For amount due by the United States For amount due by the United States to the District of Columbia, for one-third of the entire cost of meintaining the fire-department from January first, eighteen hundred and seventy-three, to June thirtieth, eighteen bundred and seventy-font, thirty-four thousand two hundred and nimety-one dollars and sixty cents.

For repairing the United States penitentiary building at Laramie City, Wyoming Territory, damage by fire in September, eighteen hundred and seventy-three, to be expended by the Attorney-General, two thousand nine hundred and eighteen dollars and eight cents.


