COMMUNICATED To the Editors of the S. A. Herald :

AN ACT conforming the practise in territorial courts, and appeals, therefrom.

Whereas, by the organic acts establish ing several of the Territories of the Unitthereof shall have common law and chan-cery jurisdiction, and doubts have been entertpined whether said forisdiction must be exercised a perstely, or whether they may be exercised together in the same proceeding, and whether the codes and rules of practice adopted in said Territories which have authorized a mingling of said jurisdictions in the same proceeding, or a uniform course of proceeding in it all cases lagal and equitable, are repugnant to the said organic acts respectively. Therefore

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of
Representatives of the United States of American in Congress assembled. That it shall not be necessary in any of the courts of the several Territories of the United States to exercise separately the common law and chancers jurisdiction vested in said courts; and that the several codes and rules of practice adopted in said Territories respectively, in so far as they authorize a mingling of said juresolctions or a uniform course of proceeding in all cases whether legal or equitable, be confirmed; and that all proceedings hereto ore had or taken in said courts in conformity with said re spective codes and rules of practice, so far as related to the form and mode of proceed by, be, and the same are hereby, validated and confibrate. Territorial courts in cases of trial by jury shall be exercised by writ of error, and in all other cases by appeal according to such rules and regulations as to form and modes of proceeding as the said Supreme Court have prescribed or may be reafter prescribe : Provided, That on appeal, in stead of the evidence at large, a statement of the facts of the case in the nature of a special verdict, and also the roling of the court on the admission or rejection of evi-dence when excepted to, shall be made and certified by the court below, and transmitted to the Spreme Court togeth er with the transcript of the proceedings and judgment or decree; but no appellate proceedings in said Supreme Court, here-tofore taken upon any such judgment or decree, shall be juvalidated by rea-on of being instituted by writ of error or by appeel; And provided further, That the appellate court may make any order in any case heretofore appealed, which may be necessary to save the rights of the parties; and that this set shall not apply to cases new pending in the Supreme Court of the

United States where the record has already been filed. Approved, April 7, 1874.


