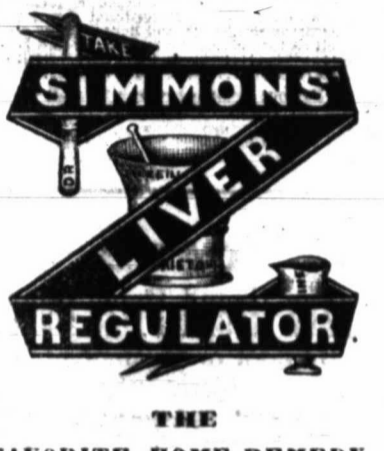

One Plank—A Live Issue.

As your Republican Congressional Convention is about to assemble, one of the important actions of that body will be the promulgation of a platform for your candidate to stand upon.

The simple election of one man to Congress is of but little consequence to the people of Western Texas, unless that man represents the voice and sentiments of our whole people upon some living vital issue.

That we have experienced year after year the futile efforts and inadequate results of all measures for our frontier protection, and on this particular subject we have become tired of the empty promises of all political conventions, and now rely upon the General Government.

That while our nation is at peace with all the world, lawlessness, crime and border ruffianism is allowed to exist in the very heart of our district, thereby depriving us of the chief aim of government, the enforcement of the laws and protection of life, liberty, and property, and the good reputation enjoyed by every law-abiding community.

That the wise provisions of our State Constitution guaranteeing a system of public free schools for the education of our children has not been carried out.

That in all efforts to protect our stock interest we have been defeated by the selfishness of other sections, in so much that the present stock law is decided unconstitutional by the courts of the State, causing us to lose all hopes of friendly legislation at the hands of a State Legislature whose majority is composed of delegates from jealous and inimical sections to our own.

State if necessary, to secure our interests, and to this end favor an enabling act by the United States Congress, permitting the people of the 6th District or such additional territory as may be deemed sufficient to form a compact State, to vote upon the question of a division of this section from the balance of a State, and indicating such further steps as needful to consummate this end.

NEW ORLEANS, Sept. 1, 1874. The Governor has called out an extra regiment of State militia, to be composed of picked white men, the orders being issued some days ago, in view of the apprehended White League disturbances and the entire absence of United States troops from the State.

NEW ORLEANS, Sept. 1, 1874. Despatches received in New Orleans by State Senator M. H. Twitchell, a brother of one of the persons killed in Coushatta, state explicitly that the only cause of the occurrence was a white league movement to run out of the State or kill all the white Republican leaders in the parish of Red River, which, by the returns of all the returning boards, went largely Republican at the last election, and thus prevent the organization of the Republican voters of that parish for the coming election.

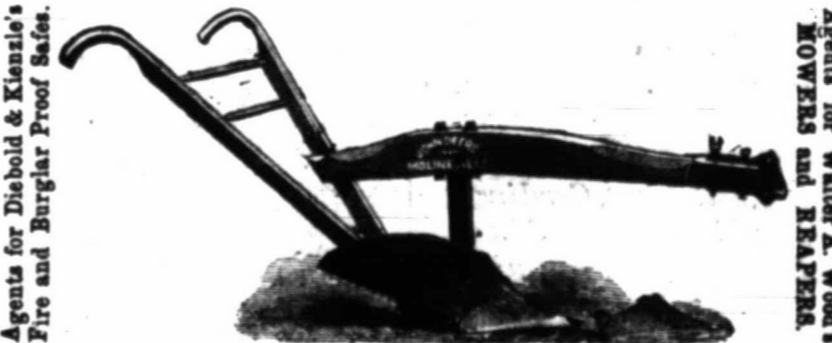
