

HOME BREW MAKING DECLARED ILLEGAL.

Washington, Spt. 30 .- Home brewers are hereby handed a prohibition The handicap which the Sheriff's decision with a real "kick" in it.

Intoxicants, says the Internal Revenue Bureau, can not legally be manufactured in the home. The well established "home brew," as Boast but one-half of 1 per cent alcohol or less, are illegal unless authorized by special permit.

Nonintoxicating fruit juice seems to be the only thing that can mark modern cellar activities and still be within the law.

This is the purport of a complicated home brew chart for the lawabiding issued Monday by the International Revenue Bureau.

"Nonintoxicating fruit juice can be made in the home," the bureau holds. "Intoxicating wine, home brew and distilled spirits may not be made."

"Two hundred gallons off nonintoxicating fruit juice may be manufactured tax free by the head of a family by registering with the Collector of Internal revenue." Sections of the law are quoted authorizing the manufacture in the home of "nonintoxicating cider and fruit GRAHAM LAUNDRY Juices exclusively for use" in the home, without permit.

FOOD PRICES FALL

Washington, Oct. 3 .- Retail food prices in ten cities showed a tendency to decrease during September. according to a report made today by the Labor Department. In the cities where figures were obtained September 15, anly one, Richmond, Va., had an increase over August prices and this amounted but 2 per cent.

In Chicago and Baltimore the department reported the prices as 3; per cent below those of the previous month; in Manchester, N. H., 2 per cent; New York, Butte, Bridgeport and Province, 1 per cent, while in Washington and Peoria, Ill., the drop was nearly one-half of 1 per cent. Retail food prices are still much above those of 1913, however, the bureau stated, fixing those in Washingtontoday as 6 per cent, New York 57 per cent and Chicago 55 per cent above the pre-war level.

FOR BRAZOS DENIED

Washington, Oct. 3 .- Flood protection for the Brazos river in Texas was dealt a death blow today by an unfavorable report submitted to congress by Secretary of War Weeks.

The secretary's report was merely an approval of the unfavorable reports made by Colonel H. C. Newcomer, division engineer, and by Brigadier General Lansing H. Beach, chief of engineers.

Colonel Newcomer reported that it would cost approximately \$200,000 to make only a comprehensive survey and estimate of the cost of any improvements looking to flood pro-



3. The above principle applies also to the color of ear lobes in breeds with yellow, creamy or white lobes. The many varieties of Leghorns can be divided by this indication. The Rocks, Wyandottes, and other Amerred ear lobes, hence this indication for these breeds is valueless. Experience has shown that Leghorn varieties with white ear lobes in the fall are better layers than those with stadium which has a seating capacity yellow or creamy colored ear lobes. 4. A constitutionally strong bird, one that passes through the molt quickly and easily, is a better layer

> ailments during this period. 5. Hens that show the least broodiness are better layers than those that are broody a large part of the

> 6. A bird with closely worn toenails is considered a better layer than one with long nails.

> 7. A hen that goes into the molt with worn and ragged plumage is a better layer than the bird wi'h no such marks that bespeak hard work during he preceding year.

8. A bird first off the roost in the morning and the last to return to it at night is considered a better layer than the one that spends the major portion of her time on the roost, or stands around with a "humped up" appearance in a corner of the pen or basks all day in the sun.

P. A singing and working individual is always a better layer than the quiet lazy kind.

10. Hens that go to roost with a full crop are good layers, hence the saying: "A heavy eater is a good

11. A fowl must carry a little fat in order to be in laying condition. A poor or lean hen can never be a aying hea.

12. Rather large comb and wattles for the breed is considered another characteristic of a good layer.

13. Pullets that commence laying early are considered better layers than those that mature late, hence the statement: "Keep the early laying pullets."




