEGE STATION -- Pecans are a favorite holiday food -- and a popular "anyother-time" food as well.

Judy Ann Grubbs, foods and nutrition specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University, detailed some facts and preparation methods on the nutritious and versatile nut.

"They have a place in any well-planned diet. Versatility is evident since pecans can be used in main dishes, breads, cakes, cookies, desserts, salads and candies.'

"Most of the shelled pecan meats available in grocery stores come from native varieties," she explained. "Generally, two and one-half pounds of native pecans in the shell will yield one full pound of meats-or about four cups -- when shelled out.

"Two pounds of the improved varieties, on the other hand, will yield at least one pound shelled meats. Improved varieties are well suited for gift packages." "However, unless canned or

frozen properly, pecans can become rancid after being stored for several months," Miss Grubbs reported. Shelled pecans can be kept

in a refrigerated, covered container for up to six months. Unshelled ones can be kept fresh for about a year if stored at 38 degrees F.

"Pecans offer easy-to-prepare, tasty treats. Whether salted, sugared or spiced--they are excellent for family fun or youth get-togethers," she said, outlining several ways to prepare them.

For salted pecans, first melt two tablespoons of butter, margarine or salad oil in a heavy skillet over low heat, Then add one cup shelled pecans and stir until hot.

Drain them on absorbent paper, and sprinkle lightly with salt while still warm. To prepare sugared pecans,

boil one cup sugar, on-fourth cup water and one teaspoon light corn syrup together until the long thread stage is reached. A candy thermometer will register 230-234 degrees F. at this stage.

Next, add one teaspoon of vanilla and cool until lukewarm. then beat the mixture until it becomes creamy. Add 1 1/2 cups pecan halves and stir until they are well coated. Pour the mixture onto waxed paper and seperate the pecans. Store in tightly covered contain-
