MCLENNAN, Freestone, Navarro, Limestone, Bell, and, probably, Brazos counties are all for Col. Roger Q. Mills for Congress from the Fourth District. He will get the nomination over Chas. Stewart, Esq., of Houston very easily. He ought to get it over Stewart. The Democracy pretends to base its preferences, other things being equal, upon the "Confederate records" of its candidates, and yet it over-looks the ex-Confederate soldiers whenever it gets a chance, just as the Republican party has also done in this State. **ED. JENKINS**, colored, is to be hanged on Monday next at 11 o'clock, A. M., in the jail yard, having been convicted of murder in the first degree for the killing of Mr. Hickman. He is very penitent, and confesses to the killing, but says he had intention to commit murder at the time. He has been faithfully visited by the white clergy of the city, and also by his colored brethren.

A day or two since, Rev. Mr. Neill, of the Presbyterian Church, Rev. Mr. Horton, of the Methodist, and others, visited him, and held divine service. They read and expounded appropriate passages of Scripture, sang hymns, and prayed with him. He was ironed to the floor of the jail, and his hands were confined by handcuffs. When the clergymen and their company had concluded singing the hymn commencing,

"Approach, my soul, the mercy-seat,  
Where Jesus answers prayer,"  
they all knelt to pray. Jenkins, deeply moved, prostrated himself, at full length, prone on the floor, and prayed aloud in great earnestness and agony of soul. The Sheriff then came in, and, at his request, Jenkins was asked as to all the requests which he wished to make, all of which were granted.

It was arranged that the clergymen should attend him at 8 o'clock on Monday morning, and administer the Holy Communion to him.

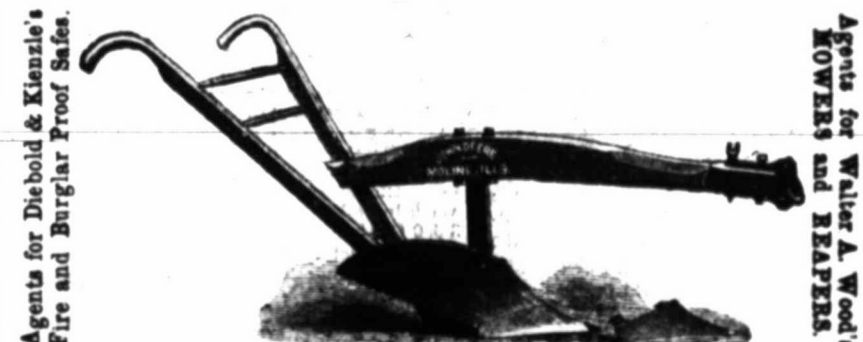
