According to S. R. Crawford, president of the Company, the new unit will mean a doubling of the present Wichita Falls, Texas. capacity of the ice plant and give it a daily output of thirty tons.

The engine is of the Frick type, and has already been purchased according to Crawford. A new structure to house the additional machinery is already under way adjoining the south section of the present plant.

It is estimated, says Crawford, that Graham will be able to supply all ordinary demands for ice in this territory. 
